ASSOCIATION WITHIN THE COMMONWEALTH

A NEW type of into being within the Commonwealth.



Five small islands in the West Indies—St. Kitts, Nevis and Anguilla, Antigua, Dominica, St. Lucia and Grenada—are now States in association with Britain. The new States will be set up on June 1.

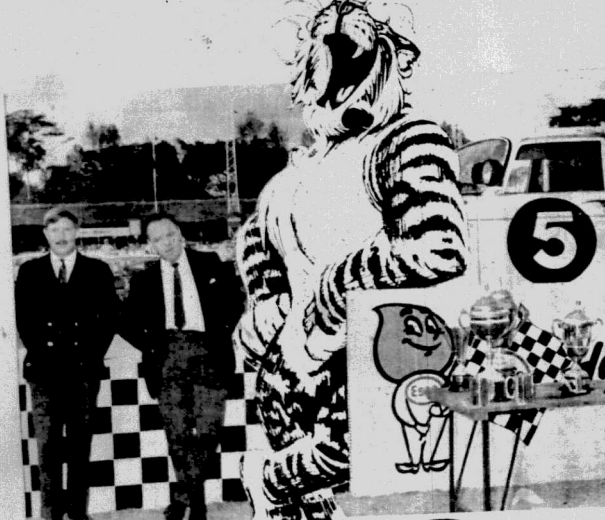

Kenya Industrial Development Corporation*.

The case arose from a loan made by the Bank of Kenya to the Kenya Industrial Development Corporation (KIDC) in May last year. M.P.s approve political fugitives Bill

The British House of Commons has passed a Bill giving the Government power to refuse for extradition Commonwealth citizens wanted for political offences in independent Commonwealth countries.

The Bill also authorizes the Government to reject an extradition request if it is considered the fugitive would be prosecuted, punished or prejudiced at his trial because of his race, religion, political opinions or political activities.

CASTAWAYS GO BACK TO ISLAND

M.P.s approve political fugitives Bill

THE British House of Commons has passed a Bill giving the Government power to refuse the extradition of Commonwealth citizens wanted for political offences in Independent Commonwealth countries.

The Bill also authorizes the Government to reject an extradition request if it considered the fugitive would be prosecuted, punished or prejudiced at his trial because of his race, nationality or political opinions.

It specifies that a person will be refused if it appears that his offence is of a political character.

The Bill replaces the Fugitive Offenders Act of 1947, which provides for the automatic surrender of a person on request of political and other fugitives within the Independent Commonwealth.

The Home Office Under-Secretary, Mr. Dick Taverne, said the Bill substantially reproduced a scheme agreed at a recent Commonwealth Ministers' conference.

He hoped Britain's special interests in the Bill would be satisfied by the fact that it would not require extradition of a person who had committed a crime in the United Kingdom.

Mr. Taverne said the Bill would also provide for the extradition of a person who had committed a crime in the United Kingdom and who was wanted for extradition in another country.

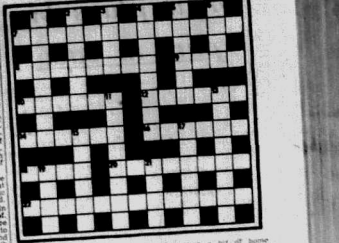

LOCALISATION PLAN DEFINED

Skilled citizens to be recorded in bureau

The Government policy on the employment of non-citizens in the private sector in Kenya was outlined by the Minister for Labour, M. K. Mutahi, in Nairobi yesterday. He said that a registration bureau would be set up to maintain a record of all citizens who had acquired a skill through overseas or overseas for posts in any one of the categories of jobs available.

LEGISLATION PROVIDING for only two classes of people living in Kenya, citizens and non-citizens, is contained in the new constitution which was promulgated some months ago by the Attorney-General.

After independence Kenya has been treated as a national entity in relation with its neighbours and some other Commonwealth members.

When the new Bill is passed, non-citizens will be required to stay on in Kenya for a period of 12 months before the Government's terms to which they will agree.

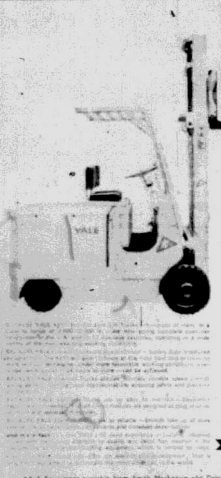
