# BLOW TO S. ARABIA PEACE - U.K.

**THE sudden withdrawal from Aden by the United Nations mission "is a grave setback to the widespread hopes that the U.N. would be able to make a constructive contribution to the achievement of peaceful independence for South Arabia," British Foreign Secretary, Mr. George Brown, has said.**

Commenting on a complaint by the mission that the British authorities failed to cooperate he said: "After making the fullest inquiries of those who were on the spot, it appears to me that our authorities in Aden did everything possible to facilitate the mission's work, despite the appalling difficulties caused by the worst floods in living memory followed by a general strike and severe outbreaks of violence and terrorism."

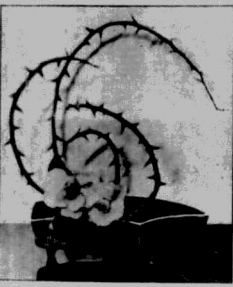

The communiqué said the settlement would ease Ghana's heavy debt payments and would be a landmark in the development of Africa. It also said that the agreement would be a step towards the resolution of the debt crisis which is plaguing Africa.

Mr. Akpan said the French Government was "very anxious to ensure that the Ghanaian Government was not faced with a situation where its debt payments would be a burden on its economy."



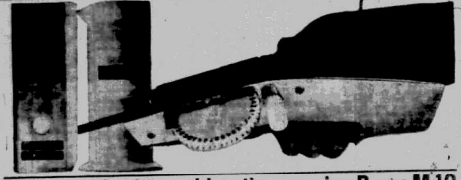

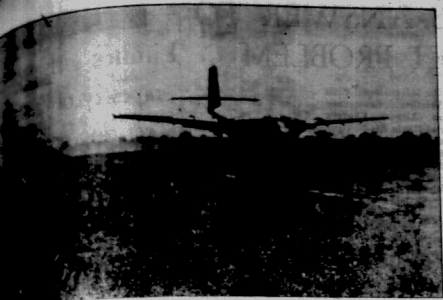

## APARTHEID RELAXED

INSTEAD OF REINFORCING the barriers of racial segregation, Mr. Vorster is making a breakthrough, however limited, in sport and political contacts at ministerial level. When the Minister of Education, Mr. Vorster, said the mould in which he would be working was not as rigid as it had seemed to indicate he would be working in, he indicated a relaxed attitude towards the so-called 'coloured' liberalists.

There has been a long way to go but this is a beginning and a brave beginning, seeing that any movement towards racial equality is bound to be met with opposition in the backward African members of his Government. The question arises whether Mr. Vorster will accept his own political failure by allowing even a colourist to be appointed to a post which can be held if it is given approval and justification through party politics.

When Sir Vorster refers to a relaxation of apartheid laws (except as far as the political contacts and functions are concerned), the inclusion of non-White representatives in South African teams received under the new laws seems to have been intended to be welcomed as a concession to the liberalists from Malawi, among other members of the trade and sports delegations from various parts of the continent.

### To protect South Africa from ostracism

Non-White sportsmen are to be permitted to play in South Africa against White tourists, they are to be allowed to participate in South African representative teams, and several national teams may be invited to play in South Africa. In short, the rule against racial segregation in sport is being relaxed, however small the break should be, in the words of the secretary of the World R.F.F.

Defining 'countries having traditional ties', Mr. Vorster named the British Isles, France, Australia, New Zealand and Argentina, but he excluded members of the West Indies, India and Pakistan, probably out of deference to the dashed feelings. The relaxation does not go nearly far enough as long as such restrictions are barred.

Who allows international sport South Africa? There are no restrictions, said Mr. Vorster, displayed an odd sort of ambiguity as a spokesman when he said 'for this there can be no restrictive regulations or discrimination'.

There are a number of countries that the relaxation is an early step in an expedition to the self preservation, in general, of South Africa from international sport. Cultural sportsmen are also allowed to represent their country. They can play against visiting teams. Otherwise, there are to be no sporting on South African sports fields. Separation of different social classes, not even at international level, is to be maintained without giving official preference.

Nonetheless, Mr. Vorster's announcement is welcome as a departure from racial inflexibility and it shows a desire to Kenya policy. The National Council of Sport should be encouraged by having the relaxation to applications from foreign individuals to compete in events where South Africa's sports resources are regarded as politically objectionable are also represented.

# Steps to delay Africanisation attacked by Kanu

### FOREIGN HELP STILL NEEDED IN KENYA

MINISTERS were accused by Kanu yesterday of continuing to delay Africanisation in Kenya and keep Africans out of key policy-making jobs.

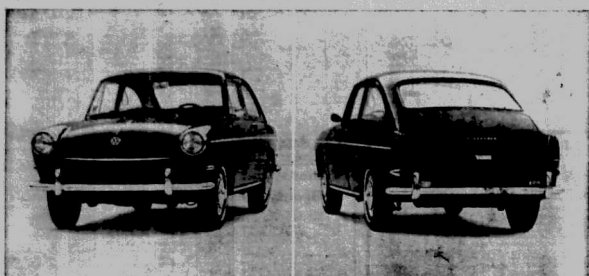

# Statement signed at gun-point' claim by accused

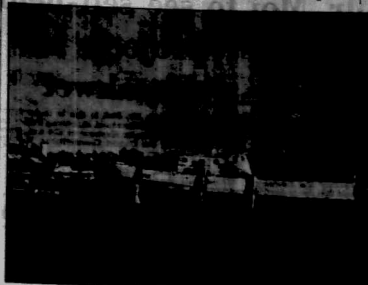
