N. TO LEAVE MIDDLE EAST Rioters chant 'English go' in Hongkong

Thant expresses 'deepest concern'

U.N. Secretary-General U Thant, announced yesterday, he expressed his "deepest concern" about the possible implications of the latest developments.

In a special report to the General Assembly U Thant said there was "no alternative course of action which could be taken by the Secretary-General without putting in question the sovereignty of the government of the United Arab Republic within the over territory."

In Cairo last night the United Arab Republic ordered the country's religious leaders to preach "Jihad" (only 11,000 fighters with guns). At the same time the U.A.R. said that all persons must stand by the subject of their Jihad. The Ministry of Religious Affairs issued instructions that all persons must stand by the subject of their Jihad in a holy battle. The preachers were told they are to preach in mosques.

Selective conscription

No decree has been issued calling for conscription, but it is widely reported that selected young men were being taken from their jobs.

Yesterday's moves caused growing concern among diplomats in Cairo. Many of whom had planned to leave earlier this week tended to stay in the city.





REDUCE BUILD-UP

Premier calls for mutual withdrawal

Prime Minister, Mr. Eshkol, yesterday called for a mutual withdrawal of troops concentrating on the border with Egypt. Speaking in Parliament, he appealed for a concerted effort to speak peace and terrorism against any member of the United Nations.

The primary cause of the tension lay in a long series of more than 100 "Syrizian"-inspired infiltrations into and assaults on Israel," he said. Israel had shown great restraint in the face of Syrian aggression, and only after all political means had been exhausted, had she been compelled in self-defence to resort to more forceful action.

In the past six weeks there had been an unbroken succession of such Syrian-instigated attacks, he said. "On the brightening and growing effectiveness of these sabotage activities, I found it necessary to address clear and explicit warnings to Syria that we were not prepared to put up with their continuation."

Iraq troops for Egypt

Mr. Eshkol said that long before the Egyptian withdrawal movement began, the United Nations had informed Egypt that the reports of Israeli forces poised for an attack were unfounded.

The fact that nevertheless Egypt had increased its troop strength in Sinai from 25,000 to 80,000 in a few days has convinced Israel, he said.

13 DIE AS FIRE SWEEPS SHOPS IN BRUSSELS

At least 13 people were found dead in a large store in Brussels' main shopping centre yesterday afternoon. Another 10 people were injured, some seriously. The fire started in a shop selling electrical goods and spread to the shops on either side. It was caused by a short circuit in a lamp.

14 KILLED AS MINE EXPLODES

Fourteen people died and 20 were injured when a mine exploded in a village near the border between Israel and Jordan. The explosion occurred while a group of Israeli soldiers was working on a road. The cause of the explosion is still under investigation.

Soviet Sun shots taken 12 miles up

Soviet satellites have taken 12 miles up in the atmosphere. The shots were taken from a high-altitude balloon. The results of the experiment are still being analyzed.

Corsair wins race against liner

A British Corsair jet fighter won a race against a liner. The Corsair was faster than the liner, despite its smaller size. The race was held over a distance of 100 miles.

Dar customs seize \$20,800 from ship

Standard Staff Reporter Dar es Salaam. CUSTOMERS officials seized more than \$20,800 in East African currency which was brought ashore from the Italian ship, Bianna, when it docked at Dar es Salaam from Mogadishu in the weekend.

The money, in Tanzania, Kenya, and East African Currency Board notes, was found in two false-bottomed suitcases which were unloaded with the baggage of disembarking passengers in the Customs jetty in City Drive.

The Bianna, a 1,100-ton Italian cargo vessel which was chartered to 10 passengers, had called at Mombasa on its way to Tanzania from Italy. It arrived in Mombasa on Monday, and was due to leave again for Italy on Tuesday.

A Customs preventive officer, Mr. Byrono, found the suitcases when he noticed that a suitcase which was supposed to be empty was not so.

With another officer, Mr. Peter King, Mr. Byrono made a thorough search and a false bottom was discovered. This was covered by the rest of the suitcase when it was opened.

The two officers then returned to the Customs jetty in City Drive, where they found the money hidden in a suitcase which had been brought on board the ship.

The money, which was in the form of banknotes and coins, was valued at \$20,800. It was the property of a private citizen who was returning from Italy.

The money was returned to the owner, who was identified as a resident of Italy. The incident has raised questions about the security of the shipping industry.

WORLD MOVES TO END GROWING CRISIS

Security Council in emergency session

Security Council went into hastily called session last night in New York to discuss the Middle East crisis. International moves to start a peace process. France called for a meeting of the "Big Four" and declared their policies towards Israel and the U.A.R.

Britain and the United States took their toughest stand yet towards Egypt, condemning President Nasser's plan to seal off the Gulf of Aquila to Israeli ships. No immediate comment was made on reports from Cairo that the U.A.R. had mined stretches of the Gulf's approaches.

Britain and the United States urged the world take action — either in or out of the United Nations — to keep the Gulf open to all nations.

Reliable sources in Cairo said the U.S. message did not rule out the possibility of force if all other means were exhausted.

The Security Council began almost 90 minutes late because many delegates were busy in private talks on how the world body could deal with the problem and reinforce U.N. Staff's mission to Chari Proceedings began on an inconclusive note with a correct objection to the hasty meeting.

FRANCE WANTS BIG FOUR TO INTERVENE

France, in a high-level meeting of the world body, urged the Soviet Union, the United States, Britain and France to intervene in the Middle East crisis. The French ambassador, Jean de Laubert, said that the "Big Four" should take the lead in resolving the crisis.

Mr. Hewitt's jacket was torn the night when the two envoys were in Peking they still have the stains of the glue.

Mr. Hewitt had been staying in the hotel. When the two envoys did not consider going to the airport he was ordered back to Peking by the Chinese Government, which announced three days ago it was closing the British office in Shanghai.





ACCUSED REFUSED TALKS WITH RELATIVES

President KENYATTA has ordered that all uprooting of coffee in African areas will stop immediately. The Minister for Finance, Mr. Mwangi Kiambu, said today that the Government would be discussing the coffee in detail with the representatives and coffee growers from the district on Wednesday.

Mr. Kiambu, who is also acting Minister for Agriculture, told the rally that the Government would draw the coffee export tax when the price would drop the coffee to a low. The tax currently costs growers £20 a ton.

It is expected that this year about 300,000 bags of coffee will remain after the export market has been opened. Three weeks ago Mr. Kiambu described the chances of increasing the export quota as 'nil'.

Resolving the Government's ban on coffee planting, he said that instructions had been given to coffee co-operators to ensure that no coffee would be allowed to allow for the two per cent terminal yield on coffee loss inilling permitted under the ban.

He emphasized that the only people who would be allowed to plant coffee in the country was those who had been granted the necessary permission of the Government.





EGYPTIAN GUNS OPEN FIRE

Russia will fight says Col. Nasser

Artillery and machine guns opened fire on Israeli farmhouses today near the border of the Golan Strip in one of the most violent incidents of the current Middle East crisis, an Israeli Army spokesman said.

The Egyptians also fired on a military patrol car in the border area. One soldier was injured. The Israelis returned the fire. It was the first incident of its kind for almost ten years on the Israeli-Egyptian border, where the United Nations Peace Force stood guard until it was withdrawn 10 days ago at the U.A.R.'s request.

According to President Nasser, Egypt has said yesterday he had received a message to this effect from the Soviet Premier, Mr. Khrushchev.

It also pledged to aid the Soviet Union should it not allow any country to interfere, and return the situation to what it was before 1956.

Oil pipelines warning

In Damascus, Syria's Prime Minister, Dr. Yousef Zoheir, warned that the Arab world will follow up oil pipelines and ignite oil wells if Western countries help Israel to any military conflict with the Arab world.

They will stop the flow of petroleum to Israel. The Arab masses will watch the attitude of other Governments from the first shot in the battle in order to know up the pipelines and ignite the wells.

COUP PLOT - THREE TO DIE

A military tribunal in Cairo today sentenced three men to death for plotting a coup d'etat in Egypt.

The men were Saad Eddin Wahbi, a former minister of defence, and two other officers. They were accused of plotting to overthrow the Government and install a military dictatorship.


