The Hague conference was expected to hear of proposals already taken by Indonesia to stabilize her economy where inflation has fallen from 20 per cent in February to less than one per cent in April.

At the same time, aid for the first quarter of this year, at between \$450,000 to \$480,000, are already being sent in 1961.

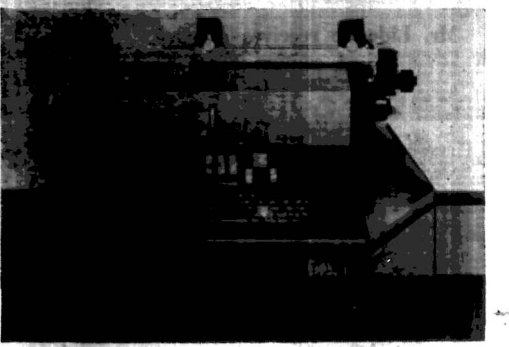

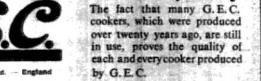

# O.A.U. TO HEAR KEENY

## President extends shifta amnesty

Small leaders from the six shifta-affected States of Kenya will attend the next conference of the Organisation for African Unity to protest at interference in their area by the Republic of Somalia. In emphasis to O.A.U. leaders that they and their people want to remain an integral part of Kenya.

The request that the six districts of the North-Eastern and Eastern Provinces should be allowed to send representatives to join the Kenyan delegation at the next O.A.U. conference was made by 76 Somali leaders who visited President Kenyatta at State House yesterday.

The President agreed to the request, and also said the Somali elders that the shifta amnesty which he granted for 30 days from June 1 will be extended for another 15 days.

Mr. Kenyatta said the leaders to send a representative from each of the six districts to accompany the Kenyan delegation to the O.A.U. conference. ### ON QUARTER DRAFT

**CONSENT TO EXEMPTIONS**  
 The Navy Department has announced today that it will grant exemptions from military service to certain types of civilian workers in the transportation and communication industries.

The exemptions apply to the following classes of workers:

- 1. **Employees of common carriers.** This includes employees of airlines, railroads, and other common carriers.
- 2. **Employees of public utility companies.** This includes employees of electric, gas, and telephone companies.
- 3. **Employees of communication companies.** This includes employees of telegraph and telephone companies.

The exemptions apply to men who are currently in the civilian workforce and who are engaged in one of the above-mentioned activities. They do not apply to men who have already been drafted or who are currently in the military service.

The Navy Department's decision is based on the fact that these workers are essential to the national defense effort. Their services are necessary to the operation of the transportation and communication systems, which are vital to the movement of troops and supplies.

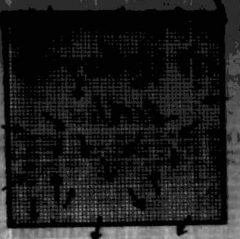

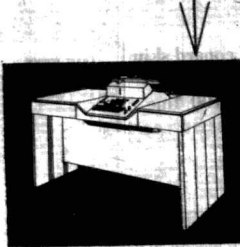

# Mr. MOY WRAPS CHINA

## Attack 'gross breach of protocol'

CHINA'S Embassy in Nairobi has indignantly rebuked in gross interference in Kenya's internal affairs by making a bitter attack on a Kenya Minister, the Kenya Vice-President, Mr. M. Moi yesterday.

Mr. Moi said that the Chinese criticism of the Kenya Minister for Economic Planning and Development, Mr. Mboya, was in fact an attack on the Kenyan Government. It violated an agreed principle of international relations.

The Chinese attack on Mr. Mboya, reported yesterday's issue, criticized a speech made by the Minister before the National Assembly. Mr. Mboya discussed the economic situation of Kenya and a leading article in yesterday's East African Standard turned the Chinese statement a breach of diplomatic protocol.

Mr. M. Moi yesterday made a statement saying that the Chinese attack could not pass without comment because Mr. Mboya was speaking in Parliament on behalf of the Government and it must therefore be clear to anyone that in this respect he was explaining the Government's official view.

### 'Tantamount to a challenge'

He said: "The challenge to his speech on that day which is also a challenge to my speech in Parliament, is being met as a challenge to the Government."

"Our policy of non-alignment is well known and has been explained several times in my speech and in Government statements. The President himself has repeatedly said that Kenya is not a member of the East-West bloc and also addressed a warning to diplomatic relations across the board."

The memorial was proposed by the Kenya National Assembly and was supported by the British Government.

The Ministry of State said that the memorial was not in the interests of the British Commonwealth and that it would be rejected.

### Pope opens way to married clergy

MARRIED men may minister in the Roman Catholic Church, according to regulations laid yesterday by the Holy See.
