Algeria asked to send him to Congo to fight flames again along Suez Canal

THE Congo Kinshasa Government has asked Algeria for the extradition of former Congolese Premier, Mr. Moise Tshombe, who is now in custody near Algiers after being hijacked in the British-owned executive jet aircraft in which he was flying from the island of Ibiza to his favourite weekend retreat on Mallorca.

The Congolese decision was announced by the Political Committee which had been sitting continuously since the previous night to discuss the issue.

The former Premier's extradition has been sought through the Egyptian Embassy, which has representative Algeria's interests in the Congo since relations between Algeria and the Congo were suspended late in 1961 when Mr. Tshombe was Premier. The Algerian Ambassador to the Congo (Brazzaville) was expected in Kinshasa to discuss the matter.

The official Congolese Radio is reporting the announcement of Mr. Tshombe's kidnapping at ten-minute intervals as the Congo (Kinshasa) continues to celebrate the seventh anniversary of its independence.

The Congolese Prosecutor-General, Mr. Abery, said the death sentence passed in absentia on Mr. Tshombe in Minsk for high treason would still be announced at the time that there would be an appeal and only President Mobutu could reprieve Mr. Tshombe.

## KE IS SAYS MINISTER National wage stoppage threat by union

STRIKERS threatening to disrupt Kenya's food industries yesterday warned that their action was illegal. As the stoppage by members of the Kenya Union of Commercial, Food and Allied Workers entered its second day the Minister for Labour, Dr. Kiwako, declared threatened sympathy strikes illegal.

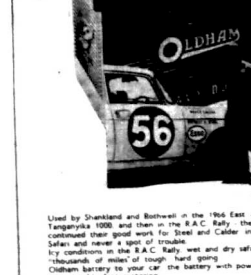

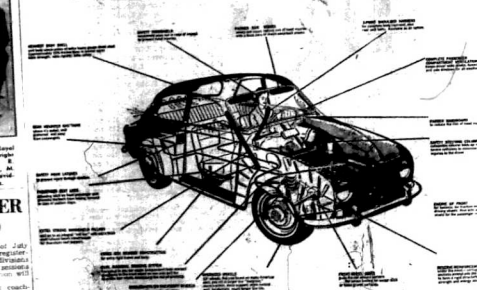


