



And boundary changes baffle prophets
WHEN 34,000,000 British voters go to the polling stations for
Britain's general election on February 23, it will be the first
time in nearly 80 years that all will have the right to vote more than
one vote.

Plural voting has ended
in Britain, and the most prominent
feature of the British Parliament's

NEW HEADQUARTERS FOR KISUMU POLICE

"*Stakewell*" Commissioners
THE new Police Station and offices were officially opened on
Tuesday January 16th by Mr. K. K. O'Connor, who was succeeded by the Provincial Commissioner (Mr. K. L. Hunter), the Commissioner of Police (Mr. S. L. Vining) and the police Superintendent of Police, Nairobi Province
(Mr. Scammon).

In his speech the Attorney-General said a brief history of past Police Station was given. The first station was built in 1890 and since then had been rebuilt twice. It was closed in 1906 and since then the present Police Station has been used. The new building was opened in 1911 and was enlarged during the forty-six years of its existence.

In 1916, Capt. Anderson, then Commissioner of Police, recommended that a new Police Station be built in Kisumu. 

THE Overseas Food Corporation have leased four acres of land on St. Anne's Island in the Seychelles for a fishery. A deep-water jetty will be built there, and a number of large fishing vessels will fish the big southern banks.

It is expected that the first catch will be made next winter and start fishing in earnest.

The first vessel arrived last week at Mahe, and it was converted for fishing for salmon. It is registered at Mauritius.

The vessel has been fitted with a large refrigeration plant capable of freezing 100 tons of fish daily. Arrangements have been made with the Commandant of the Royal Military High Command, East Africa, and the Royal Engineers and Madagascars will also be supplied.

On arrival at St. Anne's the Siverland will take on stores and equipment from the ship and then transport them on board. This means that the first catch will be delayed by about a month.

At present the Siverland is engaged on 25 Seychellois fishermen on a two-month contract.


