

STRIKE MAY CLOSE LONDON FACTORIES Permanent damage to trade feared

EIGHTH PORT AFFECTED: 341 SHIPS DELAYED

A WARNING that many London firms would have to close down if the dock strike in Britain continues has been given by the London Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. A. V. Leigh, secretary of the London Chamber of Commerce, who gave the warning, stated that permanent damage was likely to be done to Britain's export trade and said that the authorities in Colombo were making a serious study of the situation.

A Ministry of Labour spokesman said that the estimated value of goods held by the strike was now £120,000,000 and 2,100 ships.

The number of vessels affected has risen to a peak of 341—21 more than during the weekend—and an eighth port, Manchester, has been brought into the strike.

Some 150 factories have served notice that they are trying to spread the strike to Scotland and Mr. Jack Barrell, secretary of the union leading the strike—the National Amalgamated Stevedores and Dockers—has gone to Glasgow to try to recruit support there.

Some dockers were refusing to work yesterday but the general situation in the strike showed no change.

Some 200 permanent dockers returned to work in London today, yesterday's reporting being the first since 1946.

There are 14,000 permanent dockers in London, about 10,000 in Liverpool and other ports, and 42,000 in all.

In addition, 4,000 dockers report to be working in London in a reserve, and 10,000 in other ports.

WOOL SALES CANCELLED

The Committee of London Wool Brokers has announced that the strike has forced the cancellation of the October wool sales.

The wool sales of London will take the next series of London wool sales on November 2nd and would have been held on October 27th.

The Ministry spokesman said that the value of imports held by the wool brokers is £70,000,000 and £100,000,000 in other ports.

PROGRESS MADE TALKS TO END STRIKE Union officials see Labour Minister GLASGOW REJECTS CALL TO JOIN DISPUTE

After a meeting at the Ministry of Labour in London yesterday on the dock strike it was announced that some progress had been made towards a settlement.



The session is expected to last until February.

Representatives from 22 member-countries will be joined by observers from 23 non-member-countries, including Dr. Benji Mataru of the Kenya Chamber of Commerce in London.



SELF-SUFFICIENCY FOOD

PLAN IN DANGER

Differences in East African policies on price levels

DIFFERENCES between Kenya and Tanganyika and Uganda, in seeking a uniform policy of self-sufficiency in major foodstuffs, were indicated by the Minister for Agriculture, Maj. F. W. Cavendish-Bontle, at a meeting in Nairobi on October 27.

The plan is in danger, because, at present, the Government of Uganda and Tanganyika consider it better to allow food prices to find their own levels rather than, as Kenya is doing, control costs on the basis of a guaranteed price for the farmer. This has been actually determined by the fact that world prices are now, for the first time since the outbreak of war, below the guaranteed price of self-sufficiency crops—wheat, maize, sorghum, and cotton.

But it was members of the other two, that is, Kenya and Uganda, who, back into the Government, were to have had a role in the formation of policy.

It was announced in Dar es Salaam that, in implementation of the Tanganyika Government's declared policy to encourage the production of staple foodstuffs to the level of territorial self-sufficiency, it had been decided to continue the basic producer price for maize and paddy until 1965.

These prices are 28/-/300 for maize and 60/- per 100 for paddy.

Tanganyika has announced that its minimum returns system will be in effect at the end of the year.

Large market

The Kenya Government has accepted the principle of guaranteed prices and control of the main food crops, produce which form an important part of the Agriculture Bill.

STEADY PROGRESS MADE AGAINST MAU MAU

THE Colonial Secretary, Mr. Lennox-Boyd, told the House of Commons, in his first full-length speech after returning from East Africa, that "steady progress" was being made against the Mau Mau terrorists in Kenya.

The Minister, who had previously faced a barrage of questions (reported below) said gangs could no longer hold their own. "The mounting cooperation with the Government shown in the Reserve and the increased strength and efficiency of the Reserve and the increased security forces, is beginning to tell," he continued.

As this cooperation gathered momentum the Mau Mau would become more vulnerable and less determined to fight. He would not attempt to forecast the end of the Mau Mau singularly brutal murders of a few days before had shown.


