WAY IN SUEZ CANAL Two British vessels to take part DEADLOCK BROKEN

WORK began yesterday on clearing the blocked Suez Canal. The United Nations officials in charge of the operation, Lt-Gen. Wheeler, said the Egyptian Government had agreed that the U.N. salvage fleet should start clearance work immediately at Suez.

Gen. Wheeler said he had signed contracts for two British, one French and four German salvage ships to begin work. Other salvage vessels from Denmark, Holland, Norway and Sweden are expected to arrive at Port Said on January 11.

Use of 'diplomatic influence'

Gen. Wheeler did not say what to be done with the rest of the British salvage vessels at Port Said. Their crews have not been ashore since the Anglo-French withdrawal was completed last Saturday. They are being supplied with food by United Nations launches, pending an announcement on their use in the clearance operation.

Meanwhile, a U.S. State Department official said yesterday that British willingness to use only six of its 12 salvage ships and to put them under the flag of the United Nations brought a new end to the deadlock which had held up agreement on clearance work.

Snowdrifts block most British roads

SIX-FOOT snowdrifts blocked most of the roads in Britain yesterday and motorists returning to work after the Christmas holidays were in difficulties. The heavy snowfall brought some of the worst travelling conditions for 20 years.

There were heavy drifits in Scotland - where ten passengers were stranded for 11 hours in a bus in the Mull of Galloway and North-West, England. Power supplies were cut off in some places, and trains were up to two hours late owing to frozen tracks.

FOUR DIE ON BEN NEVIS

RESCUE PARTS FOUND the bodies of four men who were stranded in a blizzard on Christmas Day near the top of Ben Nevis, Britain's highest mountain.

The bodies were found about 10,000 feet up the mountain. The men were found in a huddle, and their clothing was frozen. The rescue party was unable to reach them until the snow had melted.





U.S. behind Britain in peaceful use of atom

EMPHASIS ON AIR AND SEA

ALTHOUGH United States scientists made spectacular progress in unlocking the secrets of the atom in 1936, they admit that they are well behind Britain in adapting atomic power to peaceful purposes. Britain is well in the lead in the international race to build improved reactors to produce electrical power or promote new experiments.

She manufactured a simple type of reactor in 1935 and fed electricity into the grid from Calder that a year later, on October 17. But the first commercial atomic power station, being built by the Commonwealth and private investors in Pennsylvania, will not go into production until the end of this year.

In pure science, however, American scientists announced positive detection of the neutron, one of the components of the atom whose existence had been deduced but never proved, and last week scientists announced a laboratory method of fusing hydrogen atoms. Both in the scientific world, though, there is a strong feeling of impatience to see the atom put to work.

Bake a cake with Britain's new soap

A London firm will soon be marketing a soap which can be eaten without ill effects. It is made from sugar. It will also have other qualities unusual in soap—it will not sting if rubbed into raw skin and it will take cakes which have developed fat content.

A spokesman for the firm which is extending the firm's soap-making business, said: "I am a perfect realist, and I am sure that it will be a blessing to local authorities who have been seriously worried about the stench caused by detergents in sewers, something even in water supply."

This detergent breaks up into sugar and fatty acids and readily responds to sewage treatment.

Nuclear aircraft

The most enthusiastic research in the U.S. has been in the field of transport—the world's first nuclear-powered jet has passed marine tests. It is a small, four-engine aircraft in its present form, but it is expected that one scientific estimate that an atomic plane will be ready by the end of this year. There has also been great progress in planning for nuclear-powered warships and a reactor.

Last May Russia announced that her engineers had designed a 5,000 h.p. atomic locomotive able to run for a year without refueling.

The treaty under which 72 years of British military and naval bases in the Canal Zone was ended, permitted the maintenance by British civilians of military stores and installations and also allowed Britain to recover the area in the event of an attack by a Power outside the region on any Arab State or on Turkey.

'Null and void' since October

Col. Nasser, in announcing the abrogation of the treaty, said the action was taken because Britain, in invading the Canal Zone, had "acted as though it did not exist." As a result Egypt considered the treaty a null and void since 6 p.m. on October 31, 1956, when all French air forces first bombed Egypt. The abrogation would involve serious reprisals for the entire Viceroy Baghdad Defence Pact system. The capacity of Britain to support the two foundation members of the pact, Turkey and Iraq, against outside attack is directly affected if Britain accepts the Egyptian demand that her troops can be unconditionally returned to the Canal Zone base.

The spokesman pointed out that the chief objective of the treaty was to secure the evacuation of Egyptian troops from the Canal Zone. Strictly speaking, they say, the abrogation would permit the return of the troops to the Canal Zone. 
