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

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard":

Mr. Keith Dowd, in his letter dated May 12, 1958, states that Governmental Powers Office has been asked to register all citizens of Kenya. This would mean that every citizen would have to be registered under the heading "Government" in their birth certificate.

At first, this strikes one as a wise move. But the unpopular piece of legislation, which has been introduced at another point, picks the intelligence of every citizen off the top of their heads.

We are told that "registering" identifies an individual. Therefore, if I am registered, I am identified as an individual. This being accepted, we Europeans are registered individuals. We are given names by the Police. We are in the "existing population", who we are.

Up to now, only Africans have had to have their fingerprints, name and the same piece of paper given to them. The registration document, passport and so on are placed there but what of it? Is it not true that when we go to the post office, bank or any other institution, an African can claim that he is not registered? If this is the case, why should we give him this?

I am no longer for European, who, for reasons we usually only understand, are not registered. Of course, it is to save us some trouble. It is to prevent us from getting into trouble (abusing) photographic cameras, telephones, typewriters, etc. (I am not sure about the last). Even statements like "Fathers hold all the authority" fall into this category.

Let us all of us understand that our elected leaders are not perfect. Let us all of us be aware of our responsibilities. Let us all of us be yet unswayed from the same old ways.
