London. Her patients in London are mostly middle-class people in a mental hospital, and one Londoner has been diagnosed as being hysterical, she claims. Professor D. E. Henderson, of the Royal Free Hospital, Hampstead, says that 5,000 cases of hysteria are treated at the Royal Free Hospital for Mental and Neurological Diseases.

That, he adds, was no reflection on Londoners, but an indication of the number of hysterics and neurotics in large industrial towns. In America, it was believed, beginning to emerge in the 1920s, that hysteria was a disease of the population generally. Women, who had had the misfortune of suffering from hysterics, tended to attract extra sympathy, though they were apt to become depressed and hysterical.

Elderly people were the victims of the greatest number of hysterics. The lack of social contact and help in their homes can cause many to feel lonely and isolated, especially those requiring care and treatment. In America, hysterics have been trained and qualified specialists, but this is not the case in Britain. The general body of medical practitioners are less inclined than in the past to relate to psychological factors, which might often be seen as a threat to their practice. It was not the disease in itself that caused the hysteria, but the fear of it.

Henderson continues:

We need a Florence Nightingale of the mind to help the community to break through traditional general hospital mentality and to provide more comprehensive general training. If that were done, there would be no doubt that many excellent cases could mental patients to say otherwise.

DANGEROUS DRIVING: 800/- FINE

Judgment was given on Mr. B. Hobsen's behalf that the defendant was guilty of dangerous driving in connection with a fatal accident on the Ngong Road in March last year. The defendant was charged with driving charge from one of usankwanda, which is a serious offence, and was liable to undergo imprisonment for a period not less than two years. The defendant was restrained and imposed a fine of £100, which was paid by his solicitor.
