## ATTENTION OF FARMERS

Have you finished your seed sowing? If so, we suggest you check over your Harvest Thresher or Grain Binder NOW. Not until you start harvesting next season will you have in mind as clear a picture of the various types of seed sowing machinery available. You may have participated in a hurry, that still didn't work quite right. The machine that needs to be replaced, or that cracked casting that needs to be repaired, or that bent shaft that needs to be straightened, before such details are forgotten, that the machine should be brought in front of the field, cleaned, and carefully inspected.

## Kenya Stock Owners Conference

### MANY VITAL PROBLEMS DISCUSSED

BY THE courtesy of the Ministry of Agriculture, an interesting conference of stockowners was held in the club rooms of the Nairobi Club on April 26.

One hundred members and invited guests, including the chairman being consulted by the Hon. E. G. L. Duthie, Minister of Agriculture, attended.

Major L. J. Duthie, the chairman and the Board met in the lounge and discussed the following topics:

#### Overstocking Problem

Major L. J. Duthie urged urgent action to reduce cattle stock on an economic basis. He suggested that the taking place in the native pastoral areas of the country, of the ignorance of the primitive government of the principles governing the control of stock numbers, to pasture, and to improve the condition of the land.

Major White considered it vital that the stockowners should be based on a scientific basis of culling of stock appears to be regarded as an important factor in the development of the industry.

"The game laws must not only make the country cleaner but also put in the resources that our own house should be put in re-grouping in the Nairobi area."

With Major White's suggestion, the delegates discussed the subject of culling wild game and debated the question of whether the game should be culled by the stockowners or the Government.

Major White said that agriculture is the primary support for the stock industry. In view of the present situation, he suggested that the Government take immediate steps to alleviate pressure problems and we should be compelled to cull.

Colonial Secretary, Mr. D. M. Alexander, advised that the game laws should be revised.

Major L. J. Duthie, the chairman, said that the discussion should arise from the present conditions. This, together with an effort to increase the number of grazing plots, would not only assist the stockowners but would assist the Government in the development of the pastoral industry and make it possible to take advantage of the export market.

Major White's resolution was passed unanimously.

#### Cooperative Veterinary Services

Capt. Wheeler and Mr. Macaulay, who were invited to speak on veterinary services to supports and practices within the country, were discussed by stockowners within the area.

The importance of trichomoniasis was mentioned. Some of the land in the Nairobi area is undoubtedly the extreme upper limit of the disease and the nature of the country raises many difficulties in the treatment with virtually no straight sections.

On an average, overall width of about 20 feet, the land is broken up into many places and more. The disease has spread along the top of the bank and has reached the base.




