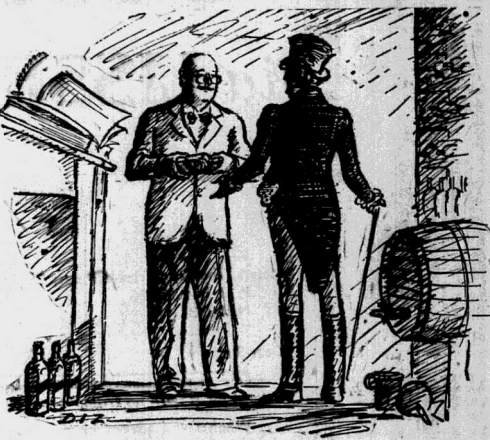

In the Wake of Deflation

The article by Major E. S. Grogan on "Colonial Credit" was given considerable prominence in a recent issue of "The Times." This article is reprinted in full below.

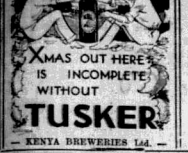

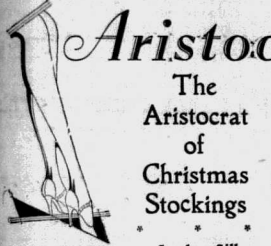

Trade and Business Licences

(Continued from page 4.)

"That in view of the necessities of a detailed consideration of the proposed Trade and Professional Licensing Bill, that public meeting of the business community of Nairobi called under the auspices of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce, and a Committee of five members of whom are two members of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce. The Committee as appointed shall confer with the two Executives of Members of Nairobi and subsequently apply to make recommendations on behalf of the business community to the Select Committee on the Bill."

Mr. Hamilton said that although as the Chairman had stated, the Committee's terms of reference had concerned the income tax proposal being laid on the necessity for maintaining or increasing the revenue it was perfectly obvious from the Bill that what was intended was increased taxation on the commercial community. For the majority it would mean that they would pay double what they were paying now. Mr. Hamilton pointed out that the Bill would mean that the so-called Alternative Taxes and that he had had his share of abuse for his part in putting forward what had been described as an unjust and unscientific measure. The present Bill might be considered scientific; it was certainly unjustly harsh in its bearing on the commercial community. Dealing with details of the Bill, Mr. Hamilton pointed out that the Bill would mean that a great many business men would be liable upon to pay three times as much as they were now paying on a concerned with more than one branch of trade. That was what was in a very country where most people would not afford to be specialists.

Totally Unaired

The alternative taxation proposals had been put forward at a meeting which had secured approval of the Bill. Mr. Hamilton pointed out that the Bill under discussion, however, did nothing of the kind; it simply provided for the extension of rates of taxation from the commercial community. After quoting many examples to show that the burden on all sections of the trading community had been increased and in some cases very greatly increased. Mr. Hamilton said the Bill as now drafted might have worked quite well in a large country but it was totally unairied to Kenya conditions.

Small Shopkeepers

Mr. D. H. Puri seconded the motion by referring to a statement which had been made of small shopkeepers who under the new Bill would have to pay a licence fee of nearly two and a half times what they paid now. When the public meeting of the business community on the Committee they had said that it quite clear that the representative was not to agree to anything of any further burden on the commercial community as a whole. Actually, however, Government had intended to increase their £10,000 from the business community. In nearly every case it was proposed to double the licence fee and in some cases to charge three times as much as was required. The position was that the Government had not offered to-day to pay more taxation. (Hear, Hear)

Mr. G. Tyson said

Mr. G. Tyson said when the Chamber appointed the Alternative Taxation Committee that Committee had received proposals which had been made by the Chamber. The figure was revised later and at the end of the year it was found that the Chamber had only produced £20,000. Surely they would be prepared to face the facts; the money must be found and he suggested that they know of any other way of making it, they should put it forward. In the meantime it might be possible to keep the alternative taxes and the Bill as amended and he thought they would be wise to do so. Captain Robinson asked if it had been agreed that the Trade Licensing Ordinance should be permanent. Mr. Hamilton said the 1923 Ordinance was to be regarded as an emergency provision and put forward at short notice to help a pressing financial situation.

A Completely New Ordinance

Mr. T. A. Wood, speaking personally and not on behalf of the Committee to revise the Licensing Ordinance said he went to the Committee definitely opposed to any form of increased taxation, but the Committee found that what they were in fact called upon to do was not to revise the old Ordinance but to frame a completely new one. When they were assured that the existing Ordinance was entirely unworkable and that it must be redrafted because exceedingly difficult to make licence under the old schedule to anything within the limits of the Bill. He entirely agreed that it might be possible to make regulations with a view to amending the existing Ordinance and the Committee more closely the existing draft licence and he thought the Committee were suggested in the motion before the meeting might be a very good way in introducing and amending the schedule.

Mr. D. Newmark considered

Mr. J. M. Cavendish-Bentick

Mr. J. M. Cavendish-Bentick (Member for Nairobi North) said he had a number of the Committee appointed to revise the Licensing Ordinance, but owing to various circumstances he had not been able to attend many of its meetings. Although he believed that the Committee would make use of the fact of an increase in the present licence fee generally he thought the proposed increase was unjustified. Major Cavendish-Bentick said he was only for Mr. Wood to say that the Mr. Wood had made his position absolutely clear and had said that the Committee had no definite mandate from the Chamber to increase an increase in taxation and that he could only agree to anything which would mean a more equitable method of collection. (Hear, Hear)

Specialist Business

Mr. Tomlinson said it had been made absolutely clear over the years that the commercial community was taxed to the hilt; at the time of the alternative taxation proposals they had presented a willingness to go a little way further in order to meet exceptional conditions, but it should be definitely noted that the commercial community would not have any further tax levied whatsoever. After quoting evidence of the unfair incidence of the tax he said Mr. Tomlinson said practically every trader in the Colony who was a member of what he called a professional body had to pay a separate special licence fee and he thought it might be possible to justify the imposition of a separate licence fee in respect of each of these professions carried on by one from (Hear, Hear)

Mr. May said the Nairobi Trade Association recommended the introduction of an impostive licence on a graduated scale. That would be the object for the importer against private importers.

Mr. Wood said the Committee had ascertained that in the Union of South Africa the importer's licence was only in force in the Cape Province and he had been given extremely difficult of administration. Moreover it had appeared to the Committee that such a licence would adversely affect the export trade of the Colony.

Very little change

Very little change. Prices on December 3 were: Copper, £20 18 10. Tin, £22 1/2.

Rides

The market for heavy hides has been very quiet during the week. Hides tanners showing little or no interest in the various parcels on offer. Muttons, Deer or Salmon hides are on offer as low as £40 and business is reported to have been done at £40 to £50 per cent. reduction at 4 1/2. Medium quality skins are offered in the low qualities but light weights of 6 1/2, 6 and 6 1/2 lbs. are in good demand but short supply.

Skins

The market is quiet owing to the fact that prices have risen approximately 5 per cent. to 10 per cent. at origin and U. K. buyers have declined to follow the advance.

Other Commodities

Cocoa: Prices are firmer. East African I.M.s. being worth £25 15 per ton c.i.f. per ports. Groundnuts: In sympathy with the rise in Comorandi prices East African kernels show higher values. For December/January and January/February shipment the price is £11 c.i.f. usual ports.

DRAFT ESTIMATES REDUCED BY OVER £6,000

Staff Salaries

5 TO 10 PER CENT. REDUCTION IN FORCE NEXT MONTH

The Nairobi Municipal Council, realising the urgent need for economy have pruned their estimates for 1935 considerably. The result is a saving of over £6,000 on the original proposals.

A reduction of from 5 to 10 per cent. in staff salaries will take effect from the beginning of next year.

The Main Economy

On Tuesday of this week, Nairobi Municipal Council, after its deliberation on the estimates in public, and after further discussion, the amended estimates were read.

Some interesting amendments were revealed in the minutes of the Committee meeting, which provided further lengthy discussions by the Council. It was decided that the water meters and motor engines in the possession of the Council be disposed of, with the exception of a few which were purchased in June last. The estimates for transport for the Department of transport for the year 1935, each officer will be given a 5 per cent. reduction in his salary, for which the Council will make an appropriate allowance. In this connection, where the duties of any officer require him to travel outside the city, the Council will allow him to be at the rate of 50 cents per mile. In the matter of the foregoing reduction, the estimates for transport have been reduced from £781 to £260.

Building Inspectors

The main of the Committee's recommendations was to the effect that the number of Assistant Building Inspectors be reduced to two, that the two appointments engaged in the Municipal Department be retained to assist in the work of the Inspectors, and that the salary of the Inspectors be reduced by £300 in respect of the salary of one Assistant Building Inspector, and by £400 in respect of the salary of the other. It was also decided that the services of a temporary officer be not engaged, but that the services of a permanent officer be engaged, although a temporary one, for a period of six months, to assist in the work of the Inspectors, and that the salary of the Inspectors be reduced by £300 in respect of the salary of one Assistant Building Inspector, and by £400 in respect of the salary of the other.

Mayor's Allowance

Sir Cuthbert Lyster, who proposes to be in agreement with white settlement in Kenya, refuses to allow any confirmation of the policy to be publicly stated in the House, refuses to consider conversion of the loans that are enabling Kenya, and shuts his eyes to the Colony's continued excess of expenditure over income. Surely all this is part of a plan to drive out white settlement or to turn Kenya into a second Nigeria? Are we going to allow this or are we going to fight for redress?

Pundred search failed to reveal either the lion or its tracks. A European and two Wandebo who were present all exposed the view that the lion was unlikely to live more than a few hours.

In case there is anyone who believes that Mr. Powys was killed by a lion, I should like to point out that there is not a shadow of evidence that such lion was a wounded one; there is, moreover, nothing remotely to suggest that such hypothetical wounded lion was in any way connected with one severely wounded by General Arthur some weeks before.

GRADUATED POLL TAX—ESTIMATING INCOME

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard." Sir—Will the Government of Kenya not get into the open and say what is the interpretation of the Graduated Poll

Tax Ordinance where the Taxpayer has more than one business or more than one farm? I understand that during the year 1934-35, the assessments were made by the Revenue Officer for additional sums as a way of Tax to correct the error. It is not possible for the Revenue Officer to do this as one farm or one business is not assessed as a unit, but the profit on another, the Revenue Officer maintaining that such a thing is not to be set off.

I have had considerable experience in taxation in other countries and can say with certainty that never before have I met with such a situation as that which is probably the strict interpretation of the Ordinance. The Revenue Officer Mr. Smith, who runs a sheep farm and a coffee estate, he makes £5,000 on the coffee estate; he net income by all the rules of accountancy and common sense, as well as according to the Ordinance of the year 1934-35, the Revenue Officer estimating that the money spent on the sheep farm was not "money wholly and exclusively paid or expended for the purpose of acquiring the income from the sheep farm."

I find that something can be done before any more money is squandered out of the Taxpayer. The Revenue Officer appears to be banking on the probability that people will pay rather than face the enormous expense of going to the Supreme Court.

ROSES AT THE FLOWER SHOW

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard." Sir—May I ask you to be kind enough to print this letter as soon as possible so that the best results of reaching all likely exhibitors of roses and the K. H. S. Flower

Show on Monday next, December 17, can be known. I do not know if members are aware that our Society is affiliated to the National Rose Society in England, which affirms itself as under their rules of judging, and so offers a few of the rules under which have been judged here in the past.

Sire, combined with freshness and good general condition, will carry greater weight than heretofore, and half-petalled buds, all buds to be considered the perfect rose. The full petalled, good centred rose, half opened, in the type, to sit at, and minor defects caused by weather will not be dealt with as harshly as before. Rule 14 of the National Rose Society reads as follows: "All roses which are exhibited as cut from the plants are to be judged on the basis of their field and of any kind is strictly prohibited, with the exception of wire or other supports which may be used to keep the flower erect. A rose left to fall shall not receive any points from the judges. The over-decoration of roses is prohibited, and the judges are instructed to fix a bloom dressed so as to alter its character as a true bloom or not." Furthermore, Mr. Courtenay Page, the Hon. Secretary of the National Rose Society, has awarded a silver medal to be competed for in this Show by amateur exhibitors. The medal has been attached to Class 4 for 12 specimen roses shown to be best. We hope there will be good competition for this medal.

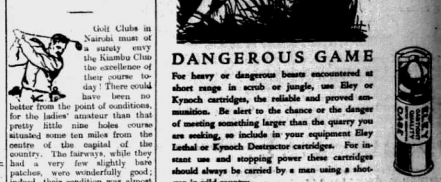

UNDERCURRENTS IN BRITISH LABOUR WORLD
The "Bedaux" System

Important changes are taking place in the world of Labour in Great Britain—changes which are almost passing unnoticed.

For instance, there is the "Bedaux" system, imported from America, which measures work by units, pays for excess and penalises those who fall below the minimum set by the employers. It is breeding unrest in the ranks of the British working-man.

There is, too, the growing movement in favour of the five-day week, and one or two firms have adopted it.

In all these changes, the Trades Unions are losing their grip and workers are beginning to speak for themselves.

But consider the case of the gas mantle which broke in a Lancashire factory and the dirty bus that did not leave the Holloway Depot!

Trades Union Decline

"[STANDARD] CORRESPONDENT"

Under the serene, sun-drenched London of the past few weeks, the workers in labour nowadays who are slowly revolutionizing our customs of living, have several instances of this in the last few days, quite the most important of which was an action brought by the High Court which was set out in the following paragraph in the *Labour Review* of "The Times."

In the next place there is a distinct movement in favour of the five-day week. They have been respected as a matter of fact in the North of England, where it works better than anywhere else, and it is clear that the same has been the case with other industries. The Trades Union movement is very much in a state of confusion, and although it is generally expected that it will be a success in the long run, it is not so sure of itself in the near future. The Government is in favour of it.

Another trouble which is coming to the front just at the present time is that the Government has heard in the new future, the decline in the number of British Memberships are falling. 

The Asian Local Civil Service

NEW TERMS AND CONDITIONS EXPLAINED TO COUNCIL

Three Classes

FUTURE RECRUITMENT ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY IN KENYA

Legislative Council on Thursday approved the terms and conditions for a new Asian Local Civil Service as proposed by the Civil Service Board, with one amendment making local leave conditions more generous.

The Service will consist of three classes: learners, clerical and non-clerical, with promotional scales more favourable than those at present ruling.

It is anticipated that the big majority of new entrants to the Asian Civil Service will be local Indian youths, recruitment from India having practically ceased.

More Local Leave

The Hon. T. G. Pilling, Deputy Colonial Secretary, in Legislative Council on Thursday made it plain that the report of the Civil Service Board on the proposed terms and conditions for the new Asian Local Civil Service is approved subject to the substitution of 14 days for 14 days of local leave to be granted.

Following a brief report the speaker said that in the year 1933 the Pilling Committee appointed to examine the terms and conditions attached to European appointments, in the Kenya Civil Service, suggested that a similar scheme should be adopted regarding the terms and conditions governing the employment of the new Asian Local Civil Service.

The Board's proposals also contemplated the grant of one-third of a retiral pension to India for each year of residential service and a full pension allowance of £10 each way one during each period of 7 years.

The revised conditions were not so favourable as those prevailing at present, but having regard to all the circumstances they were the best that could be offered. The new conditions would apply to all entrants into the new Asian Local Civil Service from January 1, 1935.

Report of Standing Finance Committee

ELECTED MEMBERS' PROPOSALS FOR LARGE SCALE ECONOMIES

Maximum of £150,000

£110,000 DECREASES SUGGESTED IN REVENUE FROM TAXATION AND CUSTOMS

The report of the Standing Finance Committee on the 1935 Budget issued on Saturday shows that the fundamental difference of opinion disclosed in the debate still exists.

The net result of the Majority Report recommendations, signed by the three Official Members and by the Indian member and the representative of Native interests, is a proposed increase in the revenue of £130,000 and a reduction in expenditure of £110,000.

On the other hand, the European Elected Members contend that a reduction in expenditure of at least £110,000, and probably as much as £150,000, is necessary to financial recovery together with a decrease in the estimated revenue of £140,729 including cuts in Customs, Native taxes and the abolition of the Non-Native Graduated Poll Tax.

Their major recommendations include reduction of the P.W.D. to a supervisory staff; elimination of veterinary field services; reorganisation of the administration of the Northern Frontier Province on a military basis; a percentage cut in departmental expenditure; a renewed demand for loan conversion and, if all these are still insufficient, either a temporary holding-up of Civil Service increments or the larger salaries of an additional levy on all salaries of over £200 per year.

Official Salaries: £282

The eagerly awaited report of the Standing Finance Committee on the 1935 Budget was issued on Saturday morning. It is in two sections—namely, the majority report signed by the three Official Members and by the Indian Elected Member, Mr. J. P. F. Fox, and the minority report signed by the three Elected Members and by the Indian Elected Member, Mr. J. P. F. Fox.

Selected meetings were held but the report of the Standing Finance Committee was not discussed. The Committee first made a detailed examination of the revenue estimates in the light of actual collections. It then proceeded to the expenditure side.

Revenue Estimates. The Report then details the examination of the revenue estimates, the first being Customs and Excise. The majority of the Committee are of the opinion that the estimate of £1,000,000 is a waste of money.

Problems of Reduction. The Chairman (who is the Colonial Secretary) explained the position and said he would do his best to reduce expenditure but there were many difficulties. The majority report proceeds to detail them.

The justification for keeping Native taxation at the present level but not proceeding to raise it, is that the majority of the population are too poor to pay more. The total sum in the estimates on account of Native taxes is slightly less than the sum on account of Government income. It is difficult to see any curtailment of that amount.

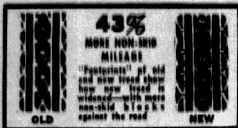

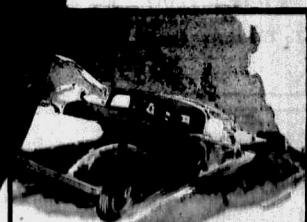

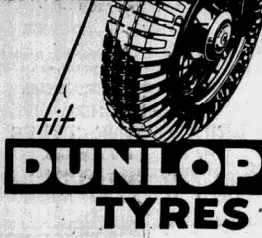
