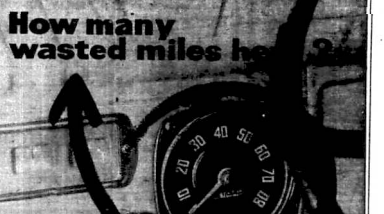

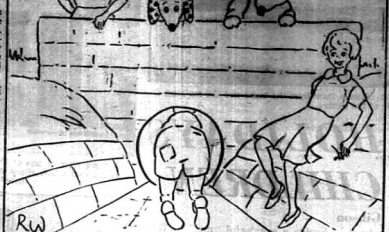

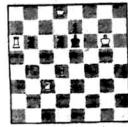

HANS PUTTAR, a young German who is saving Africa the hard way—has cycled through Ethiopia, Kenya, Tanganyika, Portuguese East Africa, Nyasaland and the Rhodesias and is now leaving Harare for the Congo—describes a strange experience in Tanganyika.

AFTER two weeks' strenuous cycling, I reached Songea in Tanganyika. I did not stop for long but carried on for 16 miles to Perambio which must be one of the largest missions in the whole of East Africa. In Tanganyika, Perambio has won the nick-name of the "Golden City".

Perambio Mission was founded in 1896 by Father Caspian Spies, of the Benedictine Mission of St. Ottilien, Bavaria, which arrived in East Africa in 1884. Father Caspian was also nominated as the first bishop in 1902.

During the Mau Mau Rising in 1959, Perambio was completely destroyed and the Father-in-charge, Father Franz Leuthner, was taken prisoner by the insurgents and killed.

When Bishop Caspian, who lived at Dar es Salaam, heard of the troubles in Tanganyika, he decided to rush to his parish to see if he could do anything to help. He was taken prisoner by the insurgents and killed.

At the time of Perambio, there were two monks and two sisters in his company. They were returned to Perambio in April 1960.

Kenya prosperity still depends on farmers

KENYA has, since the turn of the century, been dependent upon agriculture for its economic stability. Today, major constitutional and land reforms are under way, yet the productivity and the revenue of the country will still require to be supported more and more by the productive effort of farmers of all races.

The policy of the Government will continue to foster and increase productivity by encouraging farmers to supply the needs of the country and those export markets in which there is a profitable outlet for the production of farms and plantations. It is the balance which has been built up between the production of the mixed farms, the ranches and the export cash crops which has given strength to the agriculture of the country.

The evolution of producer and factory boards has provided for the orderly development of Kenya's agriculture, subsidies and for sound pricing and marketing.

GROWING ROLE

The recent report of the committee under the chairmanship of Mr. Donald MacCallister once again indicates that the expansion of our agricultural industries is on sound lines.

As new legislative measures forward, many of the recommendations of the committee will be incorporated into the law.

Here, I would say that the agricultural committees in districts will be called upon to play an even more important part in our development plan.

In the unshaded areas they will participate in the land development proposals that rapidly, dealing both with the expansion of the mixed farms and the production of the export cash crops and the promotion of their respective industries.

For its part, Government has aimed to create conditions for a stable agriculture, has assisted with finance for development where it has been required and has provided competent agricultural advisers and other services to meet the varying needs

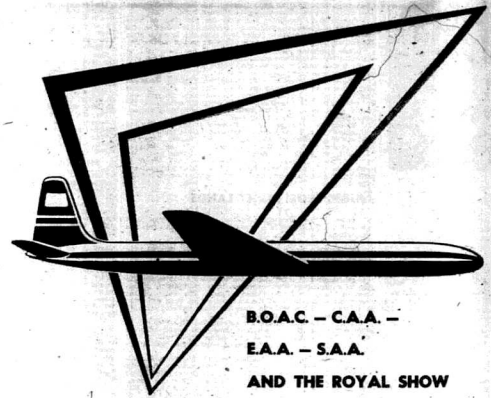

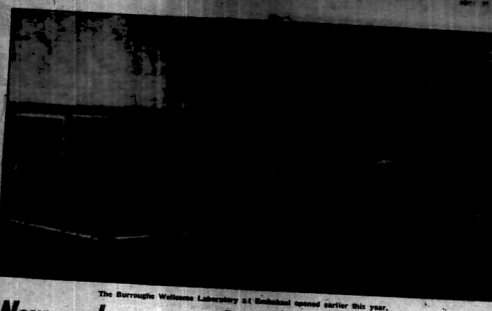

THE 1960 Royal Show will be, as most of you know, headed by Admiral of the Fleet Earl Mountbatten of Burma. Lord Louis, who is affectionately known throughout the Royal Navy, will arrive at noon on September 25 by helicopter. The aircraft will land in the grounds near the President's house, where it will be greeted by the President and will inspect a Guard of Honour and the Kenya band of the R.A.F.

The official opening will be at 3 p.m. Unfortunately, Lord Mountbatten will have to leave soon afterwards in order to fulfil the heavy programme which has been set for him. I must say that I have been most gratified to find that enthusiasm for the "Royal" has not waned in the slightest degree in spite of the political uncertainty.

For the first time statutory officers of the Government departments are being allowed to exhibit in the show.

Record number of entries for farm and dairy classes

THE Royal Show Committee has made considerable efforts over the last few years to encourage exhibitors in this section of the show which at one time was in a declining state. This has been done by improving the situation of the exhibits which are now housed in a new and in an adjacent stone building, specially built to take dairy products, and in improving the facilities for exhibitors.

In addition the chief officers of the Agricultural Department have made successful efforts to encourage exhibitors in the section among both European and African farmers. As a result the exhibits have been increasing in numbers each year and a larger proportion of the exhibitors have been forward.

This year the number of entries in the dairy section has increased by a very large number in comparison with the last year. It is hoped that other African farmers will also be encouraged by the increase in the number of exhibits.

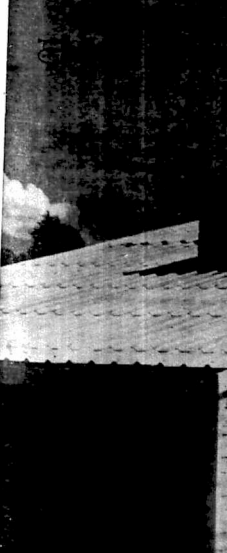

Country's wealth needs to be wrested from the fertile top soil

KENYA is a country which is not blessed with golden eggs. It does not have mineral or industrial resources nor reserves of fertile soil. Such wealth as Kenya has must needs be wrested from the fertility of its top soil and that soil is an asset which can too easily be denuded.

Over the 40 years of Kenya's recent history, production from the land has been built up to a value of around £100,000,000 a year. The provision of the subsistence needs of the 10,000,000 African people accounts for produce to the value of £37,000,000. Cash sales of produce surplus to African producers' needs is worth £3,000,000 against the gross output from European farming in Kenya worth £24,000,000 which provides employment to 250,000 people and wages in c.o.m.s. of £12,000,000.

These are significant figures because they stress the importance of the intensive farming and plantation agriculture which the Government as Kenya's ruling authority is likely to require an expanding economy and increasing revenues to the Exchequer.

They are significant too in underlining the need to press ahead with the expansion of the farming, forestry and plantation agriculture which the Government is likely to require the bulk of the population should move away from subsistence living to an expanding cash economy and to a standard level of living more in keeping with the needs of the people of an evolving modern State.

FARMING BASIS

The basis of good farming is dependent upon the farmer having security of tenure over his land. The big enclosure movements which have taken place in parts of Nyanza and Rift Valley Provinces and the progressive reorganisation of land progressively undertaken by the Administration into "Central Provinces" have resulted in about 1,200,000 acres of individual African farms separated from the former tribal lands held on a clan or communal basis.

This figure makes a significant start to bringing all the 22,000 square miles of the African land high quality of the

soil into a state where the conventional farming can be sustained, where the benefits of improved methods of production can be realised, where production can be increased and where the land is available securely for development.

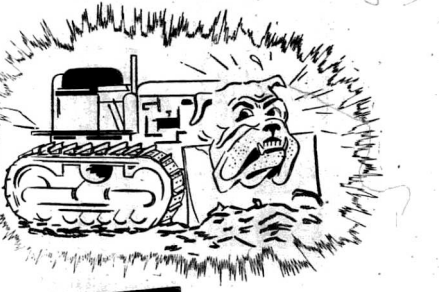

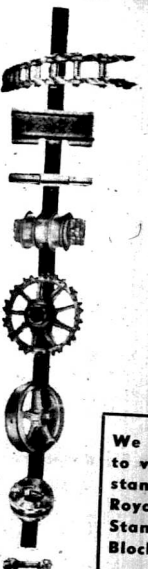

PIG INDUSTRY FROM LAST YEAR'S CRISIS

By Dr. V. G. THOMPSON I wish to emphasize at the beginning that this article expresses my personal opinion and ideas and not necessarily the views of the Pig Industry Board or of the Uplands Board. The number of pig exhibitors and the degree of interest in the pig section of the Royal Show may, to a very large extent, be considered to be a barometer of confidence in the industry.

Last year when I returned from England from a "short" holiday I was surprised with the opening of the Royal Show, and I was struck by the atmosphere of despondency and gloom which prevailed.

Furthermore, the cost of administering the Pig Industry Board has been reduced. It is estimated that the deduction of 2 per cent is found from the total amount available for this purpose.

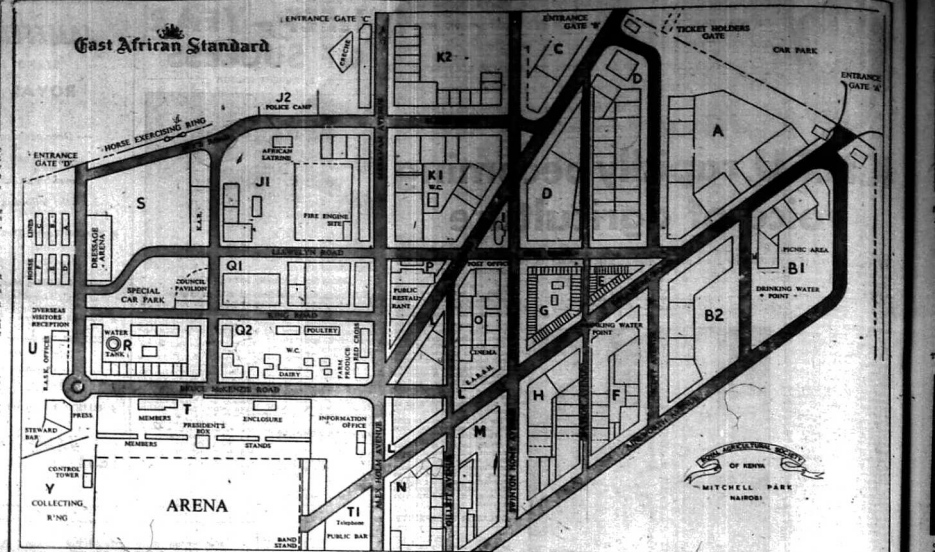

Estate's Royal link 350 years

THROUGH his world-wide commitments as Chief of the Defence Staff recently permit him to enjoy these, Admiral of the Fleet, Lord Mountbatten of Burma, is landlord of 4,000 acres of land — most of them farmland — on the edge of the New Forest in Hampshire.

But in one of the most beautiful parts of England, the estate has connections with royal history for more than 350 years.

At the top of this southern county, most of the farms on the estate are mixed arable and dairy. Lord Mountbatten's share of the 1,000 acres himself and the rest are left to tenant farmers.

TOP QUALITY
Wheat and barley are the chief arable crops and this year, despite some battering from recent thunderstorms, year-on-year yields are expected to be good.

Almost all the estate is devoted to farming, but there is also plenty of well-observed rolling parkland, good riding country and nearly 5,000 acres of woods.

For about three miles, the River Test, a gentle brook and salmon stream — runs through the estate. Between 300 and 500 salmon are caught each year, the average weight being about 14lb. The fish was the property of the Agricultural Society, which has been held there almost every year since it was started last century.

"TREMELY little soul," we say fondly, gazing at the child lost in a brown study. "Living in a world of his own." Of course, and quite a clever, later owned. The years pass. "Can't understand it" we cry in rage and anguish, "a very little... nothing but..."

Yet another shrilling adolescent has failed to reveal the splendour of a dream-world... the alarming facts of real life, so-called; has failed even to distinguish between the moans of lies, half-truths and evasions.

In comedy, plays or films, male fantasies are almost always presented as "happy endings." This is the case with this distressing mental handicap as usually presented in non- tragic contexts: a curious convention.

BRAVE TRY

I have not read the novel from which its author, Keith Waterhouse and Willis Hall have made Billy Liar, but in the theatre, with the help of Lindsay Anderson, their producer, they have bravely tried it and to break at least to modify this convention.

They have drawn a sympathetic, though not indulgent, portrait of just such a liar, but still against a broadly factual background.

The play is set in the Liverpool suburb of Toxteth in the North-County 1 or 2 in the middle of the 1930s. The writer, Waterhouse, and his partner, Hall, are both working-class lads, and disappearing into class, especially represented by George A. Cooper, Mavis Washburner and Ethel Griffin, who are the play's main characters. The play is Billy Liar's life as a pimp and a con-man.

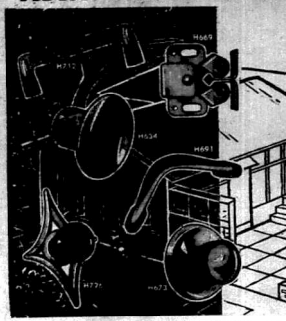

Architects' style reflects the age

THE emergence of a genuine local style of architecture has become a major feature of the Australian building industry in recent years. To fruits are apparent not only in the thousands of new houses built and built throughout Australia, but also in the fact that Australian architects have succeeded in the face of keen competition from Germany, Italy and France.

SCIENTISTS REDUCE NOISE AND RAISE OFFICE EFFICIENCY

IT has long been recognised that noisy public buildings, offices and houses cause irritation and loss of working efficiency. For this reason, scientists in Australia are helping building firms to eliminate or lessen noise by the use of sound-absorbing devices, such as acoustic tiles.

These scientists are working in the architectural physics section of the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation's division of building research at Griffith.

They have made the attack on noise more efficient by precisely the characteristics of sound-absorbing materials.

Acoustic tiles are used extensively for reducing noise in offices, halls and living areas. Although they are not fireproof and appear messy, these tiles are a good deal better than most other sound absorbers.

The tiles consist usually of a perforated facing of metal or plastic behind which is a porous material.

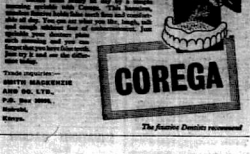
