ZANZIBAR WILL HELP TRACK MAN'S ROUTE TO MOON

THE AIRS GIBSONS' ... Zanzibar ...

THE weird bell shaped space capsule hurtles through the inky-black void at 16,000 m.p.h., its blunt nose burning red-hot with the heat of air friction. Inside, the first man ever to be shot into space — unless the Russians beat him to it — sits, cramped, tense and weightless in the eerie world of the atmosphere.

More than 100 miles below — as the sleek, sun-drenched island of Zanzibar ankle about its business in much the same way as it has done for centuries — a team of doctors and scientists track his progress. The name of this 20th-century miracle is Project Mercury, possibly the most daring one-man feat ever to be achieved.

Behind it is the U.S. National Aeronautics and Space Administration, a three-year-old body that employs the finest designers in the Western world and draws on the vast resources of American universities and armed forces. Project Mercury's prime mission is to accomplish Man's sustained flight into Space in a jet-propelled capsule.



And it is regarded by the United States as a model in the design of space craft, that will be followed by larger and more efficient ones that may ultimately take Man to the Moon.

Last month it visited the site of the Zanzibar tracking station — one of 43 that are being set up across the World in a north-south line from Cape Canaveral, Florida, in the eastern seaboard of the United States to Antarctica.

Project Mercury will be launched about midway through next year.

TOWERS BUILT

Situated in the middle of a Government cattle ranch at Zanzibar some 17 miles from Zanzibar town, futuristic tracking towers stand among bare coral outcrops where rows of grass are sparse.

Zanzibar has been chosen not because of its strategic military position — for this is not a military project — but because it is very much on the equator. Project Mercury will follow from Canaveral.

There is no suggestion that the island to be used as a rocket-launching site, although local politicians have opposed it on these grounds.

In fact one of the American engineers working on the construction of the launch structure of the jet-propelled rocket — "If you tried to launch a rocket from that place — the

hand would most likely sink about two feet," shouts in his gasping English right out astronaut will circumnavigate the globe three times in a year four and a half hours. Then parachutes will open and the capsule will drift down to Earth as recovery.

Targets taken for ride

SAM, a 7th class monkey, completed a successful ride through space when Project Mercury scientists sent aboard another dummy space capsule in the Luna, but carries the name of the Cape Canaveral, Fla., Wallops Station, Virginia.

The crew is designed to develop a space mechanism to separate the capsule with one of the arm's U.S. astronaut ejection seats.
