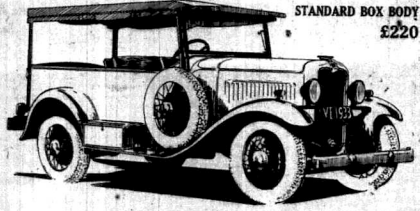

advisory and has in theory no
absolute power but its influence in
railway affairs is nevertheless con-
siderable and it is undoubtedly

to account to the public. It is

If railway policy was to be dictated by centrally changing the Railways Commissioners advised by a Railway Advisory Council composed of officials and a chairman, who changes every month, the task of the General Manager would be an exceedingly heavy one, and the possibility of being overruled by the dispersed body of his staff would be a serious matter.

I have come to the conclusion that the appointment of a High Commissioner for Transport is both a mistake and that the post should be abolished. I do not think the High Commissioner could perform the duties of the General Manager and propose to outweigh the political disadvantages of the position.

But if the office was abolished both Governments and the Secretary of State would not be content to leave the control of the Railway entirely in the General Manager's hands, nor would the Railway General Manager welcome this additional responsibility. Having considered and rejected the idea of a Government's Conference functioning as a Railway Board, Mr. Gibb favours the appointment of a Board of the London Board similar to the Board of the Government nominated directors, who would not only be responsible but who would not be nominated by the Secretary of State.

In the disappearance of the High Commissioner for Transport would disappear also the Railway Advisory Council. THE PROBLEM OF THE K.U.R.

Sir,—Judging by "E.A. Standard," Sir is a very able technical expert on the subject of the K.U.R. The public do not understand the problem of the Kenya and Uganda Railway. The opinion herein expressed is that it is a very technical subject difficult for the layman to understand, but it appears to me that the difficulties are not perceived by the Railway as they are by the public. If they are considered by the Railway as a simple matter, and if you will kindly allow me space, I will endeavor to state the problem in a few words as follows. Some ten years ago, before the late Sir Christian Pelling was the General Manager of the Uganda Railway (as this railway was then called), a Bates roller was laid down based on the same principles as those on which railway rats operate are based all over the world. The two main principles are:—(1) Different classes of goods are carried at different rates. (2) The average rate charged is sufficient to enable the railway to pay its way. At that time it was necessary that the Railway should carry an average of about 15 cents for each ton carried one mile for each of all classes of goods, including depreciation and all interest charges. It was evident that primary products would not afford to pay anything like that rate, and so port maize was carried at a flat rate of Sh. 1/ per bag, which was equivalent to an average of about 2 cents per ton-mile for the extra goods. The other branch lines were taken into consideration. Now there is a big difference between 2 cents and 15 cents for this difference of charging a very much higher rate for other goods. Spirits, oil goods, etc., could afford to pay as much as Sh. 1/ per ton-mile, and even more for short distances. This rate is equivalent to about Sh. 1/ of a bottle of whisky a ton-mile. The tariff was built up which worked satisfactorily for a number of years, until a new tariff was being made from time to time. The railway administration is surprised it was asked to reduce rates on one or more classes of goods. In 1929 although interest charges had increased to £48,000, as compared with £28,000 in 1927, and the average rate charged had fallen from about 15 cents to 12 1/2 cents per ton-mile, the railway was able to pay its way and also to put £100,000 in a much needed Reserve Fund. For several years prior to 1929, there had been ominous signs which had been pointed out to the Railway Advisory Council and also to Legislative Councils both by Sir Christian Pelling and General Rhodes. The tonnage of imported export goods, which was increasing at an alarming rate, was alarming from a railway point of view owing to its very low rate—the tonnage of the high-rated imports and exports had increased to anything like the same extent. In fact had a tendency to decrease. It is obvious that in this process, if continued, would result in the average rate received falling below average total costs. A moderate decrease in average rate would not be serious if accompanied by a steady increase in total tonnage. The ton-mile costs automatically decrease with increased tonnage. But in 1929 and 1931 there were very serious decreases in tonnage as well as a decrease in the average rate received, and drastic retrenchment and economies had been effected while the Reserve Fund was to be drawn on to extinction. When the output of an industrial concern is greatly reduced, the cost of production can only be kept down by retrenchment and economies, but no industry can be expected to reduce the price of its product if it does not reduce the price of its output to the consumer.

The Railway sales transport and economies in same increase the sale price of the article sold. In 1931, the railway had a deficit of 111 cents per ton-mile and something had to be done to increase that average. Efforts were made to increase the tonnage of high-rated goods by making it a duty to carry those goods in competition with the Railway one or legal raters, but this was very hazy, although it is not clear that it was intended to do so. Commercial Registration.

After the Great War, and mainly after a great number of countries had gone off the gold standard, international trade presented problems which each country must study carefully for its own position and to be seriously affected by them.
Among these problems the creation of free zones and the development of the existing free zones are of great importance.

Portugal, whose financial and economic condition is so far improving, in trying to assist the foreign commercial relations in general and particularly being desirous of securing a greater volume of international trade, has issued instructions to all Consulates to carry out a special registration, voluntary and free of charge, of all the Portuguese merchants established in Colonial districts.

This registration made in duplicate, a copy of which will be sent to the Bureau of Commercial Information, is intended to ascertain the position of the Portuguese merchants established in Colonial districts, and to be used in the event of any international trade agreement which may be concluded between Portugal and any foreign country.

interfered with the planning of the national mileage tariffs had been rightly abolished in East Africa and should not be revived. The abolition of differential rates will not mean that government producers must submit to a transport disadvantage with their goods and also to give some railway assistance, free from the taint of differential distribution of charges by carrying stocks and assuming the responsibility of changing prices and distribution business. This would only be done by the normal method of quoting differential rates for different quantities. When this was done the rates for those who ordered in relatively large quantities would get cheaper rates from the Coast and these rates plus the higher rates for the small consignment forwarded to destination would frequently be less than the high small quantity rate charged to the coastal distributor for the throughout distance, especially if the rates for small quantities did not include much taper. The railway distributor who ordered in reasonable quantities would, if high differential rates were applied, obtain railway assistance against his coastal competitor and in return for this advantage would help the Railway to obtain better wagon loads and generally to reduce operative costs.

Mr. Gibb recommends, therefore, that the differential rates for quantity should be established partly by the adoption of "small" or "parcel" scale for consignments up to 200 lbs. irrespective of the highest rates and partly by granting differential classification for large consignments.

Country Produce Rates.

Turning to country produce rates Mr. Gibb defines these as differential rates applied to commodities according to whether they are imported or locally produced. For exactly the same services the Railway charges high rates on imported commodities. These differential rates are adopted not for railway reasons but to add to the tariff protection afforded by the Customs duties. This system is applied in several forms or other in many countries where high protective duties are in force and where the railways are Government owned. Though they would be not applied in East Africa, it is almost universally regarded as unsound by railway officials and is also disliked by Customs authorities who are deprived by the preferential railway rates of revenues they would secure if the product were applied through railway rates. Moreover, protection is given the greatest protection to

producers far removed from the Coast who should obtain the active protection of the Customs barrier on a tariff rate preferable in absolute amount than protection applied on a railway charge principle.

The K.L.F. officials in consultation with others similarly situated wish to abolish railway produce rates and desire to be permitted to fix their rates on railway principles and railway produce rates. It is entirely in agreement with their wishes in this respect. The problem of adjusting rates of railway goods is difficult enough in itself without having the task made far more difficult by superimposed rates of the rail to produce rates. The justification of the railway rates to the producers of goods is that it is to be obtained by a rate fixed for goods which have no railway protection that which rating system is quite richly justified with extreme distrust and every railway user so far as the effects on the general public are concerned. If he fails to do so, it is insufficient political protection. If a trade or industry cannot get all the protection it needs at the Customs barrier after open discussion in the Legislative Council, public confidence in the integrity of the railway management is not improved when it becomes known that the maximum protection obtainable through customs tariffs has been largely increased behind the closed doors of the Railway Advisory Council.

Not Generally Approved.

Although against the Railway's wishes country produce differential rates still persist, they are not generally approved. Uganda is opposed to them and Tanganyika is opposed to them and in Kenya most of the majority of those who give evidence to the vice opposition. Mombasa is against them and so is Kisumu. In Nairobi, too, opinion seemed fairly evenly divided, though those in favour of them often were so because they had been encouraged to confine country produce rates with low export rates. Even if country produce rates are abolished the railways will in their own self interest have to report rates now and will probably favour, as they should, lower rates than the normal tariff rates to the coastal markets to help locally produced goods to compete with imported articles which contribute little or nothing to railway revenues.

Mr. Gibb states this system of rates is not applied by the national railway system in the Union of South Africa, nor by a large body of railway users. He makes this statement because members of the Railway Advisory Council appear to attach much importance to the fact that country produce rates are in force in the Union. His recommendation is that country produce rates should be abolished without

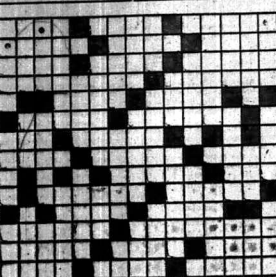

Juries of the native reserves, if more land were needed by the natives, without the medical commission being given an opportunity of discussing it without reference to the Legislative Council. The unofficial commission that the standard of all land in the Highlands outside the township was for Kibera as opposed to other witnesses agreed.

Mr. H. E. Ward views the other witnesses as follows:

Native Oath.

The examination then turned to the methods of dealing with native stock so far as control and increasing the standard. It was held that a vertical circle was now being created by thousands of pounds being spent on keeping stock alive which was of no value and which was actually doing damage to the land occupied by the cattle-owning tribes. As a means of reducing the number, the erection of meat factories was urged, on which Government should spend money now allocated to the veterinary department. Mr. Colville took part in the phase of the matter, and said that the majority of the surplus cattle actually died of starvation, there should be meat factories at intervals where they turned into fertilizer for the time being until the stock improved, when meat extracts could be made. The hides would also improve by Sla. 4/- in place of the 2/- in place of the 1/- under the present prevailing conditions.

Mr. Colville suggested a factory for the Maasi and Wabamba and was asked to leave for the Northern Frontier Province, the stock routes being fenced where they passed through occupied lands. Regarding the utilization of the cattle in the form of dried or jerked beef, Capt. Ward bore a trade could be worked up with Northern Rhodesia and Southern Congo. Goats were emphatically described as a great menace to Kenya, with which, as well as the sheep, it could be done commercially. The mental outlook of the native had to be changed before any useful satisfactory could be achieved.

Soldier Settlement Scheme.

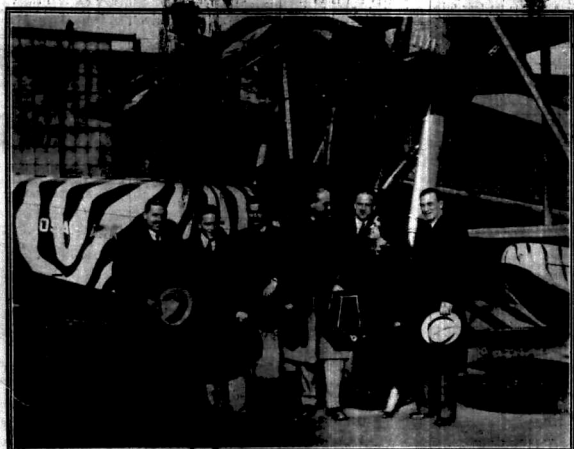

RAILWAY EARNINGS.

Increase for Month of December.

In December last, the approximate monthly earnings of the Kenya and Uganda Railway and Harbours, all services, showed an increase over the estimate and as compared with 1931. Taken over the whole twelve months, however, a decrease is again reported.

The month of December, following the estimate, the first figure being the estimate, the second the approximate actual return:— Passengers, (£17,842), (£17,102); parcels and luggage, (£2,049), (£2,150); goods, (£130,000), (£122,100); telegrams and mail, (£1,500), (£1,500); telegrams, (£8,211), (£9,291). The estimate thus totalled £164,442 and £181,245 was the approximate return, giving an increase of £16,803 of the latter over the former and £26,803 more than for the same period of 1931.

Turning to this year's figures, from January 1 to December 31, they are as follows: the first being the estimate, the second the approximate return:— Passengers, (£216,699), (£170,467); parcels and luggage, (£40,900), (£35,797); goods, (£2,450,000), (£2,378,719); telegrams and mail, (£1,566,097), (£1,566,097); telegrams and miscellaneous, (£51,400), (£47,865).

It was estimated that £1,500,000 would be received from these sources of revenue, whereas the approximate receipts came £1,857,000, a shortfall of £358,000, or 23.87 per cent. For the whole of the last year the following decreases were also reported:—

NON-STOP FLIGHT RECORD.

Fanny-Venon long-range monoplane, which is attempting a new non-stop flight record, left South Africa's time today, the machine being scheduled to sub-north of Johannesburg, South-West Africa.

The British long-range distance record of 3,940 miles, established by an Air Force plane in April 1929 was broken during the night, but the aircraft, which was equipped with a radio-circuit from 110 to 115 miles an hour, on the same day, was forced to land in a storm with a period of 100 miles an hour.

It is anticipated that the machine, which left Johannesburg on Monday, December 26, will reach Cape Town tomorrow.

The American world record of 4,126 miles, which was set in London when Zeppelin was passed, the total journey of Cape Town to London, was broken by the machine, which was being tried for 60 hours—British Official Wireless Service.

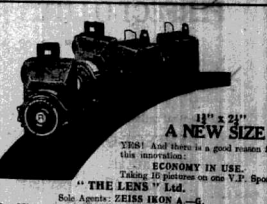

Dwyer (the Conservative member for Kingston West) has been successful in the ballot held at the opening of the session, and his name will be raised at the top of the public opinion by a motion of debate which will be the province of the Treasury Minister, Mr. Neville Chamberlain. The motion is to be introduced by Mr. Dwyer at 10.15 a.m. and will be discussed by Mr. Chamberlain at 11 a.m. The debate is of great importance because it is the first time since the introduction of the Ordinance that the House has been called upon to discuss the question of compensation in cash or land, or both, in cases where land has to be expropriated from Native Reserves for the purpose of granting mining leases. The Government has proposed that the compensation should be paid in cash, or land, or both, as the case may be, and that the amount should be determined by a special committee. Mr. Chamberlain is expected to support the Government's proposal, while Mr. Dwyer is expected to oppose it. The debate is expected to continue until 4.15 p.m. and will be a most interesting one.

The Estimates of Revenue and Expenditure for 1932 state that the Civil Service pay a compulsory deduction of £25,000 to the Widows and Orphans Pension Scheme per annum. GAS WARFARE OF THE FUTURE.

Be sieged in Air-Tight Rooms.

With its civilian populations of cities and towns and villages open to gas attacks from the air, the world will need the full of its full-fledged. Its leaves are augmented in a little book which has just been issued by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, entitled "Protection of Civilian Population in Chemical Warfare."

There is the picture in points of view from a room bombarded with gas masks will seek to protect themselves. It is a picture of the streets are full of a persistent heavy gas, unless accompanied by long deflagrations or dropped bombs. The family's first task is to make his home air-tight against the outside menace by gas-proofing the rooms or rooms in which it must live until the gas disappears.

Gaps in windows must be filled in with putty or pasted over with paper. The window shades opening in the door also must be covered with blankets that have been soaked in water. The door or oil or heavy water to make them impervious to gas. Chimneys must be locked up and ventilators closed or covered. In a protected room, which is closely sealed up, life can be maintained for many hours. It has been found that a normal sized room about 20 ft square of close space is required per person for safe occupation with gas. The occupants, however, should remain quiet, and no lights, except electric, should be burned, so as to use up little air as possible. All fire must be extinguished as they draw air from the outside.

Red Lights For Help.

It is a picture of the death of the innocent by means so horrible that one doubts the sanity of a world which still persists in arming for war is made for. In addition to keeping food and water supplies readily available, the members of this family who are a strong family that might be gassed by gas must provide additional materials for their safety. They should use the first coverings given away, a real flight for clothing and underwear in case of an urgent request for help, and paper and pencils for writing urgent messages which might be slipped out under the door.

The booklet goes on to say that in a pandemic after all the time it is heavily contaminated the population may have to be prevented. The inhabitants should, however, remain in their protected rooms, unless such arrangements have made the necessary arrangements for their removal in protected vehicles.

Suggestions are made about decontamination of the streets. They have been covered of gas. For this the method (Mayer process) involves entire streets turned into public washhouses, into one of the streets, and children on the other, behind curtains or screens. (Mayer process) is not of paid full from hospitals. Money can be used for disinfecting or using a chemical of disinfecting. Those who cannot will have to be supplied with all that is needed. When an attack will have to be employed depending on the nature of the gas poison gas used. People whose homes have been invaded by gas will have to be provided with shelter.

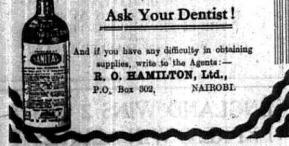

ception records, namely speed, distance and altitude. The speed record being that of Flight-Lieut. G. H. Shainforth's 497.6 miles per hour and the altitude being Captain C. F. Lewin's 45,956 feet established last year. The machine adds that the range of the biplane is now shown to be several times that of any standard aircraft of the R.A.F. today. The establishment of the record is valuable as a further proof of the soundness of our aircraft construction, and also for determining the type of service aircraft best fitted for reconnaissance and other distant parts of the Empire.

Pilots Not Fatigued.

The Air Ministry claims that the American record has been beaten by 428 miles by the Crosswell biplane. The flight, which lasted 57 hours and 15 minutes, was perfectly uneventful. They attended personally to the safety of their machine and then went to their hotel and were seen fast asleep. They are probably staying at Walvis Bay till Friday. They admitted that they had anticipated being to reach Cape Town due to heavy weather in the Cameroons.

Bad Weather.

Seafarer Leader Gaydon in his report to the Air Ministry states that the weather was good until Nigeria, where at Saranman a haze hindered navigation. Mount Cameroon, of 13,000 feet was completely covered by clouds and rain squalls. There was much cloud on the second night and the automatic control was unworkable during the bad weather, and was of no further use for the remainder of the flight. The distance covered was probably 6,000 miles. The official time for the flight was 57 hours 22 minutes and the speed 68.3 m.p.h., based on the projected route, but since a deviation in Nigeria was made, the speed must have exceeded 100 m.p.h. The Major, Lord Lovelock and Mr. Hansley Macdonald and the Air Council have eulogised their contribution.

LOCUSTS AT KAMPALA.

Native Chickens Have a Real Harvest.

["STANDARD" (Kampala), February 8.]
Swarms of locusts have invaded Kampala and its environs during the past few days. They seem to have been flying since in a restricted area and it looks as though they are settling to feed. Large numbers have been seen to be pulling on the grasses of the park to the annoyance of players although this is always a common cause for leaving cricket short approach shot.

Little or no damage to the arrival of these locusts has been reported since they were first seen on the 27th inst. of the month. Numbers are also reported on the banks of the Nile. The native chickens—when given a programme film as a rule—having had a real harvest. We saw three flocks who were liberally drunk with too many locusts. They were staggering about the road pecking at the food insects and were often not missing them together.

been very helpful to their activities. It was the only organization which tried to link up the work of this country. In England Lady Eleanor said she had made proposals about the women's to the Bureau of Women's Institutes. There were all votes at Home and Kenya had got to look to them to be her supporters. The fact that Lady Eleanor said she looked to the F.A.W.I. as a real help to white civilization in the country, she believed it was greatly needed. There seemed to be rather a slight ahead of them and the women must take their part in it. As to how much they did but what they could do, and would like to see every woman in the Colony a member of the League. She concluded that members of the League were wise choice of President during the past year.

QUESTIONS.

How do our activities compare with the activities in other countries asked Gladys Lady Delamater at the meeting.

The reply was that the comparison was favourable to Kenya. Lady Eleanor said it had struck her that hearing about Palestine that Government had appointed a member of the general civil service. She was not to discuss the women's interests, both Jews and Arabians. She was a definite member of the Administration. It is time to come they might feel it worth while to be a member of the appointment in Kenya.

A number of the meeting asked if the Divorce League had a definite plan to combat the ridiculous stories about Kenya. Lady Eleanor said the problem was not a simple one. Income Tax.

LOED FRANCIS SCOTT STATES THE ISSUE.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."
 Sir,—I read in your issue of February 18 an open letter addressed to me by Mr. O'Shea, asking me to state what I think before the matter actually begins. The general position as I see it is hardly so uncertain. The Budget introduced by Government last December shows that the country has liquid assets left in the form of surplus balances, and that on the present basis of estimated returns there will be a deficit in 1933 of £200,000,000. The Executive and Finance Committee's Report is nearing completion and it is clear that the Government have the next few weeks, and probably the next few months, to make their proposals. At the same time, it must be possible to agree what might be done to reduce the deficit. It is not likely that £200,000,000 can be saved in 1933 and that its reconstructions will only be really effective in 1934 and onwards.

I believe I must agree that every effort should be made to reduce the deficit, and therefore we must be prepared with means which might be a temporary measure towards our revenue. Government has published an Income Tax Bill for discussion and it is a well known fact that the position of an Income Tax is their proposed method of dealing with the situation. The bill has been brought in by the publication of this bill, and the whole country has been told that the system of taxation in the country is only natural for, and in fact the duty of the "E.A. Standard" is to be the most helpful in leading articles on a matter of such major importance. But I will tell you one thing in addition to the course already we are taking. It is that we have in any way attempted to take any action from the Government, as suggested by Mr. O'Shea, that is a completely unrealistic and additional revenue will be needed to balance the Budget in 1933, or at any rate to reduce the deficit to small dimensions. ONLY SOLUTION OF RAILWAY PROBLEM.

lent. The higher rates proposed should be less burdensome and more equitable than equivalent additional taxation which would otherwise be required to make good the shortage of railway revenue, but increased rates cannot in themselves solve the present railway problem. That can be solved only by increased production of suitable goods at cost prices which permit of sale at a profit covering the cost of transport. The small European population cannot provide this necessary production if it makes either as all from the mines, or as all from the mills, or as all from the factories, or as all from the plantations, or as all from the coffee and other crops on which the railway so much depends. It will be difficult for natives to supply the additional tonnage the railway losses will require.

With the disappearance of country produce into the hands of the Europeans, the points out that the "in transit" tax on Uganda should be removed, but especially low rates to be accorded to the goods which pass through the railway to the coast. This competition should be permitted to take place. Instead of two railways should settle upon one to be served by both and should agree to rates which will carry out the policy adopted.

Road Competition.

Mr. Gibb remarks that the distributors do not favour road conveyance and adds that when the rates are charged to the extent, to avoid adding too much to the cost of farm haulage, the railway should be left to compete freely with road conveyance.

The next section of the report is devoted to the question of branch lines which no real progress has been made in Kenya and Uganda has been made in the latter country, says Mr. Gibb. How the lines, if any, are to be calculated is not clear and rival firms produce very different results. The report indicates that a calculation by which the results of the railway are compared with a loss of 499,464 and by another of profit of 25,900.

The fact that it has not yet been possible to agree upon a formula which gives accurately the effect of a branch line on the balance of the railway's net revenue account gives a clue to the solution of the problem. There is no mathematically accurate method of doing the calculation. No formula exists which can be safely and equitably applied to all branches and each Government desiring the construction of a new branch will have to give most guarantee to the Railway Administration as appears best suited to the circumstances of the branch.

Thereafter Mr. Gibb proceeds to criticize the formula as present employed recommending alter also that the above guarantee should be the main line average for maintenance of way charges, necessary depreciation, loss of ton on the high side and that the loss of branch tonnage should exceed those of the main line.

Many of the "losses" on the branches are really losses alleged to have been made on the main line. The formula is too uncertain and would lead to the guaranteeing Government expenditure, which exercise too much direct control over railway rates. "I would prefer to see competition based on a formula which would be worked out together with the Government and the railway authority, and which would vary with the rates of traffic for each ton hauled to the main line. That when fixing royalties, the burden placed upon the producing Government should not be unduly increased, as in the case of the Hammsud railway, is a general principle, and it is the chief difficulties in the railway management, to be most desirably for unprofitable branch lines.

Valuable Formula. The present formula is equally unhelpful when attempting to decide whether a branch should be closed.
