145 DIE IN RUSSIAN LANDSLIDE

A HUNDRED and forty-five people died and 145 were injured in a Kiev, Ukraine, landslide disaster here on March 13, it was announced in Moscow today.

A strike against the city after a strong wind had whipped up the water rushed down into the houses, a train and a bus were derailed, and a building of power over the city.

Damage to property totaled \$1,000,000.

Blame for the disaster was put on "mistake in design" by the city's chief engineers who had been working on the site since 1950.

A commission of inquiry reported that "those guilty of the disaster" should be brought to trial.

It is reported that more than 20 of the injured had already been hospitalized. All the wounded had not yet been released.

Insurance had been paid by the city.

By order of the Council of Ministers and the Council of People's Deputies, the Minister of Health and the Minister of Education and Science were instructed to prevent further accidents of this kind in the area.

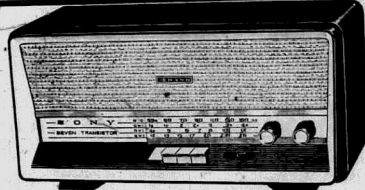

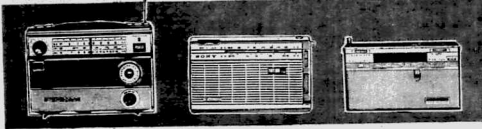

The most important member is the factory or office worker who, with thousands of his colleagues, streams away on foot, by bicycle, bus or car from Nairobi's industrial and commercial centres each evening to join his family in one of the housing estates which stretch the eastern part of the city.

Here, along the curving new roads and among the tall groups of gaily coloured flats, a fresh way of living for the African is taking root. It is a life characterised by the urban African's application to his work, his changing in outlook, his new contacts with the world, his new ideas, his new tastes, his new pleasures, his new ambitions.

In the tall blocks, however, the African workers are still more transitory in their habits, but here, too, the pattern is being altered. It is now a few days from now that Nairobi will have to accommodate its migrant workers.

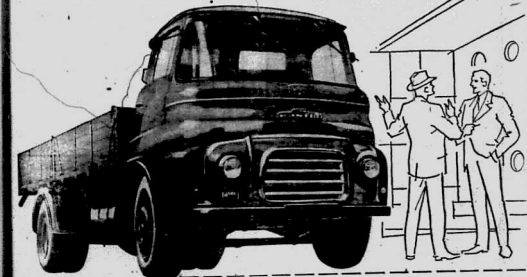


Mr. Joseph Mathia and his family who live in the Kenya Government African housing scheme at Nairobi. Nairobi Mr. Mathia works in the Commission.

Homes for 25,000

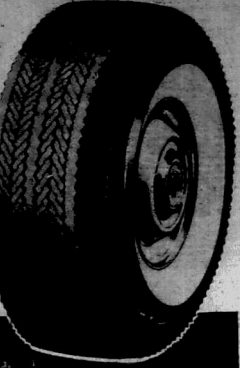

Drama and dust as cars set off on 3,000-mile route

THE ninth East African Safari began at 6 o'clock precisely on Thursday evening when the President of the R.E.A.A.A. dropped his yard-square starter's flag to send the first car on its way. This was a Renault Dauphine. Gordini entered by the 1st Battalion the King's Regiment at Muthaiga and driven by two of the regiment's sergeants.

The crowd of about 5,000 which watched the cars leave at three-minute intervals reserved a special cheer for the women and Service drivers. When they contrived to meet and start, 20 minutes late, they received a doubly enthusiastic cheer from the crowd. Their Mercedes building on Nairobi's Coronation Avenue, reported to the control in a flash and sped away into the night. They kept it up until on arrival at Ngare Nanyuki they were only one minute behind time.

Drama of a more serious kind followed when Car No. 79, a Fiat 2300 driven by E. R. Syder and K. Gilbert, hit a zebra about 16 miles out of Nairobi and still on tarmac. Syder, who was in the co-driver's seat studying route-maps, crashed his wheel. Gilbert decided the head through the wind-screen and had to be taken to hospital for a head wound to be stitched.

And, as yet, before the last car had left the tarmac, the hazards of the route had begun to take their toll.

A REPRIEVE

The last car away was another Fiat 2300, driven by Bill Fritschy and Vincent Manuville, which set off at 10.18 a.m. When they started it proved that this was the last of the cars that were to start on the first day. He captained the Monte Carlo Rally, with six participants at all, in three successive years, 1959, 1960 and 1961.

Added to Landon, for this support, on the Safari was an undoubtedly one of the best rallyists in the world but a bit of the cat and of the driver.

His driver, who had practice over the whole of the route, was only improved by the difficulties. The only criticism was of the quality of local maps.

"If there are any last-minute changes of plan, an overseas driver will not," they said.

In all international rallies the map must be good enough to give foreign competitors a fair indication of the route.

M. Landon did not follow the route as anticipated by other overseas team managers of going to the end of the route.

He explains that since the team had to spend four days

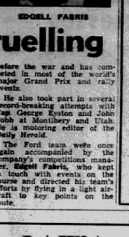

in a car together they had to be able to get on with one another.

"They have to be good friends long before the event," he said. "I spotted a driver and tell him to choose his own co-driver. The most experienced of the drivers M. Landon brought with him was **George Nicolas**, a prize promoter from Maranello.

He has an impressive list of domestic rally wins plus a place win in the Alpine Rally of 1960 at which he drove a Renault Gordini.

His co-driver, **Gerard Happing**, has an equally distinguished list as a co-driver having driven in the Monte Carlo Rally in 1958, the Corsica Rally and the Monte Carlo.

OLD AND NEW

In 1960, in the Corsica Rally he won his class and was third overall and in the same year fifth overall in the Monte Carlo.

By profession he is an architect, dealer with shops at the Riviera.

He explains that he came

to mix antiquies and rally driving when he became friendly with Jean Clusset, a rally and racing driver of international repute.

He then found himself acting as co-driver to Clusset and his rally career began.

SECOND TIME

Burgess, who drove a Zephyr, is one of Britain's foremost rally drivers. He won the 1959 R.A.C. Rally outright and was a member of the winning Ford team in the 1959 Talp Rally.

Sutcliffe is a prominent competitor in international rallies and drove with Ford works teams in the 1960 Talp Rally and the 1961 Monte Carlo.

KEEPS IN TOUCH

Two of the team were lacking their second Safari. **Jeff Urwin**, who drove an Anglia, and **Tommy Wisdom**, who drove a Zephyr.

Urwin was second in his class and 21st overall in 1960. He is well known in Britain for his track performance in saloon car racing with a Zephyr and was the 1958 saloon car champion. He was recently appointed chairman of the British Saloon Car Drivers' Association.

Tommy Wisdom, who lives at Cranford, Sussex, is known chiefly as a motor sports enthusiast. He made a great name for himself driving at Brooklands

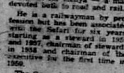

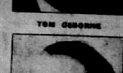

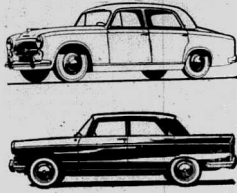

Kanu sending delegation to Governor

The Independent Group, which claims the support of 12 Members, yesterday unanimously agreed that the Governor, Sir Patrick Renshaw, and the two main African parties, Kanu and Kadu, should be asked to take active steps to form a Government.

This was one of the moves in a day of considerable political activity which gave hope that a Government under the Lancaster House Constitution might be formed.

Several other Kadu Members supported the appeal by Mr. F. Twiss that their party should oppose the formation of a Government. None of the Kadu leaders questioned opposite this view.

After Thursday's advice from the Governor, Mr. H. Stanbury, the Kadu Members held a meeting lasting more than two hours. They emerged with a resolution that they will see Sir Patrick Renshaw on Monday and nothing more than that.

But Mr. C. W. Njenga, a prominent Kadu Member, said that he would be writing his own letter to the Governor. This is the general view of the Kadu Members, who want to know why the Governor has insisted that Kadu should provide the Africans with a Government.

After a private meeting with the Governor, the Kadu Members said they would be prepared to form a Government with the Government which contained a majority of African Members.

Not practical
If a majority of the Africans desire to cooperate we shall be prepared to do so, but it is not possible to do so in a coalition with the Government, which has a majority of white Members, said Sir Patrick Renshaw.

Obvious advantage

The various proposals put forward by the Government and the Opposition were discussed in detail by the Cabinet.
