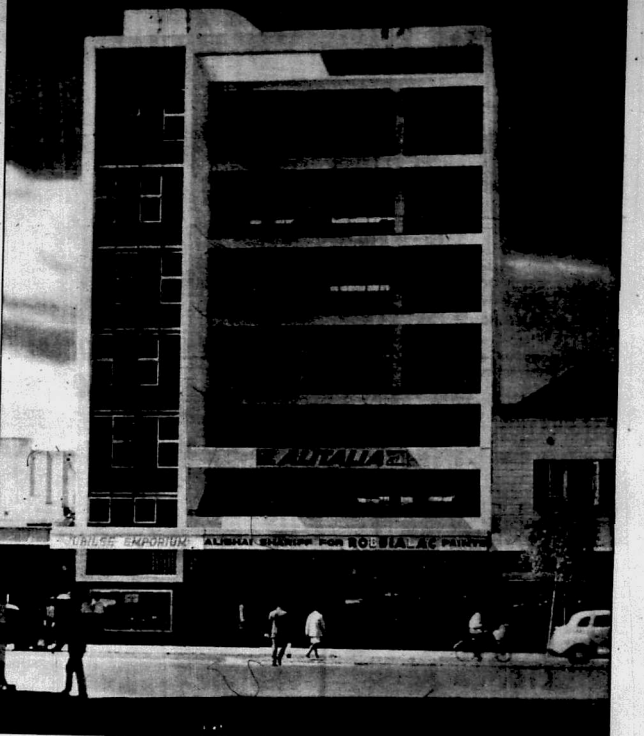

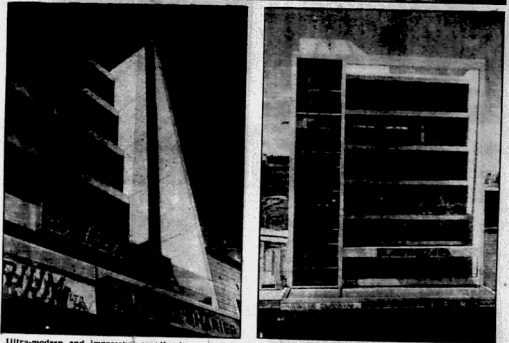

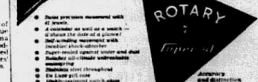

# £150,000 BANK OF BARODA BRANCH OPENS

THE new £150,000 Bank of Baroda building in the main street of Kampala, which is the tallest commercial building in the Protectorate, was formally opened yesterday by the Uganda Minister of Finance, as believed here and nine stores at the top. It is certainly one of the most attractive buildings in the Uganda capital.

The terrazzo and marble of the exterior paneling and the white marble covering the sides of the main entrance, interspersed with ceramic panels add up to an air of distinction and dignity.

One of the distinctive features of the building, which was completed within a year and a half, is the pillar in the centre which appears to be the main support for the ceiling.

Another thing two feet wide with a 20ft. diameter is suspended about nine inches below the ceiling to hold concealed lights. The openings are finished in glass, terrazzo, with the top one covered with smooth white terrazzo.

The acoustic ceiling of pale blue is made of a special material that would stretch a distance of 100ft. if laid out in a line.

On a normally sunny day sufficient natural light provides the three sets of windows - walls in fluorescent lights - provide the rest of the illumination.

Partitions, which are the ceiling, provide additional illumination from the central columns.

Speaking terrazzo has been used for the first half of the floor from the doorway, the rest of the floor is varnished teak and patterned tiles elsewhere.

Timber on either side of the main entrance is the work of Kampala local carpenters.
