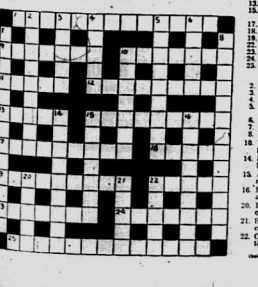

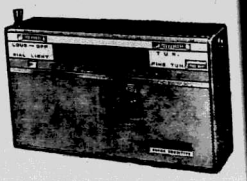

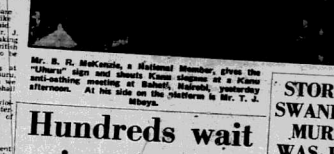

30 expect to pull out of Kinangop under board plan

Mr. Lipson repeatedly emphasized that the farmers had a choice of selling their land to the Board. "You are not forced to accept our proposals," he said.

But Maj. Hughes did not think he had much of a choice, and it is not a pleasant thought.

Mr. Lipson explained that settlement schemes were already in operation for the Kamba, the Luo, and other tribes in the Coast Province.

The one now planned was for the Kikuyu.

An acre amount of the land in the area had been offered to the Board, and it was now up to the farmers to decide whether to sell or not.

The South Kinangop block, which was the largest, had been bought in the whole of the settlement scheme.

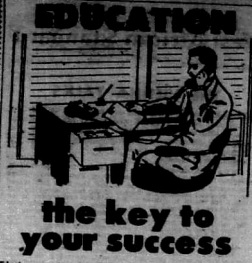



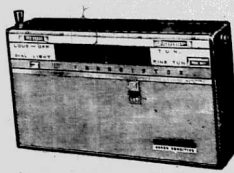

It described these as a denial of social justice, African freedom and democracy and authorized the Government to make as a positive indication of the strong feelings of this House, a gift of £1,000 for the relief of distress in Angola.

There was further applause from both sides of the House when Mr. Ngala said his amendment would convey the grave concern of the House and people of Kenya on this matter to the British Government.

Freedom of expression

After the Government agreed to accept an amendment, proposed by Mr. P. G. 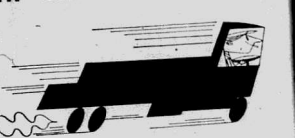

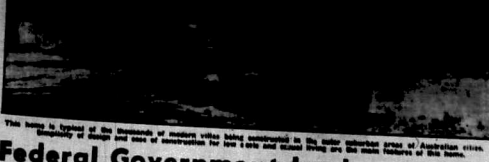

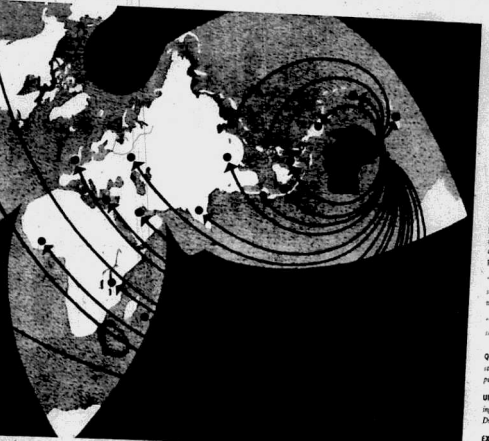
