"V-2"

With the flying-bomb yielding

the "V-2" the Government

asked the public to keep faith with their obsession

and continue to share the

course of the war. The psycho-

logists seem to suggest fear and

inferiority complex rather than

defeat in us fair fight. And so

we do know quite well that

we are not the only ones to

rely more and more on our public morale, as it has dropped

so much in recent months. The

sense, by promising devastating

results from the next "V-2" rocket

which would take us one step

further into victory for the master-

of all.

But however pathetic the

psychology, we must not under-

estimate the challenge of the "V-2".

It is a challenge which is

worthier of the evil genii

of Nazism, and a worthy oppo-

site to the Teutonic hordes

with hatred. It travels at fast

speed, and reaches heights

of 100,000 feet at the

leaving its own sound behind

and the carrying of smoke.

It is a power which is

modestly passing starvation at the

hands of the British and American

armies, but which is

fully parried by our side.
