CLERK'S FAILURE.

No Excuse, Says Official Receiver.

(George Vladimir Bentley, clerk Nairobi, came before Mr. Acting Justice C. A. O. Latta presiding over the Bankruptcy Court, Nairobi, on Friday, for his public examination. His liabilities amounted to K£25,100 while his assets were nil.

Training of African Artisans in Kenya.

INCREASED EFFORT URGED IN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

Progress Already Achieved.

NEED FOR RAISING THE STANDARD OF NATIVE LIFE.

The subject of the training of African artisans in Kenya was debated in Legislative Council on Thursday when a motion was unanimously adopted urging upon Government the importance of promoting the utilization of the African as the skilled artisan.

T. J. O'Shea in moving the motion acknowledged that a great deal had already been done by Government in this connection, but the time had arrived when greater efforts were needed.

He expressed the opinion that the extent to which the native standard of living could be raised, based on his capabilities as a peasant, artisan was very limited. There must be a policy under which he could be developed in other directions as a useful citizen.

Mr. Burns, the member for African interests heartily supported the motion, but added that one of the difficulties at present was to find work for the African after he had been trained.

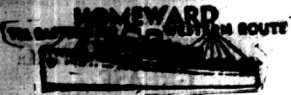
