SUPPLIES of murram for road maintenance in Kenya are becoming increasingly difficult, with the steady reduction of easily accessible deposits.

Several million tons of murram are required annually to keep the major highways of the country in serviceable condition.

In many instances no major highways outside Nairobi and its immediate surroundings are marked with the necessary signs for the transport of murram.

This necessitates a search for new deposits, sometimes spread over large areas which brings a consequent increase in transport cost.
