## THREE PLEDGES FOR PREMIER

### Ministers get warm Nyanza welcome

Kenya's Prime Minister, Mr. Kenyatta, extracted three promises from thousands of people during his 60th-anniversary tour of Nyanza over the weekend. Mr. Kenyatta and the Ministerial party accompanying him received an enthusiastic welcome throughout the tour.

In one of his speeches the Premier called for an end to crime and for the people to pay their taxes and rates. At a rally at Kisumu thousands of people went up when Mr. Kenyatta asked his audience to make a promise to give these promises.

He arrived at Kisumu on Saturday evening and what was described as an unprecedented scene. The Prime Minister was followed into the town by a two-mile-long procession of vehicles with horns blaring. People had been crowding into Kisumu since early morning, some from as far afield as Tanganyika and Uganda. Many joined in traditional dances in the streets.

On Saturday thousands of Kisumu tribesmen pledged their support to Mr. Kenyatta in stopping the wave of cattle thefts which are a major problem in the area. Congratulating him, the Premier asked at a rally in the Kenyatta Hotel, "I want a sign from your own hands that you are going to cooperate with the African Government in erasing out murderers and thieves."

#### Warning on services

"I have heard so many complaints from European, Asian and African farmers of people stealing their livestock that I want you to sign a pledge to help me to destroy this business of stealing of it will be a curse on us."

The crowd gave Mr. Kenyatta the kiss he asked for, and also pledged that they would pay their taxes. He warned that continued non-payment of rates might result in the suspension of many essential services, including electricity, cinema, amusements, hospitals.

The bill to be abolished in Kenya: the Minister for Justice Constitutional Affairs, Mr. Mboya, told the House of Representatives yesterday.

Referring to Kenyanisation in his Ministry, Mr. Mboya said it was impossible to proceed at it as fast as some members of the House wanted. It was first and foremost committed to apply the principle of fairness and efficiency.

It was not what we can do, but what we should do. We are sure that as we progress towards the stage of a more advanced country, the process of Kenyanisation will be carried out by means of the Government's machinery rather than by force. We would like to localise the functions of the Government as far as possible. We cannot afford to have our functions carried out by non-Kenyans who are untrained or unprepared to take the responsibilities of the Government.

They urged that the matter should be officially investigated.

The three unions, with the support of the Kenya African Customs Workers' Union, issued a statement in which they said that further arrangements should be made to replace those African officers who were leaving the service "because we feel we can no longer trust non-Africans in these posts."

They are to seek a meeting with the Director General of E.A.C.O. and the British Government to discuss the matter and to replace the non-African staff with African staff.

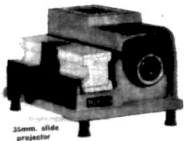
