

FOR AFRICAN UNITY Officers want to withdraw notices

A GRANT of about £25,000 is to be made to the Strathmore College of Arts and Sciences, Nairobi, by the F.C.S. This was announced last night in New York. This grant is to be devoted to the award of two-year scholarships at the college during each of the next three years and to conduct their term education.

Other grants announced by the foundation include one of about £25,000 to the African-American Institute for an educational project in Tanganyika for refugee students from Mozambique.

The grant will assist in the selection and placement of students in universities in and outside Africa and provide facilities in Dar es Salaam to enable selected students to complete their secondary school education.

A grant of about \$200,000 will be made to the British Friends of Africa, F.O.A., to assist in the training and education of African students in the United States. The grant will be used for the salaries of teachers and for the maintenance of the United States committee of the African-American Institute which is collaborating with the trustees of the foundation in providing students of under-developed countries with educational possibilities in government, industry and commerce.

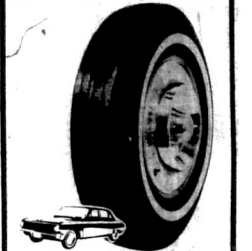

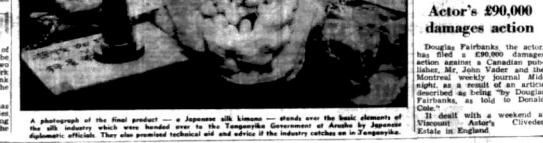

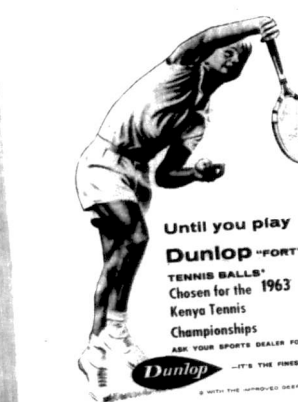

Mr. Ngala stands out for full autonomy

Standard Staff Reporter, Mombasa.

The Minister for Home Affairs, Mr. Odinga, and the Minister for the Coast Regional Assembly, Mr. Ngala, during their visit to East Africa, had a very useful relationship with the Kenya Government and the Coast Regional Government.

Mr. Ngala, who was in Nairobi, Mr. Ngala said yesterday, they had been "very useful" and had done a lot to clear confusion.

Mr. Odinga, during his visit to East Africa, had been very useful in the people to respect the problem of regional assemblies but warned against abuse of power by regional leaders. His call for respect was welcomed later both by Mr. Ngala and by the Kadu executive officer, Mr. D. Lemono.

Addressing a Kumu rally at Mombasa, Mr. Odinga said people with ideas of autonomy for certain regions should forget them and devote their efforts to building a new nation where everybody could enjoy the long-fought-for freedom.

When Mr. Ngala spoke to a Kadu meeting at Kileleshwa yesterday, however, he said his only concern was seeking complete Coast autonomy and called on Coast people to form one strong political party to fight for this. The meeting expressed support for demands for autonomy for both the Coast and the Rift Valley to be made at the London constitutional conference.

No flouting of law

Mr. Odinga told his rally that regional leaders who abused their position could be dealt with firmly. It was the intention of the new African Government to send people to detention camps. This did not mean, however, that people could flout the law.

The militant attitude adopted by some politicians in flouting themselves (Mr. Odinga) during colonial days must be abandoned.

It was stated that the Government and the Opposition to the status of national regions.

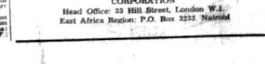

Great in Africa says Cardinal

There was not a threat in Africa, Cardinal Laurent Rugambwa and Bishop of Bukhara, told the Roman newspaper "Il Tempo" in an interview in the Vatican City.

During the interview, he was asked whether he would do it were Pope. He replied: "If I were Pope, I would tell you." The Cardinal took part in the Vatican conclave in June which elected Pope Paul VI.

In a reference to Communism and Africa, the Cardinal said: "There exists a world-wide situation outside of Africa in which the Catholic Church and Communism must study their respective positions. The Communists speak of peace but manufacture arms; speak of the progress of mankind, but the common man is not any better off in Russia than elsewhere. The Russians proclaim themselves the champions of better living conditions for the poor, but in their country the condition of the humble people is sad."

"How can people believe in the Communist, after the results of their programmes and their promises?" he added. "I have never met, in Africa, anyone who claimed to be Communist."

However, Africa was immense, and as conditions varied from region to region it would be presumptuous to claim to know them all.

Cardinal Rugambwa added that the Catholic Church was advancing in Tanganyika, and that Africans consider Catholicism as their religion.

"They do not reject the rights of Islam and colonialism," he said.

The Cardinal was referring to the 4th annual meeting of the World Council of Churches which was held in Nairobi (Africa) last month and which was presided over by the Archbishop of Canterbury.

MALAYS Dr. Sukarno

MALAYA is to ask Britain to give the people of North Borneo and Sarawak the right to elect their own representatives to join the Federal Parliament, according to a statement by the Indonesian minister in London.

President Sukarno spoke out strongly against the "buffer state" theory and said, "I am not destroyed by the 'great army' of the United States and the Soviet Union — the United Nations of Asia, Africa, Latin America and the 'Socialist' countries."

His speech gave no indication that Indonesia would change its attitude on this matter, but it was pointed out by President Sukarno as "re-orientation" to the "great army of the United Nations" — which is due to the realization that the end of the struggle is being felt at the end of the day.

APPEAL FOR ENTENTE WITH CHINA

Back from the dead after eight months in snows

AN Indian soldier has reached his village home after surviving eight months alone in the barren heights of Ladakh since his post was overrun by Chinese troops, last autumn.

Lt. Col. Peter Kallinger, 41, was separated from his unit when the Chinese overran the post. He says that he and his men found the half-frozen Chinese River to reach his command post — but found it abandoned.

He cut his boots from his feet before he and found he could no longer walk. He was rescued in the early 1960s, but was abandoned there.

Trapped birds Kallinger spent the bitter winter in the post, getting his food by trapping birds and rabbit. He made his home in a damaged bunker, not knowing what had happened after the Chinese attack, and sustained himself by trapping birds and rabbit.

Early in July he heard foot-steps and hearing the Chinese soldiers were about to be beaten. He hid himself in a hole and saw the Chinese soldiers as they passed.

Development Bank, which will come into being in January, is the most concrete step in inaugurating the African development services and benefits. Kenya's Minister for Commerce and Industry, Dr. C. K. Nyamwaya, said yesterday.

Kenya is to contribute about £2,500,000 and the Bank will have £75,000,000 but the total authorized capital is £25,000,000, if States contribute more capital at their own wish.

NEW CAPITAL SOURCES

Dr. Kiyo said that the Bank's main purpose was to provide additional sources of capital for development. But the Bank would not cancel or replace existing sources of capital such as the World Bank, the United Nations Special Fund or other international sources like the Agency for International Development of the United States.

The Bank wants to add to these and in addition to contributions from members it would also raise additional money for African development through loans and grants from non-African countries.

The Bank would be an economic development bank and would not be a financial institution. It would not deal with commercial banks and would not be a central bank. It would not be a government-owned institution and would not be a public utility. It would be a private institution and would be controlled by its members.

Dr. Kiyo said that the Bank would be a model for other African States to follow and would be a source of inspiration and encouragement for them.
