The demonstration — which was not supported by the Communist Party — took the form of a motion of no confidence in the Government introduced in Parliament on Tuesday, the first in 16 years of the Congress Party's rule.

Meanwhile, 7,000 supporters of the ruling Congress Party demonstrated at another gate, shouting slogans and waving Indian national flags.

Mr. Nehru, who closed the iron gates and stood on guard with metal-rimmed wooden sticks.

KENYA may be banned from the next Olympic Games because of the Government's refusal to allow South African delegates to the conference due to be held in Nairobi in October, the President of the International Olympic Committee, Sir Avery Brundage, said yesterday.

Speaking in Moscow, Mr. Brundage criticised Kenya, South Africa and Indonesia for introducing political issues into sport. Kenya's attitude meant that the I.O.C. conference would have to be switched from Zurich to Switzerland. But just night the Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office, Mr. Mwarahi, said that he and the Minister for Justice, Mr. Mbiya, would see the Prime Minister today in a "last-minute attempt" to surmount the difficulties.

Mr. Mwarahi said he thought it would help if the South African delegation brought African observers to the conference. He would show that there was no discrimination in sport only bringing a mixed delegation.

Mr. Brundage said in Johannesburg that the I.O.C. intended to ban the government and all countries not to discriminate against sportsmen of other countries and to allow visas to them without hindrance.

The right to organize the Olympic Games would be given to those countries whose governments offered firm guarantees of free entry to all sportsmen.

Indonesia, which had temporarily denied recognition, would require the I.O.C. to apologise for discriminatory actions and to guarantee observance of the Olympic Charter.

The Chairman of the International Olympic Committee, Sir Avery Brundage, said in Zurich on Saturday that the conference would probably be moved to Lausanne. Five of the seven members of the executive committee had spoken in favour of Lausanne.

Mr. F. D. Johnson, former member of Lausanne, said that the Kenya Government would not allow South African or Portuguese delegates to enter Kenya because of the way they would be to submit to them.

Guinea call to pay debts before the Budget

Parliamentary Select Committee has ordered a nation-wide meeting of debts to clear the national books for Guinea's 1967 advance Budget.

At a recent economic conference at Mamou, in central Guinea, political leaders and regional governors decided that the country's financial year should begin on October 1 instead of January.

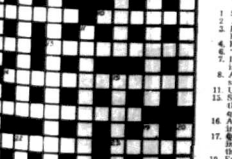

South Africa row causes change of venue

The International Olympic Committee in Lausanne, Switzerland, announced yesterday that its 60th session will not be held, as scheduled, in Johannesburg.

The President of the I.O.C., Mr. Avery Brundage, telephoned the member representative in Africa, Mr. H. S. Alexander, to inform him that the Kenya Government's refusal to grant visas to South African delegates would have to be moved.

The Government's attitude estranged the first principle of the Olympic Charter that "no discrimination on grounds of religion or political affiliation" should be observed.

Mr. Brundage said that the very great regret by the Government retreating its refusal was a great value.

No bowing to threats

The statement said: "The Kenya Government has made its position very clear in regard to the South African delegation attending the I.O.C. meeting in Nairobi. The reason for the refusal to allow representatives from South Africa is because of the discriminatory way in which the delegation is constituted."

The Kenya Government is not prepared to succumb to threats by the International Olympic Committee and would wish to make it clear that, should the I.O.C. attempt to force Kenya from the next Olympic Games, the Kenya Government will have to opt alternative but to approach all five African countries to boycott the Olympic Games.

The Government's action in this matter is dictated purely by the decision taken at the Addis Ababa conference of the African States.

On Sunday it was reported that Mr. Brundage had said to the I.O.C. that he would not be attending the meeting in Nairobi because of his attitude to the South African delegation.

Yesterday Mr. Brundage admitted that he had made this statement.

Sudan inquiry

Nairobi Q.C.

Allegations of violation of human rights in the Sudan led the International Commission of Enquiry in Geneva, has appointed a Nairobi advocate, Mr. Robert Q.C. as its observer to conduct an on-site investigation.

Mr. Q.C. is believed to be the only African to have been appointed to this post.

The International Commission of Enquiry was set up by the United Nations General Assembly in 1961 to investigate the situation in the Sudan.

The Technical Director of the House of Manji, Mr. Madatally Manji, who besides his research activities is responsible for the day-to-day working of the factory's production department, holds a London University degree in engineering and worked with the Royal Ordnance and the Royal Air Force before coming to East Africa. It is his proud claim that the factory can make any type of biscuits for any type of market. How biscuits are made

ALTHOUGH always in the kitchen for new machinery, the House of Manji has for months in the way of up-to-date equipment at its Baring factory.

As the mixer enters the base of the building through automatic machinery, flour is opened at the top of the hopper, it is measured by the automatic and deposited in the factory which covers 23,000 square feet.

In the baking room the first two new mixing machines in which several hundred shafts run the flour is mixed in dough. Each machine mixes half-ton of dough in about 20 minutes and the dough is then passed over to the break rollers which are fed in a continuous and fed into 37 rollers. These are fed in turn into the rolling and embossing machine, which presses the dough in the required biscuit thickness and size and the shapes at the rate of 100 a minute.

After a final rolling on the conveyor belt the dough is then

fed through the 1300-litre baking oven from which the biscuits emerge a few minutes later, baked and ready for packing.

While this is going on, other production-line machinery is putting layers of cream between biscuits or giving them a chocolate coating. In another part of the factory a steady flow of vertical strands pour from a mixing plant and is cut into sections before being placed in drying compartments for the next 12 hours.

Meanwhile the ever-moving production belt carries the newly baked biscuits along to the next section, where the two hands of the women packers are ready to transfer them into tins and cartons for the next 12 hours.

lery hands weigh and fashion the cartons before they are passed to the next process, where men take over the task of wrapping them in cellophane foil and cellophane. The finished cartons are then packed in boxes and are ready to be shipped to their various export markets.

The cartons then go into the ever-moving production-line for delivery throughout East Africa and to the several export markets.

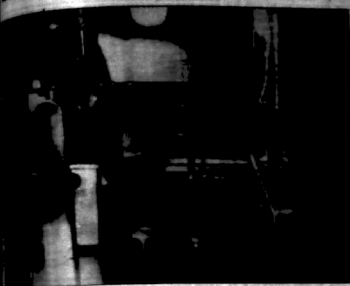
In the shipping department the stock is never allowed to fall below the 12000 cartons which are kept as a reserve in case of emergency, but each day fully laden lorries set off from the factory to repack the stocks in the company's depot in Tanganyika and Uganda as well as Kenya.

Through East Africa the company's sales representative and agencies have reported that orders for Baring biscuits are on the increase and it is expected that the House of Manji's expansion programme will be carried out in the near future.

Now the senior factory operator at the Baring works, Samuel is both production supervisor and machine-tender. It is his responsibility to see that the dough is fed properly into the baking machines, that the biscuits are properly baked and that the packed weights are correct.

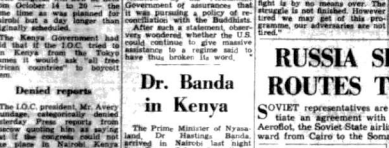
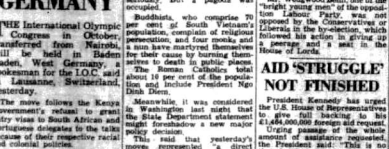

CONFIDENCE in the future, in improving the economy and a sense of purpose shared by all classes, are the outstanding features of Kenya today, the Prime Minister's brother, Mr. James Muigai, told Westminster, London, Saturday.

Mr. Muigai, who is attending the World Bank conference in London, said that ten years ago Kenya was a country despised by prejudice, hatred and bloodshed.

Mr. Muigai did not provide the right answer, and by 1958 there was poverty, unemployment, despair and deep disillusionment.

"But in the last two or three years the country has seen many changes," he added. "There has been a sense of purpose and a sense of direction."

The country was well on the way to independence without a bloodbath that many feared and many Europeans had decided to stay to help build the new Kenya.

Basic need Mr. Muigai repeated the substance of Mr. Kenyatta's speech to European farmers in Nairobi last week as an example of the Prime Minister's statesmanship.

"He knows at the end of the day that the character of the nation is in every citizen," he said. "We have vast resources in the soil, in the labour, in the education, in the people."
