Migration changes could halt farm plans

General changes in Tanganyika's Immigration Ordinance would result in a powerful influx of insecurity and unrest among the peasants and also bring about a halt to the country's development according to the Tanganyika Association of Agricultural Employers in its memorandum.

The association has prepared a memorandum on the proposals. Copies were sent to the Press, to 20 members, consultants or high committees, to various agricultural associations' representatives and four chambers of commerce.

A letter written by the executive secretary of the association, Mr. A. E. Elton, says that the matter is of vital importance to all who are not Tanganyika citizens. The memorandum would bring about considerable loss to Tanganyika's economy and development.

INSECURITY AND ILL-EASE

The association represents more than 186 farmers and several million pounds worth of agricultural investment in Tanganyika. Its executive committee members have taken steps to amend measures as "creating an atmosphere of lack of confidence, insecurity and ill-ease among many members of the community and potential investors who are thinking of bringing outside capital into the territory."

In the memorandum it is stated that the amending Bill limits permits to two types. The first is a Class A permit, the holder of which would not need to provide security or bond.

A bill would be valid for two years unless cancelled by the Principal Immigration Officer. The duration of a Class B permit, the discretion of the immigration officer, is left to the discretion of the immigration officer.

**Letter from the President of the R.I.B.A.,
Sir Robert H. Matthew**

WHEN I was asked to contribute a message on the Jubilee of the East Africa Institute of Architects, I had just spent a week in London at a conference of architects from 21 Commonwealth territories, including East Africa, which decided to form a Commonwealth Association of Architects.

Only a fortnight before, I had been to a conference in the Argon with a number of economists, sociologists, geographers, biologists, town planners and architects, at which we had discussed the acute world crisis of urban settle-

ment, particularly in the developing countries where massive numbers of people are flocking into towns whose growth is virtually unmanaged and uncontrolled.

These two conferences were not unconnected. The decision to form a Commonwealth Association of Architects, on the basis of complete equality between the architectural societies represented and without discrimination of province or politics, inspired by the fact that architects have an essential and unique contribution to make in the solution of the problems of the developing countries where new and independent nations have emerged.

The number of architects in these countries is far too small for the immediate town planning and building tasks to be done by the developing countries do not lack for good planning and well trained architects, but they will require the assistance which Great Britain and in most

industrial countries have for more than 150 years blighted the towns and cities built in the first Industrial Revolution.

The Jubilee of the East Africa Institute of Architects seems to me, therefore, not only an occasion to celebrate the achievements of the past 50 years, during which the professional profession has been established there, but to look forward to another 50 years of even more vigorous growth under new conditions and new leadership, in which the architect will be more essential than he has ever been.

Education need

We at the Royal Institute of British Architects have always valued the association with the East Africa Institute of Architects. In the future we hope that East African architects will also develop links with the Institution of Architects in Africa and the newly formed Commonwealth Africa Society, amongst which have been kindred aims being fulfilled rapidly.

It is a matter of common knowledge that there is a real need to increase the number of architects trained in Africa and East Africa. Architects being trained in the United Kingdom or other industrial countries are essential to the development of the new nations.

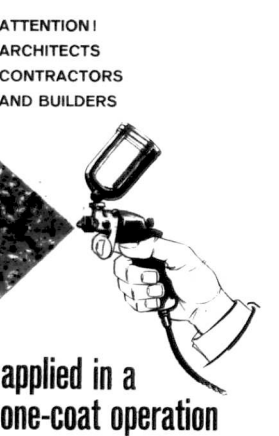

Robin Hood comes in railway salaries urged

PRODUCTION of salaries of the top in order to raise them to the level of the main recommendations of the report of the African Railways and Harbours Commission of 1962, it was suggested in the Central Legislative Assembly.

The chairman of the Ministerial Communications Committee, Mr. Kenneth G. Selata, tabling the report's proposals said, "The higher levels were fairly substantial and the economies to be achieved were, therefore, considerable."

The ultimate overall effect of the proposals, he said, would be to increase the annual saving to £200,000. In the next year, £250,000 of which would be at the lowest paid staff and £25,000 to the next lowest paid.

MOORE SOCIALLY DEFENSIBLE

This was an increase of £105,000 a year more than the commission recommended, but to that extent the estimated savings might be correspondingly reduced. However, the overall financial picture would still be very favourable and the new salary structure should, in every way, be more rational and socially defensible within the African economy.

Mr. Selata commended the report for the acceptance by the House with the reservations which had been made. "We particularly commended the salary structure proposed by the commission as being a much healthier one for industry on the one hand and in the services of the Government on the other."

"Much as one would like to legislate for a greater increase in the minimum wage, it is more realistic to increase the minimum by more at the present time, while allowing wages in one sector of the economy to get out of line with those in other sectors."

Speaking on passenger traffic, Mr. Selata said that the present estimate of 1963 was 1.5 million passengers, but that it was generally less probable that such a large percentage of the population would be able to afford to travel by rail.

As a result of a British Government ruling, service attaches in certain foreign countries will in future be restricted to married men.
