THE MOUNTAIN CLIMBING MOMENT FOR UHURU NIGHT National Fund sets £300,000 target for independence

Flag will fly on Mount Kenya

ONE of the most exciting and important events during Kenya's Independence Celebrations will be an attempt on the Mt. Kenya flag by a party of climbers from the Mount Kenya Club.

One of them, Mr. Kiriū Murray, will raise the Kenyan flag on the mountain at midnight on the night of December 11-12. This will be at the same moment as the new Kenya flag is being raised at the National Stadium, 100 miles to the south. The normal procedure is that the mountain does not get lit until January and it is believed that the mountain has never before been climbed earlier than December 17. The Everest climber Mr. Eric Shipton climbed the mountain on this date in 1929.

Climbing conditions on the summit will probably be difficult, with much more snow and ice than during the normal climbing season and with a possible danger of avalanches. It is hoped to put between four and six climbers on the peak of the mountain on the night of December 11-12.

To improve the chances of success, the party will train thoroughly for the expedition, which will recommence the climb and fix ropes well in advance, weather permitting. The climbers are Mr. Murray, Mr. Barry Cliff, an Agricultural Department research officer; Mr. Donald Bullock, a mathematics lecturer at the Royal College; Mr. Peter Campbell, a civil engineering lecturer at the Technical College and the president of the Mountain Club of Kenya; Mr. Robert Chambers, who is a lecturer at the Kenya Institute of Administration.

Two routes

It is expected that a number of groups of Mountain Club members will accompany the party in support. It is also hoped that the expedition will carry food and equipment. At the moment, the party is considering two alternative routes. One is the classic climb by the East African Government which may, however, be covered in snow at this time. The other possibility is up the south face of the mountain, the Diamond Furline. The climber Mount Kenya from the first time with Mr. Howard and the then British Ambassador to Addis Ababa, Mr. G. W. F. Furlong.

During this year's visit to the Bournemouth, again with the Mountain Club of Kenya, Mr. Murray climbed the peaks of Mount Kenya with Mr. Baker, Westerman and Margherita.

ROYAL COLLEGE TO END TERM EARLY TO HOUSE GUESTS

THE Royal College, Nairobi, will take a prominent part in Kenya's independence celebrations in December and the new term beginning today will end early so that the halls of residence can be used to accommodate some of the guests who will flock to the country, it was stated yesterday.

The college is particularly grateful for the offers of Uhuru gifts which it has received, and has accepted an expression of faith in the future of East Africa, a statement said.

It was pointed out that the activities of the college continue to grow and financial help from overseas (mostly capital) last year nearly equaled the contribution of some £300,000 made by the East African Government.

The number of students was expected to increase to approximately 150 boys and 75 women. The students will come from Burundi, Uganda, Mauritania, and as far afield as Nigeria and the United States. In the field of recruiting African as its expansion staff the college had made tremendous progress. It is announced that the staff would be an academic staff. Similar progress had been made in the field of administration and the library. The Federal German Government and the French Government had helped to meet the salaries of certain lecturers on the college staff.

The Rockefeller and Ford Foundations had provided staff for economic, chemistry, physics and biology. The British Department of Technical Co-operation was also nominating staff for the veterinary department. In the faculty of engineering (mostly) providing equipment and the service of six lecturers, the first of whom arrived recently from Hialeah Technological College, also arranged for the college to share with the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation.





SENATE OVER LAND BILL

All Opposition Members except one walked out of the Senate yesterday after the Government gave the Agricultural Amendment Bill, 1942, its second reading.

The walk-out followed a stormy debate which ended at 11. Immediately after the announcement of Government's intention to give the Bill its second reading, the Opposition walked out, leaving only one member sitting in the Chamber.

The Bill gives the Minister for Agriculture power to acquire land for the production of particular crops after consulting the Central Agricultural Board and being satisfied that the land is suitable to be used within acquired.

The Minister is to acquire land in areas which are peculiarly suitable for the production of a particular crop, either by agreement with the landowner or by ensuring that the land is used for the growth of the crop in question.

Loans urged
The Leader of Government Business, Sir Mervyn (Keanu) Preece, said he would propose amendments to the Bill. He stated that the Minister would acquire land only after being satisfied that the owner would give responsible title to plant an adequate crop, and that he had not done so.

The amendment by the Government would end the fear by the Opposition that the Government would take over their lands.

£30,000 MORE RELIEF AID FOR E. AFRICA

Grants totalling more than £30,000 have been made to East Africa recently under the Freedom From Hunger campaign, it was announced in London by the Oxford Committee for Famine Relief. The committee said that since the last grants meeting in July three grants had been made to Kenya.

One of £2,000 was to extend an irrigation scheme started by the Kenya Government in an area where 200 families were to be settled.

Another of £12,000 was part of the cost of providing water for the settlement. The buildings at the Kipkoyan settlement where 100 families of F.A.O. and Chinese were housed had a new dairy diploma course. A grant of £2,000 would help subsidize farmers' salaries.

Another grant of £2,000 would be used to purchase and distribute maize seed with high yields and good resistance to disease. Meanwhile a grant of £4,000 to Zanibar will finance a scheme to subsidize the cost of fertilizers to encourage farmers to use them.

Kenya in London to seek changes

Only two days to go before the start of the third and last Kenya constitutional conference to be held in London, the Kenya Government has made it clear that it considers the present Constitution unworkable unless specific changes are made.

At Press conferences before his departure from Nairobi and on his arrival in London, the Prime Minister, Mr. Kenyatta, spoke of the need for amendments and adjustments to a Constitution which he described as "conceived in an atmosphere of the tension and fear".

The Government, he said, had hoped that the Government had failed to implement the Constitution and called on Britain to implement it immediately in the interests of peace, prosperity and stability.

He said that Mr. Kenyatta had promised him a timetable before going to London or a simultaneous one. Mr. Kenyatta, however, stressed during the conference that constitutional revision was a popular mandate for constitutional revision.

He said the British Government should recognize the majority in the House of Representatives. Questions into details of the present Government would remain.

Based on confidence, he said, wanted a Constitution based on confidence, and on fear and he hoped that the fears and anxieties felt by so many communities.

Referring to the North-Eastern Region, Mr. Kenyatta belonged — with the Kenya Government was not in a position to discuss in London. There was "no question of rebellion" as members had and there had been a change of mind among the Somalis.

Mr. Kenyatta sends eve-of-conference message THE STRIDE TO UHURU Insistence on change in regional powers

By ARNOLD RAPHAEL LONDON.
KENYA'S final constitutional conference, which will lead to independence after 68 years of British rule, is due to open at Lancaster House, London, this morning, with the Colonial Secretary, Mr. Sandys, in the chair. The Governor of Kenya, Mr. MacDonald, is attending and the Kenya Government delegation of 12 is led by the Prime Minister, Kenyatta. The Leader of the Opposition and Kudu President, Mr. Mwangi, leads a delegation of six and there are also three representatives from the European community.

In a special eve-of-conference message to the East African Standard, Kenyatta said: "We are taking the last stride in the march to independence and my party are determined to make it the final step to a greater era. We ask the people of Kenya to await the outcome of the negotiations in London in patience and in the steadfast belief in the rightness of our policies, guided by the spirit of calmness and tolerance."

The policies the Prime Minister intends to follow before the conference clear last night. He is insisting on significant but not radical changes in the Malindi Commission of Enquiry, these would circumscribe the powers of the region.

Apart from demanding one House to be elected by the public service, Kenya Government wants to weaken Schedule Four, which defines the powers of the regions and which, in government's view, nullifies and restricts its own powers under Section 63.

On the controversial Paragraph 19 (which at present demands majorities of 75 and 90 per cent in both Houses to make constitutional changes, ordinary provisions in the Constitution could be amended by 60 per cent of both Houses sitting together.





CONFERENCE Troops 'ready for combat' in Borneo

Two companies of Indonesian Air Force "Shock" troops have been sent to West Kalimantan (Indonesian Borneo) to build and improve air strips in areas close to the Sarawak border, the Government-controlled Antara news agency reported yesterday.

Quoting the Air Force information office, it said the improvements to the airstrips would enable combat and civil planes to land on strips which could take only light aircraft at present. The spokesman said the air force was "in a state of combat readiness" and only awaiting an order to move.

Meanwhile the Indonesian Government has announced that Australian lives and property in Borneo would be given the "highest protection."

The Foreign Ministry stated that this assurance "though not a guarantee" was being given at the request of the Australian Government.

Indonesian troops now serving in the Congo under the United Nations will be recalled to Borneo if and when their services there end.
