The late King was absent from the ceremony, having been in London since his death.

Mr. Hubbard said there could be no question of the Government increasing its uhuru bonus to 10 per cent. He said that the Government was not in a position to pay such a bonus.

Mr. Kenyatta announced the news after the Sheikh Hamadi died October 5, as follows:—

"Prime Minister, I have the honour to refer to discussions held between our respective Governments on the future of the Kenya Protectorate (the Coastal Strip) and to place on record the following understandings by the Government of Kenya in relation thereto:

"The independence of any part of the region will be at the discretion of the United Kingdom. His Majesty's Government will not be bound to take any action in relation to the settlement of the region until the Government of Kenya has agreed to the proposals of the United Kingdom in connection with the settlement of the region.

There was therefore no point in Asians and African voters wanting their vote for a party which was unable to produce a candidate in an area they claimed.

This was an illustration of how ignorant and ill-informed the Kadu leaders were. He urged the Asian community to remain calm, pointing out that the Government would stand by its policy of safeguarding human rights while this vote was being held.

The President of the Nakuru Municipal Council, Mr. P. M. O. Ochieng, said yesterday that he was disappointed that Mr. Moi's statement blaming Asians for Kadu's failure in the municipal election.

Mr. P. M. O. Ochieng said he was believing the lack of a party which had not an election ticket was a mistake made by the voters rather than the Kadu leaders.

"Instead of blaming Asians, Mr. Moi should have said that one or two Kadu candidates were not in the race," he said.

U.S. offer of free food

Uganda rejects

Uganda has rejected a gift of virtually unlimited food from the United States to the man who was organizing the gift, Father Meyer, of the Relief Services in Uganda, in a check and disclaimer which says the reason put forward is that it would interfere with the local economy in not valid.

The food is farm surplus bought by the American Government for distribution, through recognized agencies, to underdeveloped countries and is already being sent to 24 African countries. Uganda and Sudan are the only two nations on the continent to refuse the offer. The Minister of Health, Dr. E. Kuma, argued at the weekend that there was an immediate need for more food in Uganda and said he would make inquiries about the offer and its refusal.

FREE TO PORT OF ENTRY

The Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Community Development, Mr. E. J. E. Meyer, said that if Father Meyer did not think the Government's reason for refusal was valid, it was a matter for him. "It is not a matter we can comment on."

Father Meyer explained that the food was free to the port of entry but the Governments involved were asked to pay for inland transport and warehousing. The food could have gone to schools and he had requests for 1,500 tons of powdered milk, in addition there were requests for wheat, flour, beans and rice, various forms of cheese and clothing.

The Minister of Community Development, Mr. M. N. Cooper, the Minister of Health, Dr. E. Kuma, and the Minister of Agriculture, Mr. M. N. 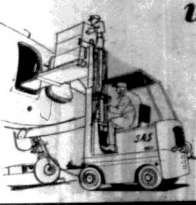

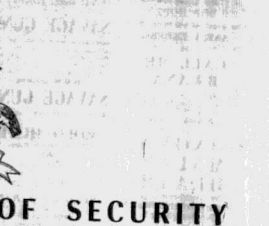

In an interview in Delhi, Mr. Chou remarked his willingness to visit New Delhi for talks.

RHODESIAN FORCES

BRITAIN boycotted the vote as the U.N. General Assembly called her to withhold the reversion to Southern Rhodesia of military forces at present committed by the colony to the Central African Federation.

This was virtually the same resolution that British legislation also called for abrogation of the Southern Rhodesian Constitution and the drafting of a new constitution with the participation of representatives of all sections of the community. It also asked the British Government "not to transfer to its colony of Southern Rhodesia, as at present governed, any of the powers or attributes of sovereignty but to await the establishment of a Government fully representative of all the inhabitants."

The vote was 90 in favour, 20 against and 30 in abstention. The African and Portugal votes against the resolution.

Mr. C. J. Robinson (Tanganyika) said before the vote that an overwhelming vote to favour the reversion would save the organization and the need from a problem very similar to that in South Africa.

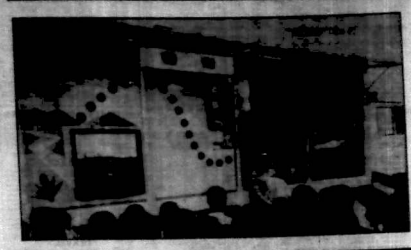

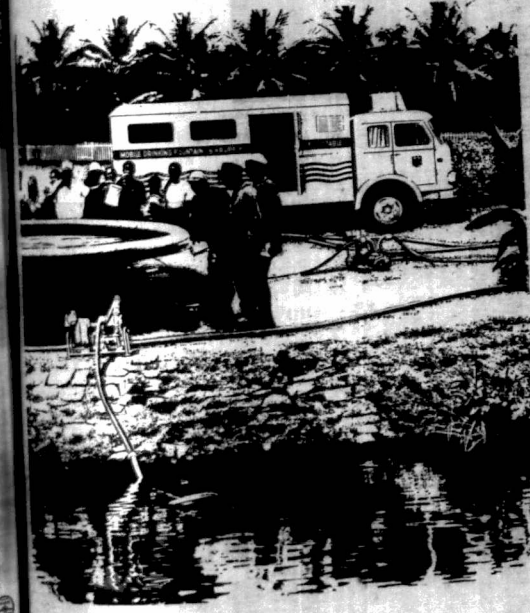

TANGANYIKA BACKS KANU DEMANDS

Revealed Staff Reporter: Dar es Salaam
President Ibrahim of Tanganyika yesterday sent a message to the Kenya Prime Minister, Mr. Kenyatta, saying that Tanganyika backed Kanu's stance at the Lusaka constitutional conference.

The message read: "Kanu was elected by the people with the mandate to change the Constitution and secure effective democratic Government. Tanganyika fully supports your modest and essential demands for centralisation of the Civil Service, the Police, and a large reduction of the constitutional amendment procedure."

"As they stand at present they make a mockery of democracy in Kenya," he said. "I am sure that your Government by the way of the constitutional provisions prevent the people from expressing their own opinion. The Constitution itself must be scrapped."

"A situation like this is of vital concern to Tanganyika. We are inevitably involved in the stability of our southern neighbour and this can only be achieved when independence is given to a country which is not a puppet of another nation, but really is its own master."

"It is contrary to Tanganyika's policy to interfere in the internal affairs of other nations, but equally it is and must be our policy to support the expressed wishes of the people of Africa for freedom and unity."

Remain unchanged
The Kenya Government had received a message from the British Government to the effect that these parts of the Kenya Constitution, which were clearly unworkable, were to be amended. But Kanu was not prepared to agree that the British Government should have the right to amend the Constitution.

Dangerous threats
Kanu had proposed this in a conference of the type the British Government considered to be a pre-arranged occasion. But it is not clear that the British Government will recognize its responsibility to uphold the will of the people of Kenya, and that it will not betray the ideas of democracy in the operations of Kulu-manufacture trial bars.

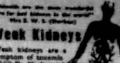

The Government also considered that such a company would be a national company which would be able to qualify for preferential status in the country.

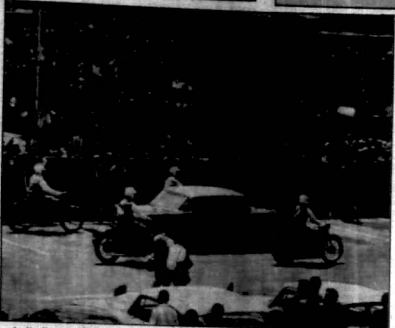

No more mediation Kenya says Prime Minister

Kenya Prime Minister said on Saturday after the final session of the 1962-63 conference in London that there would be no bloodshed in the partitioning of the country and that the British Government was committing itself to partitioning the country by setting up a separate State.

Changes in the Constitution which had been made were not just for his party but for the country as a whole. Asked whether there would be arrests now in Kenya, Mr. Kenyatta said: "No, no, no. We don't want to arrest anybody."

The Minister for Justice and Constitutional Affairs, Mr. Mboya, commented that Mr. Kenyatta said "Kenya wants to be arrested" so he could be arrested by the British. But he would not be arrested, Mr. Mboya added.

GOVERNMENT FULLY CAPABLE

"Of course, if anyone was reckless enough to start violence, the Government is fully capable of handling the situation very firmly. The police and military are ready to deal with any contingency. This situation arose but we are confident that it will not recur."

Mr. Kenyatta and Mr. Mboya expressed confidence that the Opposition would have second thoughts after its partition threat after it had got over its "initial disappointment". They discussed the matter but they would be bloodied or tribal fighting.

ENGLISH LINKS THAT WILL NOT BE FORGOTTEN

Swiss gift to Royal College will aid research

RESEARCH into some of the main problems affecting Kenya livestock will be commencing in full with the generosity of a gift of 35 microscopes to the Royal College Faculty of Veterinary Science at Kabete.

Three guest lecturers from Switzerland attended the presentation. They were Dr. Rudolf Schober, Dr. Lutz Halliger and Dr. Ernst Tschuber, who are spending 12 weeks at the Royal College.
