## Kenya team's 'astounding success'

In the next two or three years Kenya should be able to secure markets in the Communist countries for exports worth £3,000,000 a year, the Minister for Agriculture, Mr. McKenzie, said in Nairobi yesterday on his return from a tour of Russia and Eastern European States.

He stressed that Kenya in return would have to import goods to a similar value from these countries. One of the purposes of the mission had been to explore the possibilities of agreements which would result in a balanced trading position.

This, it was hoped, would allow Kenya to cut down on imports from countries such as Japan and India—where the trading balance was not in Kenya's favor.

Mr. McKenzie was the first member of the mission to return to Kenya. The leader of the mission, the Minister for Commerce and Industry, Dr. Kiambu, and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Treasury, Mr. Kilian, are expected to return on Thursday. They are at present in Cairo.

## Received warmly everywhere

The mission visited Russia, Poland, East Germany, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Rumania and Jugoslavia.

Mr. McKenzie said they had received very warm welcomes and plenty of offers of trade agreements. He described the trip as an "astounding success."

In addition, several draft trade agreements which were discussed by the Government—the minister had had talks on technical, administrative and commercial matters with the Soviet Union, East Germany, Poland, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Rumania and Yugoslavia.

The real success of the mission was the agreement of the Communist countries to send the Soviet minister to Kenya, Mr. McKenzie said.

"There are obviously great possibilities in trade with the eastern bloc," he said. "I am sure that we will be able to take still more steps in the next few months."

# TOP-FLIGHT STUDY ON CANCER

## Vet team has dual mission in Kenya

A team of Scottish veterinary experts who have arrived in Kenya to give a "crash Africa" to African veterinary officials in East Africa are coupling their intensive teaching programme with important research work. Part of this involves investigations into cancer, a disease which two of the team made a major breakthrough shortly before they left Scotland.

In order that their teaching assignment does not cause them to be taken into one of the major killing belts for a shuttle service of air transport. The veterinary team have brought equipment and material back for examination under the electron microscope at Kenya University. Kenya does not possess one of the most expensive but invaluable research tools.

### PHOTOGRAPHS SENT BACK

Then photographs taken with the microscope are being sent back to Kenya for examination by Dr. William J. Pratt and Dr. W. B. Martin, the two members of the Scottish team who brought the break-through in cancer research. Dr. Martin will be arriving in about a fortnight. So the Cancer Campaign has made a substantial gain at this time. The leader of the team, now at the Royal College of Veterinary Medicine at Kabete, Prof. W. I. M. Alexander, said his two colleagues will be returning to show that it was cancer.

Citizens of the United Kingdom and Canada who do not possess Kenya citizenship on Independence will be able to apply for British passports in the British Passport Office, which is open in Nairobi on December 31.

Further details about this office will be announced by the British Information Office later.

# Mombasa to get new £1m. cargo berths

Development of berths 13 and 14 at Mombasa for use as general cargo berths has been approved by the Ministerial Committee. The work will cost £1,000,000. 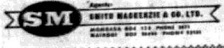

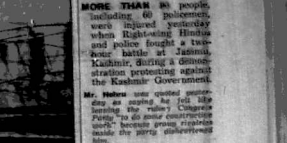

# Kenya's in Uganda Police to be transferred

**Forty-three Uganda Police officers of Kenyan origin are to be transferred from Uganda to the Kenya Police under an agreement reached between the two Governments.**

The Inspector-General, Mr. M. J. Hanson, said in Kampala yesterday that the number included five designated officers, 11 inspectors, 24 assistant inspectors and three non-commissioned officers.

Kenya has the same, he added, and although two of them — one officer and one inspector — had so far been transferred, the Kenya Government had expressed willingness to take the rest.

Letters of appointment for them were awaited from the Kenya Government before the men could be transferred.

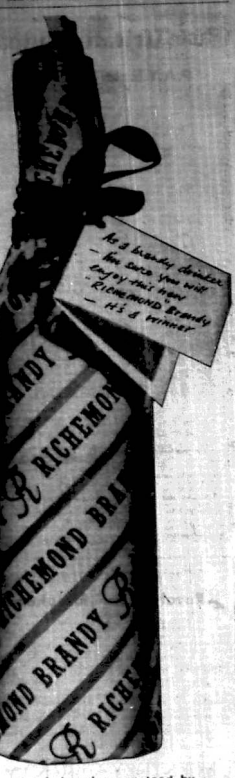

## THE first of the British troops based in Kenya to depart will leave in March next year in 1 Bn. The Grenadier Highlanders returns to Edinburgh from Gilgit.

This was announced yesterday by the East Africa Command Headquarters in Nairobi. Other proposed movements include the departure for Freetown — The Guards Depot, Stracey — of 1 Bn. The Scots Guards, at present based at Templer Barracks.

The breakdown is: 3 R.I.A. from Gilgit to Netheravon, Wiltshire; 24 Field Squadron, Royal Engineers (as present at Gilgit) to Ripon, Yorkshire; and 1 Bn. The Shropshire Regiment from Templer Barracks to Catterick, Yorkshire.

The HQ of 24 Infantry Brigade Group and most of the administrative units of the Brigade will go to Aden in the second half of next year.

Yesterday's announcement said that the future of the state headquarters and depots in East Africa Command was under consideration with the Kenya Government.

It is added that the matter is under consideration with the prime consideration of the desirability of the provision of suitable accommodation for the troops and their families.

# Government to have closer contact

## AMENDMENTS to the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation Ordinance are to be introduced in the National Assembly with the intention of bringing the K.B.C. into closer contact with the Ministry of Information, Broadcasting and Tourism.

Under the proposed amendments, published yesterday in the *Kenya Gazette*, a number of points which were formerly at the discretion of the corporation now require agreement from, or consultation with, the Minister. The amendments propose that appointments to the posts of heads of divisions and above shall be made only after consultation with the Minister.

**Bigger voice on Board**

It is also proposed that the appointment of three members to the board, formerly at the sole discretion of the corporation's contractors, will now be made by the contractors with the Minister's agreement. This amendment will give the Government a voice in the appointment of all ten members of the board, including the chairman.

The appointment of the three members concerned would be for a period of two years, instead of at the pleasure of the contractors, and would be renewable only with the consent of the Minister.

The clauses referring to the use of English, Swahili and Hindustani as obligatory languages are to be amended to allow for the use of such languages in consultation with the Minister, they decide.

Under the new proposals the clause which empowers the K.B.C. to "make such arrangements as it may think fit in the allocation of broadcasting time at between different political groups" is to be amended to read: "The Director-General's right to allocate an hour's meeting to a party or group of persons is removed, though he may still fill the balance of the hour's meeting."

Another amendment prohibits the K.B.C. from accepting advertising contracts which conflict with Government policy.

A memorandum to the Bill says that the object is to improve the machinery for controlling the corporation and to enable the K.B.C. to be brought into closer contact with the Ministry of Information, Broadcasting and Tourism.

When the K.B.C. Ordinance was introduced there was no reference to broadcasting and it is understood that the amendments were designed to take into consideration the restrictions on the corporation.

The Director-General of the K.B.C., G. M. Chama, said last night that he was unable to say how long he would be in the country on the proposed Bill, which he had not had the chance to study.

Mr. John Hickey, chairman of the corporation, declined to comment.



# Kenya favours end to Kenya border controls

Close collaboration and co-operation between Kenya and Ethiopia will be possible if the two countries were to abolish border controls, the Kenyan Foreign Secretary, Mr. J. M. Njoroge, said in Nairobi yesterday.

# Only one M.P. raises dissenting voice

Only one voice raised in opposition, the Kenya House of Representatives yesterday approved a motion by the Prime Minister, Mr. Kenia, that should apply for membership of the Commonwealth.

The lone voice was that of Mr. T. Towett (Kadu Buret) who called the Commonwealth "a group of dictators." Mr. Kenyatta described the Member as "the philosopher" and "the absent-minded professor."

The Prime Minister moved that the House vote with satisfaction the agreement in Command 2326 in which the British Government had expressed its intention that Kenya should become independent on December 31, 1963, and that the Members should express a wish that Kenya should become a member of the Commonwealth on becoming independent.

The motion added that the House should express its approval of the British Government's intention to enter into a treaty with Kenya which would give effect to the agreement in Command 2326.

Mr. Kenyatta said that agreement in Command 2326 was a great step forward for Kenya and that he was sure that the House would support it.

Mr. Towett said that he was not in favour of the motion because he believed that Kenya should become independent on its own terms and not as a member of the Commonwealth.

The motion was carried by a large majority and the House adjourned.

# MOVES TO JOIN FINANCE GROUPS

THREE Bills which the Minister for Finance, Mr. G. M. Obichia, said would enable Kenya to take its place in the financial community of nations were introduced for a Second Reading yesterday.

# Harsher penalties urged for stock theft

Regional Assembly, held yesterday that a total of 1,345 head of sheep and cattle had been stolen in the region in June, July and August, called upon the Government to introduce harsher penalties for stock thieves.

The matter was considered at the last meeting of the National Security Council, which I attended, and I have asked that before legislation is introduced to tighten up the stock-theft laws we should have an opportunity to voice our opinions."

Mr. Osovo said the laws made by the parliament were not effective, and stock thefts were costing the economy of the country Mr. K. Chereki (Kaduna, Marakwet) said many people looked forward to independence because they thought they could steal more, so the region had to have strict laws.

The motion was opposed by Mr. S. Turgut (Kadu, Borneo/Itombi), who said it would punish only the Maasi and Kalenjin. Instead of stricter laws there should be more policemen and employment.

Mr. Osovo said: "There were 53 successful convictions with 54 years pending before the courts in 1961. The National Security Council has approved a film on stock-theft and prevention."

He said that from June 1 to 1 September 1962 a total of 1,345 head of cattle and 386 sheep were stolen. There were 350 head of cattle recovered.

Most of the stolen sheep were slaughtered near their homes.

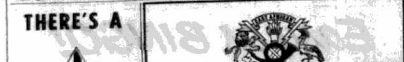
