MILDERMAN CALLS FOR SCHOOL MEANS TEST

The meeting of the City Council yesterday was needed mainly to meet additional expenditure on primary schools which will bring the rate on the value of unimproved land in the existing city area to 21 per cent. It was among a number of changes outlined in the draft revenue estimates for 1966, put before the council yesterday by its Finance Committee.

With no votes against and only a few abstentions, the council approved the estimates and referred them to the Mayor. The opposition to the raising increase came from a few members of the Aldermen Bench and by Ald. J. Somers.

He proposed that it should be referred back to the recommendation that the rate be left at 21 per cent. "I recommend that the rate be left at 21 per cent. It is not only a very reasonable rate but it is a very reasonable rate to take in relation to the ratepayers of our city," he said.

BURSARY PLAN SUGGESTED

Ald. Somers said he understood that 24 per cent would be the rate on the total expenditure on education. He agreed that the city had a duty to provide as much education as possible for its citizens, but disputed that the rate increase was necessary.

When his reference back failed - with only three votes in favour - Ald. Somers sought to get an amendment to a section in the estimates on school fees. He wanted school fees to be drawn up to ensure that no child was deprived of the opportunity of receiving an adequate education due to the inability of his family to pay fees.

Ald. Somers also stated that means test should be introduced so that education was only charged for those whose financial means permitted. He received no assent to this proposal and no vote was cast on the reference back.

WHEN a product becomes so popular, when it starts "selling itself" and demand far exceeds supply, then any board of directors in the world will have a happy headache.

This happened in Kenya last year in the case of the British business carried on by Allsopp (East Africa) Ltd. at Nairobi.

Some of the problems which the firm has tackled with popularity has been some 200,000 gallons a month was not enough.

Working at maximum output, the Nairobi brewery managed to keep everyone satisfied most of the time.

Now the firm has solved the problem with a new 2,000,000 expansion project aimed at increasing Allsopp's production by a third again.

Plimmer has built its phenomenal success in only three years. And this is why it is retaining exactly the name.

Although they added an entire production brewery within scheduled time at that — and it is being fitted with every modern device Allsopp hope to have it in full operation towards the end of the year.

Such a big and contemporary in design, this new wing is almost identical in appearance to the existing tanks.

Practically every process is semi-automatic. The days when a workman had to be popped into every vessel to





A PARALYSED NATION MOURNS Mr. Kennedy

A GUN carriage drawn by seven horses yesterday carried the body of President Kennedy from the White House to the Capitol in Washington.

Presidents see shooting by club owner

PRESIDENT KENNEDY'S alleged assassin, Lee Harvey Oswald, was himself shot in the stomach at point-blank range last night by a man identified by police as a striptease club owner, Jack Ruby.

He was rushed to hospital and died soon afterwards within a few yards of the emergency ward in which the President died on Friday. Doctors had fought to save his life.

Oswald, handcuffed and heavily guarded, was hit by a single revolver shot from a distance of only five feet as he came out of Dallas City Jail to be transferred to an armoured car to the county jail to await trial on a charge of murdering the President.

As Oswald charged to the floor pedestrians on the street he was carried back to the police headquarters for emergency treatment. Police seized a man they said had fired the shot. Oswald of "they've got a man" rang out above the pandemonium.

'Give him a medal'

Oswald, looking pale and motionless, was placed on a stretcher. He was taken to Parkland Hospital. Some of the crowd, told about the shooting of Oswald as they awaited his arrival at the county jail, shouted: "They ought to give the guy a medal."

Ruby was said to have closed his striptease club immediately after hearing that President Kennedy had been assassinated. The shooting in the police station was seen live by millions of people across the nation watching television. Pandemonium hampered camera operators but they managed to show the shooting and the man grasping the police.

Businessmen said Ruby got out of a car at police headquarters, slipped through all the crowd, and then jumped over a fence to get to the police station. Oswald was shot in the stomach and chest at about 200 yards.

Oswald said, "Oh, he hit me, grabbing his stomach and was partly killed and partly killed." He said he had no idea who the assassin was, but he had seen the assassin with his hand on his forehead.




