35-Nil Victory In Albania

WHAT appears to have been the heaviest air battle yet fought over Albania on Friday resulted in a complete and unqualified victory for our fighters. A statement from the headquarters of the Royal Air Force in Greece late on Friday night said:

A formation of Hurricanes and Gladiators on patrol near the borders from today interrupted a small number of formation of enemy fighters and fighters on a mission combat 20 enemy aircraft were shot down and five destroyed. The remainder were forced to return to their bases. It is probable that the enemy returned safely.

He said that the services of the Royal Air Force Command in Greece were of the highest order and he expressed his appreciation in providing efficient support to the British air force.

DEMYANTS hid for the control of the destinies of the Balkans was the principal feature of the news today.

The machines operated over towns in the Midlands, the South-East and North-East Coasts and South-East Scotland. Some searchlights were started and casualties were dropped.

A severe attack was made on Cardiff. Many incendiaries were dropped and fires were started in shops and houses. There were quick-acting fire engines in the city.

It is understood that one raider was brought down during the attack. The raid was at its height at 11.15 p.m. and a moment later there was a great explosion.

FORT MEGA—No. 2.
SCENES AFTER THE CAPTURE

Dangers of the South Africans Escaped

[Special Correspondent.]

February 19. (Special Correspondent.)
 Large lists of prisoners, who number nearly 50,000, standing forlornly outside Fort Mega this morning provide for the Italians a final sorry chapter in the drama of the last few days.
 It is a strange scene which the overcast sky and a cold biting wind is whitening through short-trees over the fort. Inside the barbed wire enclosure prisoners are huddled together in groups. Italian on one side and natives on the other. The only colour in this dark depressing spectacle is an occasional flash of red in a tattered member of the Native Colonial Infantry moving through the queuing ranks of his fellow prisoners, or when an Italian soldier opens his great coat and allows a glimpse to be had of his colonial uniform.
 For the rest the world that stretches westward to the wide sea below where Moyale lies, a straggling group of people are winding their way towards the fort. They are those prisoners who since dawn have been coming in from the neighbouring hills, bringing white flags.

Hoisting the Colours
 On the left is the village of Mega. The Governor's house, a white-washed colonial building, stands on the rising ground and is surrounded by a high wall. In front of it are two high garrison buildings dotted on the hillside. The white flag which the Governor hoisted from the fort to signify his surrender still flies from the masthead, but not far from it South African troops are presently hoisting in its place the regimental standard of an East Rand unit.

In the fort itself are twenty-two Italian officers whom we explained. They are distributed in various rooms and are interrogated by our intelligence officers. Some of them are sheltering in the chapel at the rear of which stand two South African sentries with fixed bayonets. Most of the officers are in full uniform, blue tunics and breeches with gold braids and elaborate badges of rank on their shoulders and on their caps. One of them, a major, stands on the balcony above the chapel and a new one of them is an artillery officer who had lived most of his life in Vienna. He is talking eagerly in German with a young South African corporal who was an Austrian refugee.
 A contrast to the scene outside the fort was the courtyard which from early morning burst with the activity of our troops. Hundreds of rifles, captured from the Italians, were stacked in one corner, more than forty machine-guns were ranged along one side, and with them medical and food supplies, together with thousands of rounds of ammunition, told more graphically than any word the importance of our victory. Into this scene there came presently the incongruous spectacle of a South African soldier docketed in an captured Italian tunic, riding a mule.

The Ex-Governor
 Soon after nine o'clock a commander, responsible for the frontal attack on the enemy position, visited the fort. With him was an Italian Lieutenant-Colonel who was also the Governor of Galla and Sidamo Province, now prisoner of war. The Italian officer, who was also the staff officer and in French had been the staff officer of the South African officers for the capture of the fort, meted out to the officers, by his own side, the fort and surrounding area were completely in South African hands.

At a meeting of the Municipal Board of Nakuru on Wednesday, there was a considerable discussion over the question of the election of Indian members to the Board and on the instructions of the Chairman the Town Clerk read the report from the Sub-Committee appointed by the Finance and General Purposes Committee referred to in the recommendation.

"This report stated that 'in accordance with a resolution passed by the Finance and General Purposes Committee and in April, 1937, the Sub-Committee, consisting of Mr. Coulter and Mr. Crosswell, met on May 15, 1937. They had previously considered the proposed rules known as the Indian Councils Election Rules, 1937, and the Committee were of the opinion that there could be no objection in theory to the Indian community electing their own members, but that before that they should first have not yet arrived to apply this theory to a Municipality such as Nakuru."

"They pointed out that although the number of Asiatic residents qualified to vote would be comparatively small there were nevertheless divided into certain very distinct sects—Christian, Moslems, Hindus and members of the Patel Brotherhood, and it was feared that an election would be held of these sects. The Commission therefore in the appointment of Indian members to the Nakuru Municipal Board, in accordance with the instructions of the Board, the Commission only considered the need for the Indian members who would agree to, if and when applied, with the suggestion also set out in red ink in the draft rules."

Dr. Shah, in opposing the recommendation, said the question of the elective principle referred to in the Commission's report had no evidence had been called from the Indian Community who the Commission considered the matter, and that there was no Hindu representative on the Board at the time he stated that by the Indian members of National Municipalities in Nairobi and in Mombasa, the elective principle was applied in the Indian community. He stated that in Mombasa, the Muslims were in the majority and the Indian representatives on that Municipality were decided by election. Further, in Nairobi, the Hindus were in the majority, and no objection had been raised by the Muslim community; in fact, both sections show references to be by election, and he could see no reason why any objections that might be raised by Nakuru should not be applied to the Board.

He pointed out that the Board was not a religious body, and in fact had all Indian members before the Board had been referred to as Indian members, no objection had been made on religious grounds. He said that he would like to see the Board set up on a basis that would be the best thing to be done in Nakuru would be to appoint a fresh Commission to take evidence from the members of the Indian community, had endeavor to discover what their needs and requirements would be, and that the committee would be satagated.

An Amendment

That a Committee of the Board be appointed to enquire into the question of Indian representation on the Municipal Board being in question limited as at present, constituting the Committee to take such evidence from the Indian community, and other sources, as they consider desirable, and report to the Board.

The Chairman, Col. C. G. Grimble, stated that the matter had been brought to the notice of the Board by the Provincial Commissioner, Sir Victor Vyse, when he sent to the Town Clerk a copy of letter from the Hon. Secretary of the Indian Association, Nakuru, and copy of a letter addressed to him by the Provincial Commissioner's committee, after consultation with the Board.

Mr. W. W. Crosswell was of opinion that before the Board applied for the election of Indian members, it ought to make quite sure that the majority of the Indian members of the Board had only been asked to appoint the Commission to elect a member. He pointed out that in the Board, it would be asked why the Board should take a lot of trouble to appoint a Commission, have evidence taken, and their deliberations were finished here by the Board.

BRITAIN BREAKS WITH BULGARIA

Inevitable Sequel to Hostile Act

EMIR'S CALL TO MOSLEMS

It has now been officially announced in London that Great Britain has broken off diplomatic relations with Bulgaria. This step was taken at 8.30 this morning when Mr. George Rendel, the British Minister in Sofia, handed a note to M. Filov, the Bulgarian Prime Minister.

Both the German and Italian radio have announced the news and the German broadcast said that Mr. Rendel would have Sofia as soon as he had made the necessary arrangements.

It is stated in London that Mr. Rendel will probably leave within the next two or three days. He is said to be going to the city of being to Istanbul, but no definite details are available.

It is pointed out that the breaking of diplomatic relations does not mean that we are at war with Bulgaria.

According to an American radio station the United States Minister in Sofia has given instructions to the American Legation there to prepare to take over our interests in Bulgaria.

Mr. Burgess

The British Government's action will create no surprise. It has been expected since the Bulgarian Government, by allowing German troops to enter their country, has gone completely into the enemy's camp and acquiesced in the entry of Bulgaria as a base from which the Axis powers operate against British forces and those of their allies.

The situation in Bulgaria remains somewhat obscure because telegraphic communication with the capital is still difficult.

Reports from Telegram correspondents, telephoning from Constantinople last night, said that it was expected, well-informed circles that the Bulgarian Foreign Minister, M. Popoff, will shortly announce the correspondent added that the Bulgarian Government has decided to accompany Mr. Popoff to Vienna, but Saturday for signature by the Prime Minister. It is understood that Mr. M. Popoff's resignation will be taken by M. Filov.

Mr. Popoff is stated to have notified the Belgian, Polish and French legations in Sofia that their missions must be considered terminated. They are advised to leave the country in view of the situation recently created.

Arrests in Sofia

Reports from various sources speak of arrests between the German and Bulgarian Governments in Sofia. An Exchange Telegram correspondent has received confirmation of several arrests, mostly of officers in the White Police and students.

It is reported in Sofia. Move German troops and troops of other forces are also to be flying over the capital and the streets are full of soldiers. German planes are flying over other vehicles. Bulgarian troops with

field equipment are also passing through Sofia.

It is reported that the Bulgarian Government will today consider the reply to the personal message which President Tsonoff received from Russia concerning the Treaty Government's communication to the Turkish Government and military leaders immediately after it was delivered by Von Papen, the German Ambassador. There is no hint as to the nature of the message, either from Bulgaria or from the Turkish capital.

In the meantime, Turkey has received encouragement from a very important source. Turkish

THE NAVY TAKES SOME GERMAN PRISONERS

March 5. The Royal Navy yesterday morning captured a German submarine in the Lofoten Islands off the coast of Norway. The Admiralty, in announcing it this morning, said the raid was successful and further details will be issued as soon as they are known. The German navy agency has already given its version of the raid. It states the raid was made by light naval forces which landed soldiers on the island after a short bombardment. Germans were taken prisoner and some Norwegian fishermen were taken off the island. The Lofoten Islands lie well to the north of the coast of Norway.

MEALS A LA UNDERGROUND

London's deep underground railway stations which since the heavy night raids on the capital have been serving as public eating places are becoming more and more like homes from home. On the Covent Garden, and banks are being delivered in large numbers to other stations.

All the eighty stations chosen as dining centres are now equipped, and about twelve and a half million gallons of tea and coffee are consumed every night. During such times of day as the pressure of passenger traffic on the underground railway is slight, six special restaurant trains are run to replenish the stocks of the station canteens. Empty bins, which are taken back for the previous night, are picked up by these trains and food sent to the six railway depots required for the receipt and despatch of food and drink.

Warning " Tea Pots

A corner of each of the eighty stations is reserved for a tea canteen. There are 134 of these canteens, and a staff of 1,600 women is needed to run them. They are open on duty at 3 p.m. to prepare trays of teas, coffees, fruit and other eatables. Then the great area have to be heated and cleaned up. About an hour later the waitresses put on their aprons, caps, and start serving customers.

Shoppers can have their food and drink in their own places on the platform. Specially designed tea and coffee pots are provided so as not to disturb the women who are selling. They are rather like watering cans, with a long spout served to shelterers near the walls of crowded platforms. These bins of food are eaten each night.

To ensure the maximum charge for anything. Parcels of biscuits are 2d. home are 1d. cut cake is 1d. a piece. Soap is now being served in well used and clean.

When the evening meal has been served the women staff go to their mattress beds on the platform. They sit at tables of 100 and start to prepare the morning meals, which are served from 6 a.m. to 7.30.

NYASALAND VOLUNTEERS

Congratulations By Governor

The various platoon of the Nyasaland Defence Force have now "passed out of the square," and a high degree of efficiency has been attained. Instruction in the use of light machine guns has been given.

His Excellency the Governor, Sir Donald Kennedy, K.C.M.G., recently inspected the Zomba platoon, and the inspection he spoke some words of encouragement and congratulated the men on the enthusiasm shown and the degree of efficiency already attained.

It is interesting to record that the command of the senior military officer in relation to the Nyasaland volunteers locally by the R.A.F. an opportunity of further instruction in the use of light machine guns was given to the platoon. The Council of Ligonies Chiefs, elected in all, recently visited the military camp at Mpatá Mbonde. They were shown all over the camp and were immensely impressed with what they saw. In particular they were struck by the remarkable improvement in appearance of the women resulting from the liberal ration. These latter were better than anything the chiefs themselves had seen. Such regular demonstrations of the effects of an adequate and balanced diet, apart from their military importance, afford a lesson which should prove valuable after the war.

Crop Prospects

There has been considerable precipitation in most areas during the last fortnight. In the Lower River area the food position is still below average but not serious. In other parts of the Southern Province the situation is satisfactory. In the Northern Province as well as the improvement in the maize crop situation is generally satisfactory.

In North Nyasaland the recently raised cotton crop amounted to 264 long tons. In the Southern Province the cotton crop is also good, and the Lower River planting conditions.

The cotton season is later than usual but if climatic conditions continue to be favourable it is likely that there will be a record crop of cotton. In regard to flavoured fruit, a decreased acreage owing to the late start of the season will be an asset at that of last year because of anticipated better results. The auction will commence on April 22.

An event of note has been the combined summit Flower Show of the Limbe and Buxton Garden Clubs, which was held at Limbe on February 18. The display of flowers was better than in usual at this time of the year owing to the absence of excessive rains.



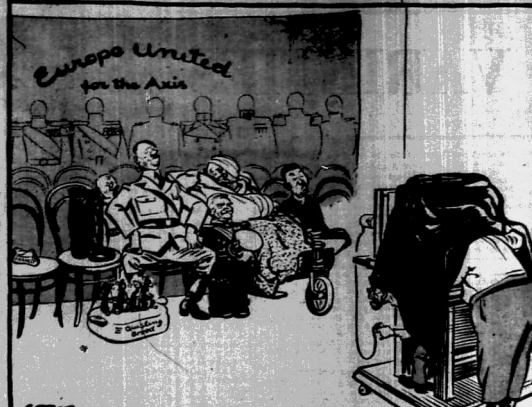

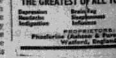

For the rest of us the revivification of the black-out regulations can bring nothing but unrelieved pleasure. Kenya has for some months been experiencing the inconvenience of the black-out for so short a period as nine months, but even that limited experience has surely taught us to appreciate the blessing of light and all that it means as an antidote against depression and loneliness. The mental effect of living in enforced darkness may not be immediately obvious to us but that it has an unfavourable influence there can be no doubt. To measure the black-out was practically all the inconvenience that many people in centres such as Nairobi have had to suffer as a direct consequence of the war and there are probably some who would argue that even today such people should have some reminder of the fact that this country is a theatre of military operations in the general Empire struggle. To such we would answer that continuation of the black-out for such a lengthy psychological reason would merely have maintained not only an unnecessary irritant but in times might have had unpleasant results upon the lives of townspeople and especially of children. We are all, however, now able to appreciate because of our experience some of the very great hardship which the gallant people of Britain are suffering and must continue to suffer by being deprived of light in these modern days light has become accepted as a normal and unremarkable feature of civilisation and it has required an unhappy experience to make us think of the inestimable boon it confers upon us.
