NEW AIRCRAFT

Vera Cruz Plans for Whose Airways

Two new Percival Vega Gull monoplane, of the type that have done so well in various races and long-distance flights of hours, will be flown to Kenya some time next month, an addition to the fleet of Whose Airways Limited.
The Vega is the type that won this year's King's Cup Air Race and the Portsmouth aerobically air race for the Robinson Trophy and was also used by Mrs. Beryl Matthews in her trans-Atlantic flight.

The voting on the first motion was 39 for and one against. On the second, the voting was 35 for and two against. It had been gathered that there was a considerable amount of support for Income Tax in the Songhor District but as in the case of Malindi, the detailed examination of the position has only clarified the minds of the electors but also resulted in support for the policy of the Elected Members.

There was a marked cleavage between political and trade union sections of the congress, and a motion by Sir Stafford Cripps that the defence resolution should be referred back was defeated.

Kenya and Tanganyika Practically Clear 'The Department of Agriculture Nairobi, has sent the following Locust Report dated October 6...'

KAMPALA CHURCH

'[STANDARD'S CORRESPONDENT.] Kampala, October 4. A building competition was held in Kampala last week in aid of the building fund for All Saints Church. There were 36 players and the preliminary results were played off on Wednesday, the semi-final and final being fought on Friday. The Rev. Rowland, the pastor in charge of Kampala and Entebbe informed us that the Fund raised some £8, which is certainly gratifying and it is hoped that other competitions may be arranged in the near future to amass this very useful object. All Saints Church was built in 1913. It costs only about 70 people and arrangements for extension were included in the building when it was constructed. However, it is felt that in Kampala's increasing population has multiplied itself many times since 1913, other extensive alterations are now necessary or even the erection of a new building altogether, perhaps on some more suitable site. It is understood that the building is now being handed by the Church Authorities and we expect to hear before long that a campaign is being launched by our very energetic pastor, with one of these objects in view.'

With regard to (1), the Penal Code establishes the presumption that killing is murder and is not to be rebutted by the defence of insanity and by any statutory exception...

With regard to (2), the Indian Evidence Act reads as follows: "When a person is accused of any offence, the existence of circumstances bringing the case within any of the exceptions in the Indian Penal Code, or within any special exception or proviso contained in any other part of the same Code, or in any law defining the offence, is upon him, and the court shall presume the absence of such circumstances."

It is manifest that the section can be interpreted so as to be inconsistent with the decision rendered by the House of Lords.

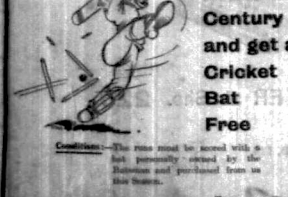

"Square Deal" for Uganda Railway Users

APPEAL IN KAMPALA CHAMBER MEMORANDUM

Call for Rates Reductions

COMPARISON WITH CONDITIONS ON SOUTH AFRICAN SYSTEM

"The Railway is no longer a revenue-earner for Kenya, as it once was, but the loss of business lines... Make the rates... telephonic and give the people who use the railway a square deal."

This is an extract from a memorandum on Railway rates which was submitted to the Uganda Chamber of Commerce at Kampala yesterday.

The memorandum quotes comparative rates, both of passenger and goods traffic, of the K.U.R. and the South African Railway to the disadvantage of the K.U.R. and urges a wholesale reduction of passenger rates and the encouragement of imports by abolishing the highest rate and reducing the others by one class.

Passenger Fares

Excursion fares are issued for the entire journey of above rates, calculated only on the mileage of the single journey.

Another comparison between the K.U.R. and S.A.R. might be made on the calculation of return tickets on ordinary fares. In East Africa, a return fare is calculated on two single fares. A day-class fare (return) Kampala-Mombasa costs Ksh. 17/90. The S.A.R. ordinary fare, a return ticket is based on the double mileage, i.e. 841 miles. On the S.A.R. rates would be Shs. 306/70 (not much of a saving, but something out of the wood).

A comparison of the running times on the K.U.R. as against the S.A.R. rates also is interesting. It takes about the same time for a train to come from Nairobi to Kampala, a distance of 666 miles, from Mombasa to Kampala, 941 miles, the time taken is 49 hours. From Cape Town to Johannesburg, a distance of 666 miles, 500 miles express trains 30 hours, ordinary trains 36 hours.

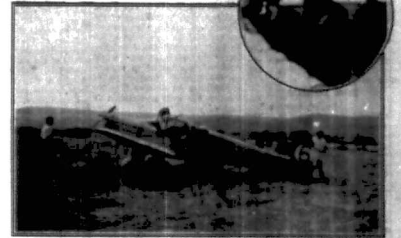

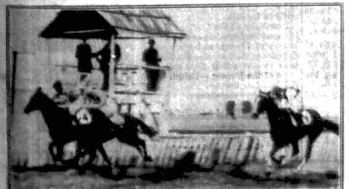

He is looking and going well, and so far has had no recurrence of his knee troubles, but I don't know how he will behave in a field of 35, with a boy of 2 st. 12 lb. on his back."

"Merry March" showed his quality and class when he won the race in such a big field. It is thought that he is bound to also succeed in the Second Division to newly imported horses, so that Captain Rocco's colt gave a really fine show to win in such a large field. The top weight was "Triffing Billy," carried at 11 st. 12 lb.

Trained in 1922 "Merry March" was got by "Duncan Gray" out of "Gartheden," he "Franklin." He was imported by Mr. F. Hill to Kenya on behalf of Captain Rocco through the British Bloodstock Agency Ltd.

This is the first occasion on which a horse racing in Kenya has gone to another land to win on the turf, and it indicates clearly the remarkably high standard of races being in Kenya.

"Merry March's" success suggests that it is a great pity that the tentative plan to send that great runner to South Africa failed to materialize. High hopes were anticipated, but through various causes the plan fell through.

It is perhaps interesting to note that Mr. Chutterbuck is now at Durban, and is endeavoring to secure another import to Kenya. He scored a fine success with another imported mare in "Humewood" by Heverswood who at the Southvale Autumn meeting won from "Eiderdown" and "Humewood" won at a record price for the year—128 to 1. Although the starting price was returned at 100 to 5, she was always obtainable from the book at 20 to 1.
