LONDON MEETING HEAVY AIR ATTACK ON VIETMINH French re-form southern Hanoi

FRENCH bombers have made a heavy attack on the Vietminh base in the south-west of Hanoi, the French High Command announced yesterday. The attack was made from a French jet bomber, which was escorted by a French jet fighter, and resulted in the destruction of 20 miles square of Vietminh territory.

NO U.S. DECISION YET ON FUTURE COURSE

PRESIDENT EISENHOWER said in Washington today that he was completely and unalterably opposed to the admission of China to the United Nations under present conditions.

Mr. Eisenhower, who was replying to questions at a Press conference, said emphatically that China was today at war with the U.N. She had been declared an aggressor by the U.N. General Assembly and that situation had never been changed.

The Communists were occupying North Korea; they had supported the great effort to enslave the people of Indo-China and they had been guilty of possibly the most possible diplomatic tactics in world affairs. In such situations, the United States Government could not possibly agree to the admission of China to the U.N.

Meanwhile in Canberra, the Australian Prime Minister Mr. Menzies, gave his country's point of view. He said that their attitude was the same today as it was last September, when he told the House of Representatives. "Some of the Forces of this country have been engaged in hostilities in which among their enemies there have been Chinese Communists. I do not discuss recognition of an enemy while I am in the field with him."

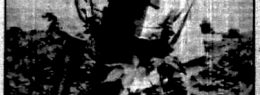

Continuing his series Round and About, Wilf Nussey drops into the Kenya Arts and Crafts Society's exhibition in the Memorial Hall, Nairobi, and describes the scene which looks like an Alice in Wonderland setting to him.

Wonderland Mixture In The Memorial Hall

I THOUGHT we had wandered into Alice's Wonderland. The Memorial Hall door closed behind us with a soft click, shutting us off from the outside world.

There was a full-sized galloon boatman next to railway station, a modernistic block of flats about nine inches high, a grinning African with spear-pointed appendages, a collection of pottery.

The Red Queen from the "Looking Glass" peered with an evil grin over the edge of a wooden box. In a far corner an attractive ornament tried on a peacock tail, defied it to was too large and put it down with a sigh.

They retire to it regularly to take up brush and paint or clay and pottery wheel and follow their hobbies. They are not merely a gregarious group of hobbyists; they have their own studio, a school of art and crafts, and a sort of public association for Kenya talent all rolled into one.

The society came to life in 1923 with the intention of encouraging arts and crafts in the Colony. It has more than succeeded in its ambitions. It now has about 500 members, and a number of seven including the president, Mr. R. McLellan Sim.

There are many sections in the society, roughly one for each type of work. Some members create puppets, of which Mr. Red Queen is one, and regulars put on performances at the society's "puppet" theatre. Others fabricate ferret in darkened rooms through trays of emulsion to triumphantly produce photographs, not always good ones but learning to do better all the time.

Life classes
The largest group of members are interested in painting, with water colours, and sketching with pencil and charcoal. Life classes are held every Monday evening at the society's studios in the N'west.

The junior section's members are up to 15 or 20 years old and typically produce mostly painting, but also do a few aircraft, toys, designs and models of literally anything from ships to the miniature railway station.

There is a considerable variety of latex and permanent in each section. Many of the members, including with little if any knowledge of what or how to do, paint, model or sculpture things, but soon learned in

this way the society is boosting talent of the Colony. Many of the members are closely connected in their vocations with arts and crafts. Professional photographers, for instance, drop in at the studio to sketch or paint. Architects arrive to practice photography or to follow other crafts, most of which are useful to architects, who are generally acknowledged as the experts in producing scale models of buildings.

High prices

THIS week's exhibition was a fine example of the standard of their work. The exhibits included things capable of fetching high prices on any market, which some of them eventually are. Some items are bought by the postoffice and the judges of the exhibition are the judges of the postoffice and the amateurs and professionals in black and white and colour showing imagination, skill and good technique.

The gallery was done in beautiful detail. Every spot of the floorboards of the life-boards had been covered, even the cars and rowlocks. A myriad of things stretched from her plank

decks, and minute gewgaws ran down into her hold and to her poop and foredeck. We felt as though we were gazing at Nelson's Victory from a cliff top.

On tour

MR. GARBUTT took us on a condensed tour of beamed pewter, graceful pottery beautifully finished, past the characteristic studies in terracotta Africans at work and play, to the tapestry section. From a finely woven board the face of Ali, the man who suggested the massive door for the Legislative Council, the work on the doors was finished.

The work exhibited was as good as any other I have seen in similar exhibitions, particularly the gifts and tapestry. If the society continues to encourage the Colony's artists and craftsmen who have in the past, I should not be at all surprised if some Kenya people become acquainted, in time, to having their work acclaimed by experts throughout the Western world.

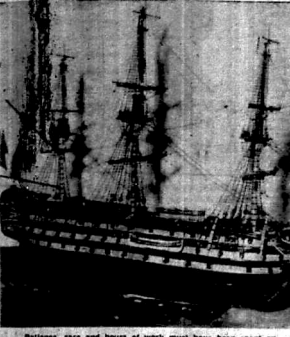

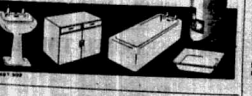
