SPARKS IN DEFENSE STRATEGY

Peace talks offer Missiles build-up

INTEREST IN AFRICA
 NEW moves to break the disarmament deadlock with Russia, and plans for building up atomic stockpiles and intermediate-range rockets in Europe, were announced in a communiqué issued at the end of the Evian Nato summit conference yesterday.

Observers have described the Nato decisions as striking a proper balance between reinforcing the West's defenses and, at the same time, offering Russia another opportunity to continue disarmament talks.

In a section dealing with Africa, the communiqué said all countries expressed their interest in the maintenance of peace and the development of conditions of economic and political well-being in that "vitally important continent", and their readiness to cooperate with the peoples and peoples of Africa to further those ends.

Deployment of missiles
 As a means of breaking the deadlock with Russia on disarmament, the communiqué said the Nato countries were agreed to open negotiations on a formal treaty which the Soviet Union requested as a refusal to take part in the work of the United Nations Disarmament Commission.

On the question of defense, the delegates agreed that the alliance in case of need, and that intermediate-range ballistic missiles should be Supreme Allied Commanders.

More fighting power for Dutch Army
 TOP priority is to be given to combat-ready troops for Nato use under a revised Dutch Army plan announced in The Hague.

In a memorandum on the subject, the Dutch Ministry of Defense, Mr. Cornelis van den Broek, said that Dutch forces were being equipped with new ballistic and guided missiles and other weapons of atomic warfare.

This followed a United States offer to provide the Netherlands with ground-to-air missiles and other weapons of atomic warfare.

BRITANNIA ENDS U.S. MONOPOLY
 BRITAIN'S major advance in experiments in "testing" the hydrogen bomb for industrial use, on which crucial reports of state achievements at Harwell, is shortly to be disclosed by the Government.

The Home Secretary, Mr. R. A. Butler, in a statement in the House of Commons, announced that "full scientific details" would be given to Parliament in the New Year.

But it is believed that a security ban will prevent a complete disclosure of British nuclear advances which many scientists believe will result in the splitting of the atom.

U.S. FIRES ANOTHER MISSILE
 A BRITANNIA 212 aircraft left London Airport for New York yesterday morning to start the first trans-Atlantic scheduled turbo-prop service.

The long-range start was the first British passenger aircraft to use regular routes outside the City-Paris-American route. British Overseas Airways Corporation's new trans-Atlantic service is the first of its kind.

Since B.O.A.C. began regular trans-Atlantic service in 1946, it has operated long-range British aircraft but has been unable to offer a service on the Atlantic.

Mr. A. (Aneurin) Bevan has been in the United States since last Monday.

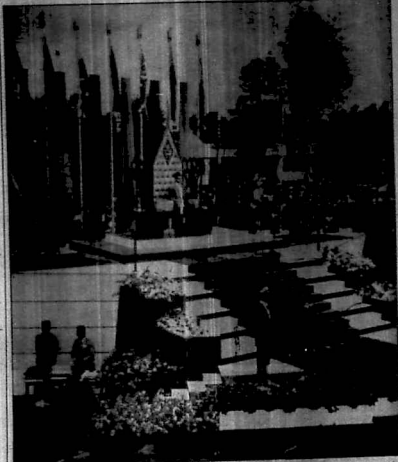

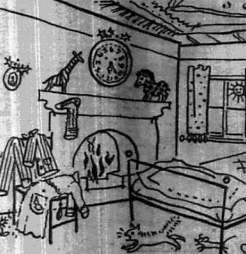

MEMORIES OF POLICE SERVICE IN MERILE

Sen. Hon. Louis West, the first Kenyan police officer to serve in the Merile, writes about his memories of the Merile police who have responded their traditional attitude on the Turkana.

BEYOND the edge of the Trans Nzoia, Kenya's most northerly farming stronghold, is the Subi Karamoja, whence the Turkana road winds through the Napsu Pass to the desert home of the Turkana.

It was during the last year after our Forces had routed the money raiders and beyond our Kenya borders that the Kenyan Police assumed full responsibility for protecting the Subi Karamoja frontier which had in the past been their joint task with the F.M.S. and tribal police of Turkana District.

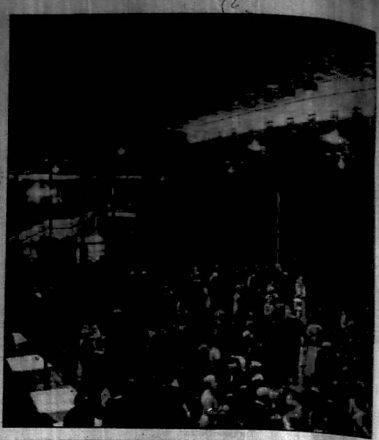
