More prosperous village of the future will be the one that of the Colony's economy is having an enduring foundation. The exhibitor was in effect not only showed how the African ought to live as a farmer and stock raiser, but also explained conversely how the slash farming methods have kept him poorer than he is in the past.

For instance, a three-roomed house was displayed which was neatly equipped with simple furniture made by the Native Industrial Training Depot, and with cupboards constructed from port-borne wood. The house itself was built of brick breaks much like those which the natives of Kyamba who had been made to build in the past.

The cottage with its homestead, was designed for a native with a capital of £50, and was of a type which is hoped for to be adopted by the natives for the future.

The stock on the farm included agricultural implements and dairy equipment, cows and calves, donkeys for transport purposes, and fowls—each breed being a source of income to the most efficient income producer.

Another important feature was a vegetable garden and orchard in the Marabou Reserve. The natives are finding strange growing to be a most profitable and sure fruit was included in the show.

A Small Holding

To give an idea of the great extent of the exhibition, it must be added that behind the main building was a model semi-rural holding which was described as being absolutely self-sufficient.

The small holding, which is a permanent fixture, is situated in the grounds of the Agricultural Department and was started some years ago in order that the African might be taught the value of his own land by actually applying the methods which they were being taught to the development of a piece of land not larger than that which most of their farms are already utilizing.

On the holding some have realized female labour and mixed farming and rotational grazing are being carried out while the greatest sanitary nuisance of rural Africa, the latrine, has been shown to be of about three acres of arable and about four acres of pasture.

The Village Shop

Another interesting feature was a village shop where a demonstration was given to the natives on how to shop in a clean and hygienic manner. The shop was a simple structure, built of brick, and was equipped with a counter, shelves, and a weighing scale. The natives were shown how to use the scale and how to keep the shop clean and hygienic. The shop was a model of what a village shop should be, and was a great success.

Excellent Cattle Section.

MARKED IMPROVEMENT IN THE QUALITY OF NATIVE GOON PRODUCTS.

The Agricultural Show was marked by excellent judging in all sections and the comments of the judges offer a good insight into the agricultural industry and to those engaged in animal industry on the directions in which improvement is desirable.

The cattle were a very good show but some of the horse classes were disappointing in numbers and the selection is made that more attention was given by exhibitors to the appearance of native eyes.

Considering the importance of the industry the small number of entries in the pyrethrum class was regarded as disappointing but otherwise promising.

Pineapple was a smaller section than usual but the interesting inclusion was a fine display of asparagus. The strawberries, too, were the finest ever shown.

Early drought and the late planting seriously affected the standard of native grasses.

Native exhibits as a whole from all parts of the Colony particularly cotton and wattle, were outstanding.

The Show was held too early for the wheat crop to be shown in its best condition and entries suffered accordingly. The judges had intercourse in comments to make on which points in relation to rust.

KENYA'S BUDGET—THE BURDEN OF COSTS.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."
 Sir.—We have for a long time been in the throes of endeavouring to achieve our Budget and apparently by a process of give and take everyone (Government and Colonial Members are more or less satisfied with the result. There are some who—the writer included—who cannot profess to the same complacency. By a process of mutual verbiage it seems to me that the position of another illustration of the adage, "The cost of the forest for the trees." The forest in the simile is the sum of our total expenditure and the trees are the parsimonious whittling down of the departmental needs and the services entailed. The forest seems to me the thing and it is a vast one for such an area as Kenya Colony.

Not having the necessary statistics to hand I am deprived of the advantage of going into detail but it is my purpose in this brief comment to examine all the processes of curtailments of expenditure. But the sum of the achievement is an expenditure on the administration of this Colony of £2,188,000 for the forthcoming year, with taxation amounting to £1,967,733. These are the bare facts to be considered.

New the question arises whether this great sum is the normal cost of administering such a territory as ours, having regard to its population, the occupied area of the whole, our trade and our production. How does this sum compare with the budgets of Southern and Northern Rhodesia, say the Northern Territories of Australia, British Guiana and the Isles? This is a question which I do not put, but having the necessary latest references at hand, it seems to me still that the forest is too vast and the sundry individual trees attacked a mere flea-bite to tackling the whole.

One has to take into consideration that a substantial portion of this expenditure goes to the payment of interest on public debt. But this public debt has been ostensibly borrowed on development expenditure which should bring in its own return. Before further taxation had been imposed, the European population were admittedly the high cost taxers per capita in the Territory. (Can this process be maintained or continued?) Are we not countering to killing the goose that lays the golden eggs?

One must remember that in other heavily taxed communities such as in England and larger Dominions, the necessary abnormal taxation to provide in forest and revenue since the war had a much wider spread than in our case. It is the European and to a lesser extent the Indian population that is mainly footing the bill per capita here

and these are the very classes that have suffered most by depression. In England, for instance, the taxer has been mainly borne by the wealthy classes, industry and commerce and despite the heavy load one reads freely of prosperous days, money plentiful on K.A. change and savings more than maintained. The extra community is owing superior to its burdens. In Kenya this draft of wealth and industrial activity is absent, we are today a land producing nothing directly from hand to mouth, the very depressed class on which the burden has been lightly levied in the Home country. The proposition here is to raise school fees when many parents cannot get the existing rates. This revenue that has operated on the Theatre business which I know something about in the proprietary companies, presents all their trading profits to the Government and continuing to trade at a loss. The Government made £4,500 out of this revenue at the expense of the proprietors, the business, leaving no profit, only losses, to the shareholders. Also we are told that this increased taxation is being consorted with low public service. The police and other services are curtailed in order that the revenues shall be put into the "management" overheads are not materially reduced but the administration is giving no "service."

This is as it appears to the layman. Our export activities, our exports are being rate cut by the administration and we are at the moment depriving of some people some of our "lavish" exports in lack of new capital coming into the country by the way of increasing settlement. We are at the moment staving in our own "pocket" and the just step to drying up. We have an untried pioneer land and almost no advantage of its position. The community is at the moment being put to the power of combination as a whole to add. Land is not a token of wealth today—being (or nothing. Big game costs 6/- for the butcher retail about 6/- Native grades 8/6. Native immune cows available £12, severely realise 1/- All our wealth tokens have gone West. One therefore deems that the Colony requires to employ a huge Geddes axe cutting half the forest of expenditure away, and the Government and community coming down to more modest and elementary conditions, better suited to actualities. Later if times are more flourishing, we may expect again, as I have a strong belief, will other colonists who know the land, that nothing in the future is going to stop our progress under normal conditions of weather and the supply and demand of colonial settlement. But we are handicapped by our expenditure and not even a chance.

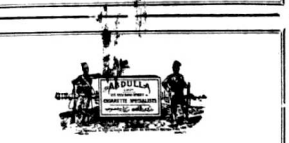

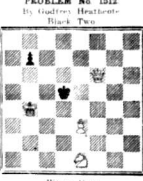

A case of wool was inspected by one of the sheep classes, but the judges noted that the wool improved to get a scrapping machine and submitted to the Veterinary Research Laboratory for examination and report. Lady Kinnear also took part and secured the important Merino Ram class and the combined class with the same outcome, contrary to her expectation. It was a success in the Merino class of prize against Mr. John Macdonald and again in the combined class.

The last named however won the East African Standard cup for the best three merino wools representing 1931 wools. For owing its presentation in 1929 it was won four times, at the season by the Delamere Estates, three at Nakuru Shows and once in Nairobi.

PIGEON

In this section the entries were mainly only five of the thirteen classes attracting entries.

Poultry Section.

The informants, judge of Mr. D. Scudle made a judge short in the Section. His fowls had to be divided between Mrs. Bump and Mr. R. Stewart and Mr. Jardine kindly consented to judge the waterfowl.

The entries were not so numerous as last year. Nairobi Shows but there were some very good birds showing a decided increase in quality.

Two notable instances of these were the Light Sussex and the White Leghorn. The Champion bird of the show, a Light Sussex, I took from the Ithra Estate as a very handsome bird, but was very close by Mrs. Peter, imported Avonka.

In the White Leghorn class it was pleasing to see the increase in size without loss of quality. Outstanding exhibits in these classes were Mrs. Peter's birds. The Australorp classes had few entries, which is rather surprising for K.R.T.A. A new bird was shown by Ithra Estate and a beautiful one of our faith

ful Australorp fancies. Mrs. Dinkley Turkeys had very few entries. It is surprising when one thinks of the number of turkeys kept in this country every year that there should be so few entries. There were three entries and one entry. Eggs were again few entries. The lot here was a good one. Followed by Ducks and Geese were also few entries. Rabbits were again few entries. The Compensation Problem.

Views of Lord Lugard.

Opposed to Payment in Cash.

AT VARIANCE WITH PLEDGE ALREADY GIVEN.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.] London, January 1. Archbishop Wilson in a letter to "The Times" in connection with the amendment to the Native Lands Trust Bill proposes against compensation being paid to the natives in cash instead of land. He regards the proposal as undesirable as, he says, the reserve is already inadequate and the money would be squandered—(Copyright.)

Lord Lugard.

["TRAVELER SECRETARY'S AGENCY."] London, January 1.

The compensation to be paid to natives in respect of land reserved for the development of the Kenya goldfields, is the subject of a letter to "The Times" from Lord Lugard, who in referring to the suggestion that compensation may be paid in money, recalls the pledges given to the natives on this point and stresses the fundamental importance of British good faith should not be open to the charge that a pledge may be treated as a mere paper.

"The Times" in remarking on the letter gives expression to the widespread uneasiness and says that a principle is at stake and is far-reaching and calls for very careful deliberation, before irrevocable steps are taken. It adds that the compensation to the natives in each instance of which land is plainly at variance with the recent declaration by the Governor and the terms of the Lands Trust Bill. Before immediate expedition, there is little to recommend such compensation as it would undoubtedly be difficult to find suitable land in place of the land containing minerals, however rich it was necessary to give the land at present alienated to European or Indians and give them money in compensation—the principle of equal compensation for natives in land and not money should be treated as fixed and settled.

Belgian Pledge.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.] London, Jan. 1.

Question is raised to Kenyan land it is developing. Lord Lugard in writing to "The Times" says that the British Parliament and public opinion whom the ultramarine responsibility rests wholly upon the responsibility of the spokesman on the merits and the feasibility of the various proposals, which are available to the displaced population, though he cannot doubt that the Government is fully bound by its obligations, to which it is committed by its pledges. The nation should have no assurance, which only a fully open statement can provide, that the position has been fully examined before irrevocable action is taken and long terms be given.

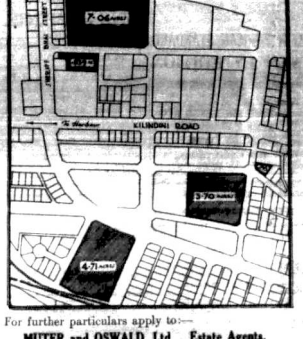

COLONIAL OFFICE MEETING WITH JOINT E.A. BOARD.

Position of Farm Houses.

LOSS IN ONE YEAR TO BE SET OFF AGAINST FUTURE PROFITS.

The Joint East African Board held their annual conference with the Secretary of State for the Colonies in London last month.

A Memorandum was submitted by the Board on the twin subjects of economy and taxation in East Africa. In reply the Secretary of State expressed the hope that the Kenya Expenditure Advisory Committee would deal with their task in the same way as Sir Sydney Armitage-Smith had analysed the whole structure of services in Tanganyika.

On the subject of Income Tax the principle of which the Joint East African Board approves, the Secretary of State agreed with the Board that the losses of a past year should be set against the profits of subsequent years. He will consider a liberal allowance for depreciation of buildings and estimated that no tax will be imposed on farmhouses where such buildings are of reasonably moderate pretensions.

The Secretary of State has laid down that when it is possible to reduce taxation in any colony he will strive to know which taxes, by their removal or reduction, will most help productive effort.

The Board hopes that East African finances will receive more regular guidance from London in future and deprecates the system of occasional visits by experts usually when conditions are very bad.

Position of Treasurers.

The Joint East African Board have discussed in detail and reported to the Colonial Office and that Government in the capacity of Financial Secretary or Financial Adviser to the Government.

The Board recommends that a general readjustment of taxation should be undertaken in conjunction with the introduction of the Income Tax which the Board understands has now been decided upon. It seems to the Board that the time is ripe for reviewing, and if necessary, making drastic alterations in the system of taxation in those Colonies where it was not yet adapted to their conditions. It is with a view to this that the Board has sought the assistance of the Joint East African Board and has invited the Board to assist in the study of the question from both legal and economic points of view.

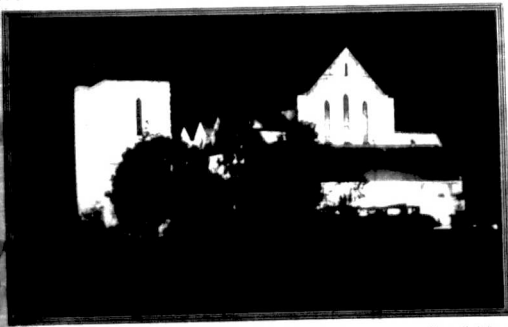
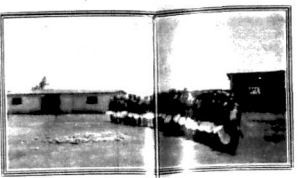

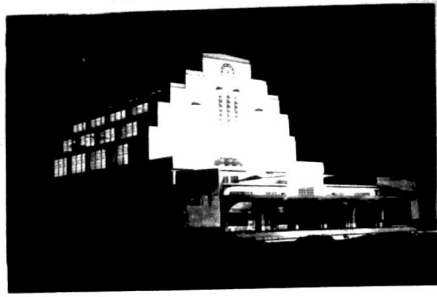

CONGRESS CRITICIZED.

The principle of election as proposed by the nomination of the Indian members of the Nairobi Municipal Council was discussed at Tuesday's meeting of this body. The subject arose from a letter sent to the Council by the Acting Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement and the debate concluded with the passing of the following resolution: That this Council is not satisfied that sufficient grounds exist as present for a justification of a departure from the present practice of nomination of Indian members by His Excellency the Governor and suggests that the present system of nomination be continued for two years.

Councillor Shams-ud-din said that he did not think the matter was so serious as it appeared to be in speaking to the above resolution. He said he proposed to nominate members that Section 5 of the Town Government Ordinance was unanimously agreed to by the whole Indian community after prolonged deliberation. He had decided that no change from the system of nomination of members should be made until a change was the desire of the whole community and he was satisfied that there was no such desire to do so.

In referring to the letter from the Commissioner for Local Government, Councillor Shams-ud-din said that it mentioned the Indian Association and the East African Indian National Congress. At one time that had been a truly representative body, but within the last five years had collapsed and it was not representative today. He suggested that the Municipal Offices which had, in the past, been looked upon as the centre of important activities was no longer an important institution.

The Muslim Association, which was really come in at all. After further references to the present status of the E.A. Indian Association, Councillor Shams-ud-din maintained that that body had lost touch with the Indian community and that it was not representative of the Indian community. He suggested that the Municipal Offices which had, in the past, been looked upon as the centre of important activities was no longer an important institution.

In conclusion Councillor Shams-ud-din said that when there was a genuine desire on the part of the whole community for a change in the system of representation on the Council he would be among the first to support it. But no such desire existed today and therefore he asked for support for the resolution which he proposed. Councillor Thabani declared that he had never been any division of opinion among the Indian members of the Council. He said that the Councilors were not coming to represent religious parties but to represent the Indian race as a whole.
