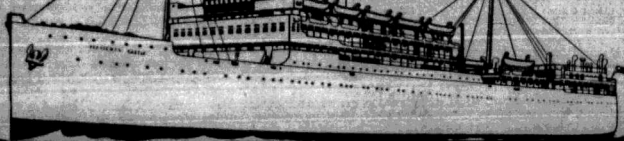

BRITAIN AGREES TO A TARIFF TRUCE.

RESULT OF PREMIER'S VISIT TO AMERICA.

Necessary Reservations.

PROGRESS ACHIEVED IN REGARD TO WAR DEBTS.

Mr. Ramsay MacDonald gave a review in the House of Commons on Thursday of the subjects discussed with President Roosevelt during his visit to America. He will also address the House on the question of the World Economic Conference on Tuesday next.

In regard to the proposals by the United States for a world tariff truce, the Premier said that Britain had agreed to the suggestion, subject to certain reservations in view of the fact that Britain was in a different position from other countries.

Considerable progress had been made in regard to the problem of war debts, but no definite agreement had yet been reached. It is stated that war debts will not be discussed by the World Economic Conference.

Valuable Co-operation.

Through Reuters' Agency, London, May 10.—Mr. Ramsay MacDonald, speaking of his visit to America in the House of Commons today, said Britain had agreed to a tariff truce pending the World Economic Conference, with restrictions on the tariff in a different position from other countries whose economic defence policies had only been developed.

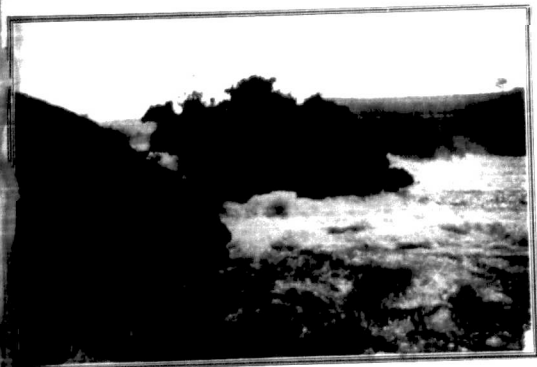

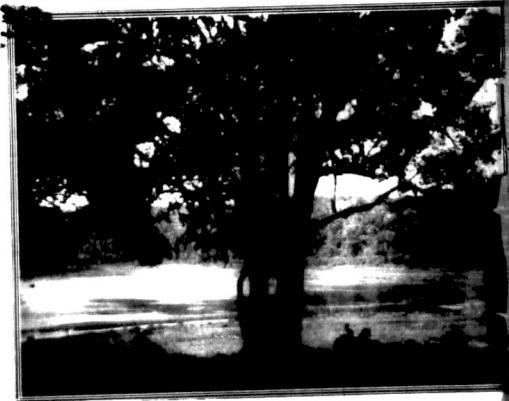

Increased Efficiency On The Railway.

WORKING COSTS FIGURE THE LOWEST IN ITS HISTORY.

Revenue Fall Checked.

PASSENGER TRAFFIC REDUCED BY MORE THAN HALF SINCE 1929.

The Annual Report of the Railways and Harbours discloses some striking figures of increased technical efficiency.

A new low record in the history of the Railways was established during the year when working costs per ton mile fell to 5.44 cents.

At the same time the serious fall in receipts per ton mile was checked and on the railway steamer and motor services rose to 10.764 compared with 9.497 in the preceding year.

It should be noted, however, that in addition to working costs there is a loan burden and depreciation which brings the total ton mile expenditure up to 10.474 cents per ton mile.

There was a further decrease in the passenger traffic. The total has fallen from 1,161,770 of all classes in 1929 to 558,492 last year.

The Burden of Loans.

One of the most encouraging features of the annual report of the Railways and Harbours for 1929 is the fact that the working costs per ton mile have fallen to 5.44 cents per ton mile.

Conference has been further postponed until Friday to permit of the attendance of Baron von Neurath the German Foreign Minister who will lead the German Delegation and who, it is expected, will disclose in full the details of Germany's confidential attitude to the disarmament conference proposals for the standardization of continental armies upon which the Geneva deadlock has arisen.

LEVY ON CIVIL SERVICE SALARIES

INCREASE URGED BY KENYA ELECTED MEMBERS.

Negated By Government.

HEAVY SACRIFICES MADE BY ALL SECTIONS OF UNOFFICIAL COMMUNITY.

It was stated in the Legislative Council yesterday that the Elected Members, although they reportedly supported the recommendation made in the minority report of the Expenditure Advisory Committee that an increased levy on Civil Service Salaries was essential for 1964.

Captain Schwartz said the justification lay in the condition of other citizens in the Colony.

Referring to farmers, he declared that in many cases they hardly had the money property to feed and clothe themselves. In the latter reductions in salaries in the majority of cases was at least 30 per cent., while business men found that 70 per cent. reduction in any way would be better off.

In the course of his reply the Colonial Secretary declared that Government saw no change in conditions which warranted a further increase in the levy on salaries.

It was also announced that the Select Committee on the Estimates had recommended to the Government preservation of the Native Registration system by effecting economies through amalgamation of departments.

The Elected Members also urged upon Government the need for financial help in order of the terms of service, both for the local Civil Service and for officers engaged overseas.

Debate on the Budget.

The debate in the Kenya Legislative Council on the Budget, which was held on May 17, 1963, opened by the Elected Members, provided for the Government to support the Budget on Wednesday on a motion to resolve in some detail several of the more important financial provisions. These included the future of the Native Registration Department, Civil Service salaries and the levy on salaries and the conditions in which the public sector of the community during the present period of depression.

The Coast Members also voiced the intention to reiterate their views on the need for greater protection of Military expenditure and the reduction of native areas. The Hon. Mr. E. Schwartz (Kisumu), Acting Leader of the Elected Members, opened the debate by referring to two previous resolutions of the Expenditure Advisory Committee which were not followed in entirety by the Government. The first was the recommendation that the levy on salaries of the Civil Service should be reduced by a 30 per cent. while supporting it as a general measure against the Government's budget. He stated that it should not be agreed to, because it was realized that the allowance was paid and the terms of the salary were not amended that it was voluntarily paying the very high cost of living. INCREASE IN INTERNAL PRICE OF MAIZE.

OBJECTION TO THE COFFEE INDUSTRY.

Objections to Proposed Scheme.

A meeting of coffee planters at Kiambu on Saturday unanimously adopted a resolution opposing proposed scheme to raise internal prices of maize in order to preserve the maize industry. It was stated that the effect of increased prices would be to throw an unbearable burden upon the coffee planters who formed the bulk of the maize consumers.

During the recent session of the Kenya Legislative Council, the Government proposed an increase in the price of maize. The Kenya Farmers' Association appears to be the only body with the experience and organization necessary to undertake the work involved. This was stated by Mr. C. M. Colburn, who said that the whole of the maize which is produced in the Colony is sold to the Government. The report is based on a survey of the maize industry in the Colony, whether by non-Indians or natives, provision being made for the sale of such maize through a single selling agency appointed by Government, with a view to the scheme.

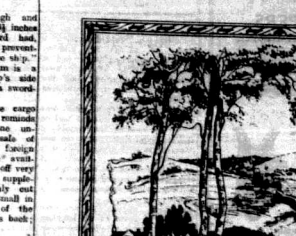
