Zambia lift must be civilian-run

TANZANIA announced yesterday that it would not allow British military personnel or military equipment into the country to help in the oil lift to Zambia.

A Government statement said the arrival of the British frigate *Dido* and about 70 men of the Royal Air Force to help the oil lift was not acceptable to Tanzania following her diplomatic break with Britain.

It added: "The character of this operation must be purely civil and not military. R.A.F. *Dido* arrived in Dar es Salaam with 200 empty tanks to help the oil lift.

Plan to Moscow reported

Civilian plans are expected to begin arriving after Christmas and the phasing out of the Transport Command Brigades should begin soon after. It was necessary to R.A.F. planes to overhaul the oil lift as a civilian fleet could not be mounted quickly enough.

Five tankers are now in Dar es Salaam working the oil lift and the 200 empty tanks with their crews, so that each plane could be refuelled after their daily flight into Zambia.

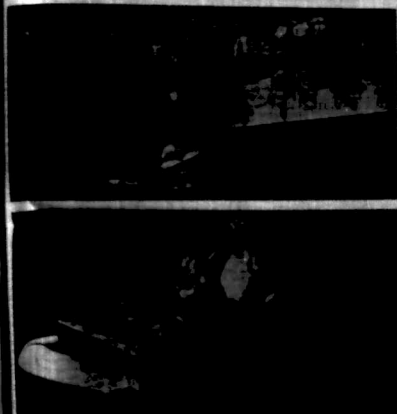

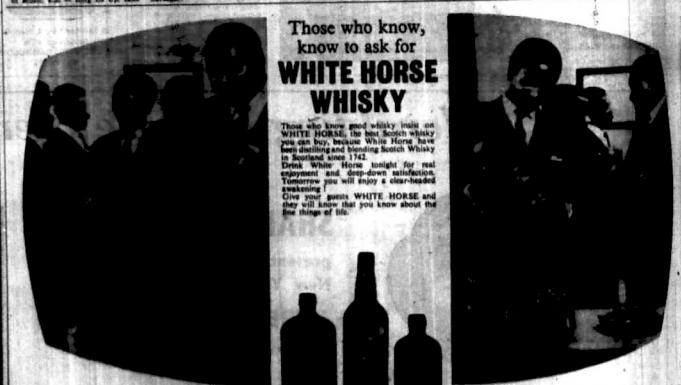

Kenya Breweries Ltd has for the last few months had several applications from farmers who wanted to take back the agreement from their own deliveries of Barley to the Maltings. Others have complained that the price of Shs 20/- per 100lb of Feed Barley is too low. These questions always arise when there is a general shortage of animal feed with a consequent increase in prices. Kenya Breweries Ltd would in this connection like to emphasize that although they have no intention of appearing on the market as dealers in animal feed which during the closing process has fallen through the 24 mm screen, a very great part of the grain being of a size far below 24 mm. and due to its high content of indigestible woody fibre its feed value is very much reduced as compared to proper Feed Barley straight off the combine.

Our Malting screens between 100 and 200 mesh of 20 mm screenings off with. As the Maltings has a very limited storage space for this commodity the screenings are disposed of as refuse as there is not enough to make a satisfactory stock and sell to the market.
