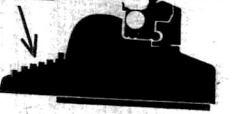

Kenya Ministers to seek money from America

FOOD NOT WANTED SAYS MR. MBOYA

A KENYA minister's intention is to visit the U.S. next month to seek help for Kenya's economic proposals for advancing development, says Mr. Mboya, Kenya's Minister for Development.

Mr. Mboya said in Nairobi yesterday that the Government had agreed to improve the cooperation between the Government and the U.S. through the U.S. Agency for International Development (A.I.D.).

The C.D.C. has agreed to help with the National City Council work which costed 2,000,000. Mr. Mboya announced that the Government will provide 1,250,000 and a German loan will provide 1,000,000.

The C.D.C. has also agreed to help at the amount of 1,000,000 for the construction of a road from Nairobi to the United States Development Authority.

A magistrate has warned about the consequences of ignoring summonses. He stated that failure to appear in court could result in a warrant being issued.

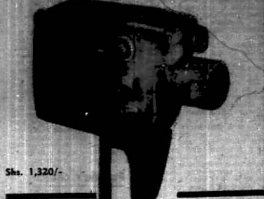


East Czech (left) and Helmut Hignaker, who after completing their 8,000-mile trip were the toughest road in the world.

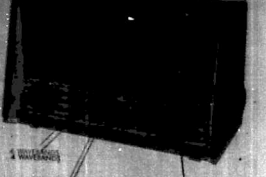

Back to normal in Nyanza

KENYA security forces have broken the back of the Kaniu Youth Wing's attempt to defy the law in Central Nyanza, the Commissioner of Police, Mr. R. C. Cullis, said in Nairobi yesterday.

He added: "Our job is to enforce the rule of law and we are going to enforce it. If any scallywags have other ideas they will soon find out."

He also visited the 11th Kenyan General Service Unit camp at Nyanza in the Akiba zone — the heart of the trouble area where the Akiba zone, which encompasses him, the Sgt. J. Sherratt, who accompanied him to the detention camps in a Police Airplane.

Mr. Cullis said he was pleased to be able to return to Nairobi and to see the return of the G.M.U. members to the area. He said he could not give an indication of when the G.M.U. members would be withdrawn to their own homes.

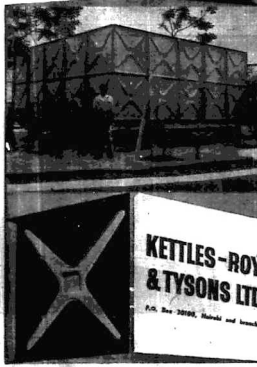

The purpose was to determine whether fine-grained disseminations of beryllium minerals exist in the Colony.

High purity beryllium, a hard white metal almost as light as magnesium but with a melting point approximately twice as great (1350 deg. C.), is used extensively in nuclear engineering.

In reactors it is employed as a moderator to slow down high speed fission neutrons and also as a reflector to reduce neutron leakage.

The investigation by two officers of the Mines and Geology Department, Dr. C. G. B. Doit, a petrologist, and Mr. W. F. Horne, chemist and assayer, began in 1959.

They report from: "From the economic point of view the investigation indicates that the igneous and metamorphic rocks of Kenya do not contain sufficient beryllium to warrant a great deal of further work."

"The indications have been obtained of disseminated beryllium deposits, but certain anomalies are noted which may indicate the presence of untraced deposits perhaps of the pegmatite variety."

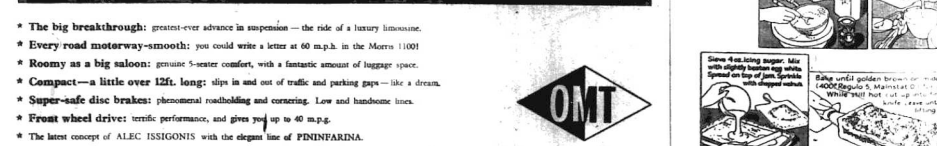

FORMAL OPENING A YEAR TO DAY AFTER BUILDING STARTED

BRIGHT airy and ultra-contemporary in style, the United Kenya Club has been in Kenya. It stands on Hospital Hill, not far from Nairobi's busy streets, in its attractive tree-lined grounds make it completely self-contained.

By a happy coincidence, the formal opening ceremony will be conducted by the Governor of Kenya, Sir Patrick Bunting tomorrow — exactly a year to the day after he laid the foundation stone.

The club has progressed a long way since it was first started in 1964. The first meeting place was a converted room in the basement of the old Club House.

Problem of site solved

By George Vannoy, the architect who designed the new club building.

THE site for the Club's new premises was a difficult one because of the unavailability of the sub-below ground drops suddenly by 20ft, and the soil above is a loose decomposed deposit.

It was therefore necessary to choose between two possible solutions to build a new extension close to Hospital Hill Road, where there was a narrow strip of red soil, or to go further out to the site of the old club building, where the soil above is a loose decomposed deposit.

The second solution would have involved the promoters in an extra expenditure of £2,000. This was not possible and as a result, the old club building had to be dismantled altogether in order to make use of the small extent of red soil.

The three-storey structure is on a concrete frame with masonry walls. To reduce the volume of concrete and thereby reduce the cost of construction, the floor slabs are cantilevered throughout.

The floor slabs are spanning 30ft, and they are set on only 14in. x 6in. below slabs. As each bedroom is provided with a private bath, it was inevitable that a large number of pipes occurred on elevations. It was decided to couple two bathrooms into a side pipe to use a common waste and manure.

By 1961 our membership had grown in numbers and size to such an extent that we were able to raise amongst ourselves a sum of money almost sufficient to see the completion of our first building club house on Hospital Hill.

The Kenya Government provided the site and made up the shortfall of £1,900 from public funds.

Our problems and difficulties increased during the first three years of emergency, but in 1964 we were able to raise our membership, and our business houses of Nairobi provided most of the finance by means of gifts, loans and donations.

Our pride in the achievement of this objective within two years of the commencement of the planning stage is tempered with gratitude to the Kenya Government and the banks and business houses of Nairobi who provided most of the finance by means of gifts, loans and donations.

There were other problems too. Almost instantly we analysed the pretensions and suspicions of the unorganised and suspicious members by reason of his political convictions, and the speakers who have addressed the club in the past 16 years have covered a wide range of thinking, liberal and reactionary, orthodox and extremist in the fields of religion, politics, economics, literature and art.

There were financial problems too. We fixed the price of our Wednesday lunches at 1/-, which the Kenya Government helped in out with an annual subvention of £250.

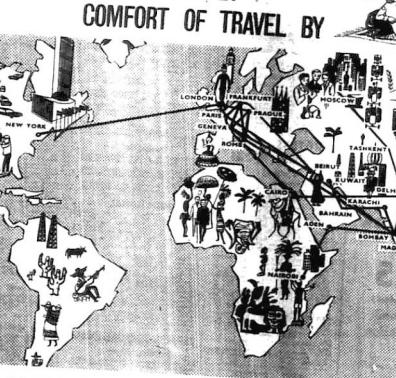

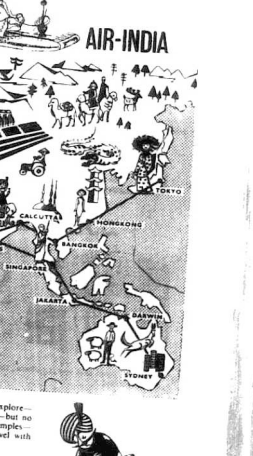

FORCED OUT OF A.A. MEET BY INJURY

KENYA'S outstanding sprinter Serwano A. Anias (Coast) will not run in the A.A.A. championships at Nakuru this weekend as a result of an injury he sustained during his recent successful overseas tour in Africa. The Coast hope to get their second string sprinter, Albert Castagna, to Nakuru but at this stage it is doubtful whether Castagna will be fit enough to run.

Anias is holder of both the 100 and 220 yards Kenya championship and of Kenyan 100 yard record of 9.9 sec. for the former and 20.9 sec. for the latter event. He trained heavily when going well in the 120 yards hurdles final.

WOULD HAVE BEEN CERTAINLY

During his overseas tour this summer he set a 100 yards time of 9.2 sec, equalling the world record in a wind-aided run on the famous Sannytry track in Dublin, as well as winning both the 100 and 220 yards in the British A.A.A. championships at the White City on July 14. It was the first time in Africa to set his best since A. McDonald Bailey, in 1953.

Anias would have been to achieve this feat as the Kenya sprint double yet again has been his. He still holds the Colony records with 9.5 for the 100 yards and 21.7 for the 220 yards and might well set new marks at Nakuru.

It is hoped he will be fit for the Kenya Individual Championships, due to take place on September 21 on the Kabete track of the Kenya Institute of Administration.
