TEACHERS GET WAGE RISE

A BREATH OF FRESH AIR



Teachers will receive a 10 per cent wage rise from September 1st, according to a decision made by the Kenya Teachers' Union. The union's secretary, Mr. J. M. Njiru, said that the rise was a result of the union's successful negotiations with the Government. He also mentioned that the union had secured other benefits for its members, including a reduction in the number of working days and an increase in the number of holidays.

Church schools fear they may lose their staff

CONFERENCE APPEAL TO MINISTER
The African Church-leaders' conference has appealed to Kenya's Minister for Education, Mr. Sogini, to allot more designated posts for teachers in Church Board schools. In a statement yesterday the Bishop of Fort Hall (E.E.), Rev. Rufus Karuki, who is chairman of the conference, said that his church-based schools they had had to agree that new overseas staff should come on designated other terms of service. However, the vacancies available had been far fewer than expected and unless the Ministry of Education could increase them they were in danger of losing valuable members of staff.

The bishop said that the churches appreciated that when Kenya was only able to pay the basic salaries of overseas teachers, Britain and other countries had to pay for pay-rises and overseas allowances. The church-leaders' conference was concerned at the lack of planning for secondary school places in Kenya, and that they anticipated the great financial difficulties under-

Government—the bishop said that the churches did not wish the Minister to take unilateral action in that matter. It was essential that the churches, who had borne the burden of education for so long, should be consulted.

Kenya to get U.S. equipment

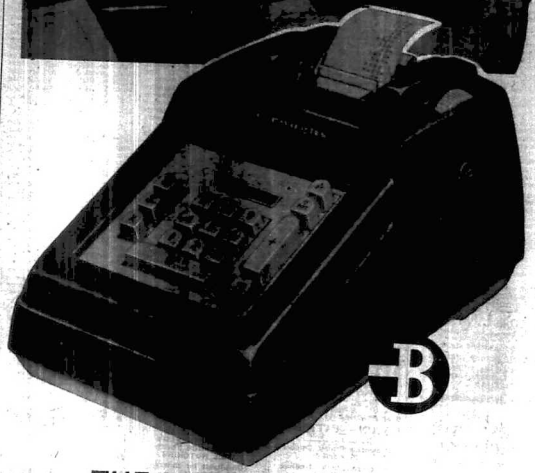
Tools and equipment contributed by manufacturers in the United States will soon be in the hands of state and local schools in 14 developing national. Through the U.S. Agency for International Development, the Tools for Freedom Foundation, new tools and equipment will be sent to a youth centre in Nairobi. Eventually, the manufacturers, through the foundation, will supply about 24,000,000 worth of new and used equipment to 200 schools in Africa, Asia and South America each year. The foundation is a non-profit organization.

TEACHER JAILED

A teacher of the Holy Trinity Church Board school at Mombasa was jailed for 14 days for refusing to accept a 10 per cent wage rise. The teacher, Mr. J. M. Njiru, was charged with disobeying the school's authority. He was found guilty and sentenced to 14 days in jail. The school's headmaster, Mr. J. M. Njiru, said that the teacher's refusal to accept the wage rise was a serious matter and that the school had no choice but to take action.

Minimum wage rates laid down in report

A CHARTER for the Kenya's 2,500 domestic servants is recommended in a Government report published last night. Its purpose would be to set minimum wages and conditions of service for various grades of domestic staff.

NO ENFORCEMENT IN PAST

In a foreword to the report, Mr. Mboya comments: "My Ministry does not intend at this stage to embark on a policy of enforcement... but will be prepared to reconsider that matter if fair labour practices are not observed in this field of employment."

When the Government's finances improve, further attempts will be made to enforce the recommendations that some forms of training should be provided for householders in every class.

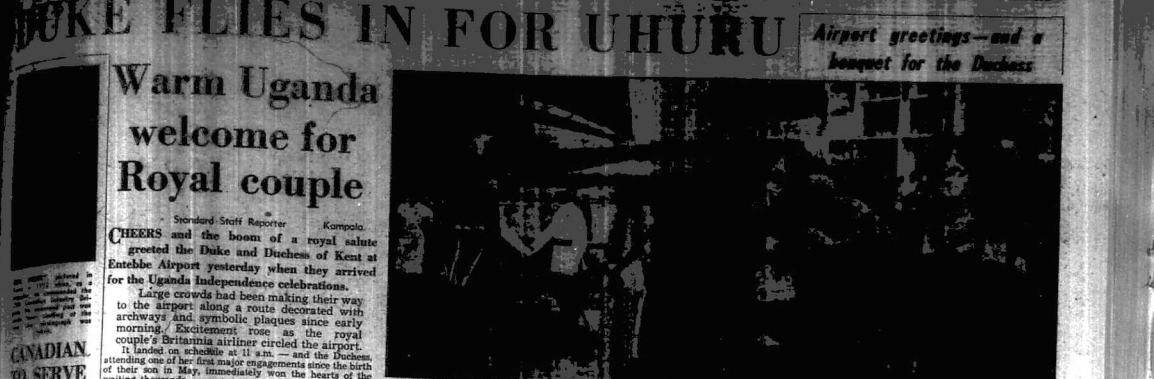

MR. OBOTE DISCLOSES UGANDA'S POLICIES

UGANDA'S Prime Minister, Mr. Obote, yesterday gave a brief outline of his country's policies both at home and overseas — now that it has achieved independence. In a wide-ranging discourse, Mr. Obote touched on subjects as far apart as localisation and Uganda's attitude towards the European Common Market.

As for the future prospects for Europeans and Asians in the country, he said he has had a 'good future' because the Government had to think of the needs of the African people, not of race. European civil servants had been given a very firm undertaking. The Government will be a policy of 'appointing local people to the services when they have high enough qualifications, but refused to appoint a local man just because he was local.'

His country intended to maintain a close relationship with its European and Asian neighbours. It had no intention of trying to disrupt common services but intended to strengthen them. Relationships with other neighbours to the north and west must also be strengthened.

In a reference to the European Common Market, the Prime Minister said that he was afraid of losing Uganda's neutral image by acceptance of any associate membership for anyone from any country, however powerful, to use Uganda as a breeding ground for ideological warfare.

Political federation

South Africa's Government would not be recognised by the Uganda Government, nor would that of the Central African Federation — unfortunately, because it was a member of the Commonwealth. He and he disagreed with those in Central Africa who said the Federation should go. 'I do not see why it should. All we need is to remove the veto and have a better Federation supported by the people.'

Asked how enthusiastic Uganda was on East African political federation, Mr. Obote said that Tanganyika had sponsored an investigating commission and Uganda would enthusiastically support it. Obviously there could not be much unity at present when two of the countries were independent and the third was British-ruled. When Kenya was independent, 'we shall talk.'

With regard to the country's relationship with Portugal, Mr. Obote said he was very disturbed about Portugal's policy in Africa. Portugal would have to learn the hard way and it might not be good for her. He would soon be explaining the Government's decision on this.

Although the Government intended to support all nationalist African movements and governments, and would not support any government which it thought was being directed against its people.

No republican plans

For the past 70 years Uganda had been a Protectorate and 'I see that this country has gained by that protection,' Mr. Obote said. 'I know that it is a common thing to hear that condemnation is neo-colonialism and while I do not condemn it, I have a sore heart for the protection we have had here.'

On the 10th morning Mr. Obote had taken part on the oath of allegiance. He asked if there were any plans for making Uganda a republic. He pointed out that apart from loyalty to the king there were four other kingdoms in Uganda and, therefore, there could be no question of becoming a republic at the moment.

GOOD WILL FROM MR. MACMILLAN

THE following message from the British Prime Minister, Mr. Macmillan, was handed to Uganda's Prime Minister, Mr. Obote, by Lord Carrington, leader of the British delegation to the celebrations.

'Dear Prime Minister, I am delighted to send you by the hand of Lord Carrington, the best wishes of the British Government and myself.'

'We rejoice with you on this happy day when Uganda achieves her independence and we most cordially welcome your country as a member of the Commonwealth.'

'I am sure that the greatest pleasure to extend to you and to your Government are warm good wishes for the future peace and prosperity of your country.'

'We look forward with confidence to the continuation and development in new fields of the friendship and understanding which have marked the association of Britain and Uganda in the past.'

U.S. OFFERS \$2m. LOAN

The United States has offered \$2,000,000 (270,000) loan to finance development projects in Uganda this year.

The offer was announced by Secretary of State Dean Rusk's personal representative, South African Ambassador to the Uganda Independence celebrations, when called on the Prime Minister, Mr. Obote, yesterday.



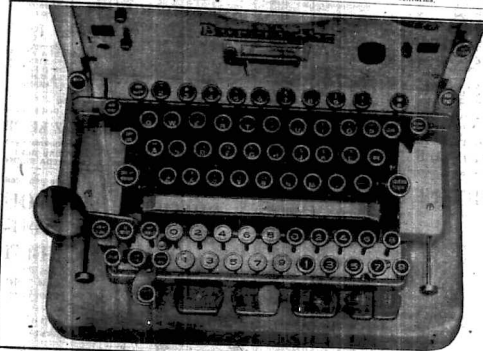
