## The King Thanks The Empire

### Reply to Addresses from the Dominions

#### "MEMBERS OF A GREAT HAPPY FAMILY"

#### Impressive Ceremony at St. James' Palace

#### GATHERING OF REPRESENTATIVES FROM ALL PARTS OF THE BRITISH REALM

There was a most impressive ceremony at St. James' Palace on Wednesday, when His Majesty received a notable assembly consisting of Dominion Premiers, Empire representatives and Ambassadors of foreign countries, who tendered their congratulations on behalf of their respective peoples on the occasion of Their Majesties' Silver Jubilee.

In reply to the addresses by the representatives of the Dominions, His Majesty said that their messages were an inspiration and an encouragement to continue the task which he had set himself to perform twenty-five years ago.

The King requested the Dominion Premiers to take a message of affection to every member of "this great family of which I am so proud and thankful to be the head."

### A Second Pageant

London, May 8. The Jubilee in the strenuous round of Jubilee celebrations was held yesterday and again today. His Majesty, repaid all yesterday when the Queen drove to St. James' Palace, at which she received a great ovation from thousands of people. The only official ceremony was the Dinner of Wales reception at St. James' Palace, at which he shook hands with some 2,000 guests, including Cabinet Ministers and Dominion Ministers and members of the Diplomatic Corps. Last night the King and Queen demonstrated outside Buckingham Palace and at the Buckingham Palace ballroom. The crowd numbered the King and Queen with "God Save the King" (Hole Britannia) and "To Her a Holly God Follow." Both Their Majesties obviously enjoying the demonstration and waving their hands to the crowd in acknowledgement.

**Their Majesties Thanks**  
Friday, Their Majesties returned thanks to the nations of the world for their congratulations tendered on the occasion of the Jubilee. The King, wearing the uniform of an Admiral of the Fleet, drove from Buckingham Palace accompanied by the Queen, who followed in a dark limousine with white furs. The Royal car was escorted by the huge crowd assembled at the Palace. The Courtiers and Irish Guards were drawn up, and the bands played the National Anthem.

On arrival at St. James' Palace, Their Majesties proceeded to the Throne Room, where the King received a notable assembly consisting of Ambassadors, Ministers, Empire representatives, etc., including the Dominion Premiers who are present in London. The Brazilian Ambassador, as the driver of the Royal limousine, conveyed congratulations to the King on behalf of his colleagues and then the four Dominion Prime Ministers expressed the sentiments of their Dominions and each presented to His Majesty an address passed by the Dominion Parliaments, to which the King replied.

Mr. Bussac MacDonald, one of the other Dominion Premiers, said the Jubilee medals that had been presented to them by the King. Following the presentation of the four Dominion addresses, Mr. G. G. **THE ADDRESS FROM PARLIAMENT**  
Distinguished Gathering at Westminster  
[By W. W. W.]  
Buckingham Palace, May 9. The second great pageant of the Jubilee week took place today when the King and Queen drove to Westminster Hall to receive the Addresses to the King by both Houses of Parliament. Their Majesties were escorted by their sons and the Princess Royal, the Duke of Edinburgh, and the Earl of Athlone, and other members of the Royal Family, with the ladies and gentlemen in attendance who drove to Westminster in closed motor cars in advance of the King and Queen.

Despite a cold east wind, the King and Queen travelled in an open limousine. It was drawn by four bay horses and was escorted by the King's Guard, and in other respects it was an intimate occasion. The King wore simple morning dress with a black overcoat and silk hat. There were no military units lining the route, this day being left to the police. Great crowds gathered to watch the progress and there were deafening cheers as Their Majesties drove by.

**COMMONS ADDRESS**  
Striking Proof of Devotion  
The strong devotion of the House of Commons to the Throne was strikingly affirmed after noon, when the Prime Minister, Mr. James MacDonnell, moved that an Address be presented to His Majesty by the whole House, on the occasion of His Majesty's Silver Jubilee.

He said that the Speaker of the House, in common with his colleagues, exercised an ancient right and would address the King on behalf of the House in person. Mr. MacDonnell eloquently reviewed the services rendered by the House to the Empire in its seven years' term. He said "He has been the Crown not only with the preservation and care of the British Empire, but also with the maintenance of a constitutionally elected government, but also with the protection of his people's rights on all subjects, but as human beings."

Mr. George Lansbury, leader of the Opposition, in responding to the motion said that he considered that His Majesty's broadcast speech on May 6, was unsurpassed in the history of monarchs of any time.

### His Majesty's Broadcast Address

FULL TEXT OF AN INSPIRING MESSAGE

In view of its historic interest and importance the full text of the speech broadcast by His Majesty the King on Jubilee Day has been obtained from the Kenya Government and is republished below.

"At the close of this memorable day, I must speak to my people everywhere. Yet how can I express what is in my heart? As I thought this morning through the cheering multitudes to and from Saint Paul's Cathedral, as I thought there of all these 25 years have brought to me and to my country and my Empire, how could I fail to be most deeply moved? Words cannot express my thoughts and feelings. I can only say to you, my very dear people, that the Queen and I think you from the depth of our hearts for all the loyalty and may I say the love with which this day and always you have surrounded us. I dedicate myself anew to your service for the years that may still be given to me."

**A Message for Youth**  
"It is to the young that the future belongs. I trust that through funds inaugurated by my dear son, if we meet them with confidence, courage and unity. So I look forward to the future with faith and hope."

**To the Children I would like to send a special message. Let me say this to each of them whom my words may reach: the King is speaking to you. I ask you to remember in the days to come you will be the citizens of a great Empire. As you grow up, keep this thought before you; and when the time comes be ready and proud to give your country the service of which I am so proud and thankful to be the head."**

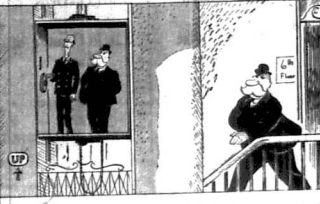

significance to open it." He refused to feeling a little jealous when he compared the architecture of the Town Hall and accommodation provided in it with what was provided for himself as Colonial Secretary at the Secretariat.

"However that may be," he added, "citizens Nairobi do genuinely appreciate all that you, Mr. Mayor, and your Committee do for us, and we think it quite right that you should be adequately housed and do your work under the best of conditions."

Referring to the value of a visit spent among the people who revealed the view that Nairobi was rapidly acquiring such a spirit, "Twenty years ago," he said, "it was the fashion to speak disparagingly of the town as a collection of shacks and temporary structures. That attitude, however, now belongs to the past."

The people of Nairobi were becoming increasingly proud of their town, and its streets, and signs, and tanks and public buildings were a real pride in its appearance and amenities. The Mayor and the Town Hall represented a great step towards progress in this direction.

He paid a tribute to the public spirited citizens who had all played a part in bringing about this improvement, adding that all were indebted to the work of Messrs. G. M. Meyers, Mr. Henderson, Mr. G. G. Ullal, Mr. Ishaki, Mr. T. A. Wood, Mr. Mayor, Mr. Mortimer. But it was a fact on which there were two opinions, he said.

Mr. Bompas in deviation to the town's interests and welfare, and in the interests of the Town Hall, Mr. Bompas was universally regarded.

Looking back into Nairobi's city history, he recalled that the first meeting of a local authority in Nairobi was held as long ago as July, 1900. That body was constituted as a Municipal Commission and as such it remained until 1921 when it became a Municipal Corporation, which, in its turn, was transformed into the present Nairobi City Council in 1928. It was interesting to note that in a minute of the first meeting of the old Commission it was recorded that Mr. J. J. McKinnon, said, "One of the first things to be done is to have the Bazaar laid out on modern lines."

"That problem, I believe, is still before your Council," he said addressing the Mayor.

In his opening appreciation of the work that was being done by the Council, he stated that it was his personal intention to single out any particular branch of the work of the Council for special mention, but as a former Chief Native Commissioner he might perhaps be forgiven for saying how much he appreciated the work that was being done for the African—particularly with regard to improving their conditions of living and the amenities that were available to them. He knew how deeply interested in this work Mr. Bompas was personally, and also the Deputy Mayor, Mr. Mortimer, and he was also aware of the great deal of work done by Mr. Gray and Mr. Young of the Native Affairs Committee.

With over 20,000 persons of different tribes among who was largely a shifting population, the work could not be easy and they could not expect perfection in a moment. Nevertheless, he recognized that the Council was doing admirably well in its important part of its work.

"Your Worship," he continued, "I want to take this opportunity of expressing my deep appreciation of the work that you, Mr. Mayor, and your Committee are doing for us."

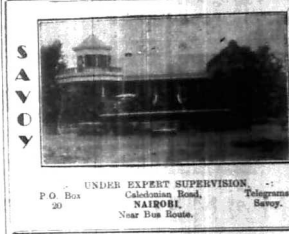

## Types of Dhows on The East Coast of Africa

### The Most Ancient of Sailing Vessels

## DESIGNS OF MANY CENTURIES AGO

All up and down the East African coast and from ports as far afield as those of Aden, the Persian Gulf and the Gulf of Ombé, sail the Arab ships known as "dhows," boats that cross the Indian Ocean reaching Africa from the returning monsoon in the evening and returning at noon as the south-west monsoon is established.

Manned by Arab or Rajasthani, whose knowledge of sea matters has been handed down from father to son for many generations, the dhows still ply a trade in defiance of modern competition some idea of the extent of which can be gained from the fact that the figure for the construction and purchase of dhows continues and increases. In 1912, in the Kenya alone for 1912 was 7,120.

old boats centred round these boats. For instance, no M'Pete will carry a cargo of coconuts. The reason for this is vaguely explained to the effect that as the planks are sewn together with coconut fibre, a cargo of coconuts will ruin the hull and tends to force open the seams of the boat and make it leak, but there is probably some ancient superstition at the bottom of this objection to coconuts.

Like the other coastal dhows, the Bataals, the M'Petes also carry copra, firewood, hides and palm-leaf roofing.

A very curious thing about the M'Petes is that they are always to be seen flying an amazing number of small flags and pennants, each of which has a particular meaning. The most important is the white whip-lash pennant which flies at the mast head. One explanation regarding this pennant is that it is the flag of a certain Persian Sultan, a Greek sailor of Alexandria, mentions the "Sown boats" of the East African coast.

Anyone who visits Lamu to-day can see these dhows being built in exactly the same way as they were fashioned thousands of years ago. Roughly sawn timbers are used—usually mangrove timber—in which holes are bored, ear rope then being passed through the holes very much in the manner in which one laces a shoe. The rope is then tanned and a mangrove plug is driven through hole to fit the "eye." Not one single nail is used in the whole of the M'Pete's construction for even the rudder is fastened on with rope. The masts are mangrove poles and there is one sail, made of matting which is square and sewed round the mast. The sides of the M'Pete are brought straight down to the level, which is not rounded in any way, and, when beached, the boat is kept level by propping the sides with mangrove poles.

Another explanation is to the effect that the Bajan tribe, the native inhabitants of the Bajan

Islands where these boats are built, once lived on the mainland far away from the coast, but as punishment for their wicked ways, they were ordered by God to leave their homes and go down to the sea in ships, and so work out their salvation. The white pennant, therefore, represents the power and the punishment of God and no other flag of any kind may be flown above it.

Below the whip-lash pennant comes an enormous flag, white streamer, known as the "otaka," which shows that the vessel comes in peace. This is the survival of the Arabian-Portuguese period of the sixteenth century, when the sea ports of East Africa were constantly involved in warfare and the ships that sailed in those days were usually intent on war.

The small white flag, on the foremast and the ornament, under the bowsprit indicate the importance of the passengers and are spoken of as the board of the stern and a series of small red streamers on the big white streamer as the mast head men sail all the great boats, which do not set out from her origin, port.

There is one type of M'Pete in which the bowsprit is curved in a manner which is supposed to represent the neck of a camel. This is done to commemorate a shaman which was married in the Bajan, was sent from Heaven to the Thamm—an ancient Arabian

who refused to accept it as a divine token and killed it. The eye, painted in white on the prow, is the camel's eye while a lot of red paint smeared on below the foremast represents the slaughter of the sacred animal. The prow is further decorated with a number of tassels which are supposed to be the tassels seen on the camel's head of most riding camels.

The crew accommodation on the bigger M'Petes for they are not always all the same size—as many as fifteen are employed as they have to pull the boat along in shallow water when the water, ear matting is stretched along each side from bow to stern.

Both types of coastal dhows are extraordinarily well suited for local trade, as their shallow draught enables them to go in and out of all sorts of little creeks and inlets that no steam-

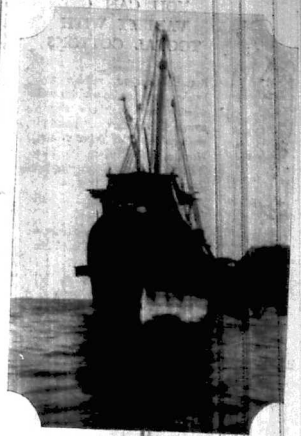

ship could possibly enter. Custom is arranged on the top of the cargo with bags and matting, and a small awning is stretched, and there is always a great quantity of fresh water, which is the reason why they can hold their own so successfully against steamer competition.

The coastal dhows are usually loaded with as much cargo as they can carry, and so there is no ac-

commodation for the crew, who live, work the ship, cook and eat on the top of the cargo.

European Passengers  
If a European passenger comes aboard, it is sometimes the case that this revolving trade in human beings was eventually stopped.

Types of Vessels  
There are four principal types of dhows: the "Bataals," which bring cargoes of dried fish—

dhows, the "Bataals," are low vessels with long, projecting prows, sharp stems, a very high rudder-head and latton sails. They only come from the Persian Gulf, bringing cargoes of dried fish—

that cross to Africa from Persia, Arabia and India; the "Bataals," which only come from the Persian Gulf and the M'Petes and the "Bataals," which are used for the coasting trade between the East African ports only.

The "Bataals" are much larger vessels than the coasting dhows, sometimes exceeding 300 tons, and they have two or even three masts, abruptly raised bowsprits and wondrously carved curl-like sterns, which make them look much like the sailing ships of the Middle Ages days—not surprising when one realizes that their design is centuries old. Indeed the strange keelings of these ships is almost exactly the same as that

sharp and barracuda—an extraordinary unpleasant-smelling form of foodstuff that is very popular with the coast Arabs and Swahilis. The Bataals that come from Arabia also bring dried fish and shell, while those from the Gulf of Cutch are usually laden with Mangrove tiles. On their return voyage they all carry low-grade maize and mangrove poles.

The Coastal Dhows  
Of the coastal dhows, far the most interesting are the M'Petes, which are built in the Rajasthani islands of the Lamu Archipelago and also in the islands off the coast of Italian Somaliland. The design of these is probably one of

the M'Petes are largely used for the "Borri" trade, borri being mangrove poles used by the natives for building purposes. The average cargo is 1,000 "borrias" of borri—i.e., 20,000 mangrove poles, each being about eight feet long with a base diameter of four inches.

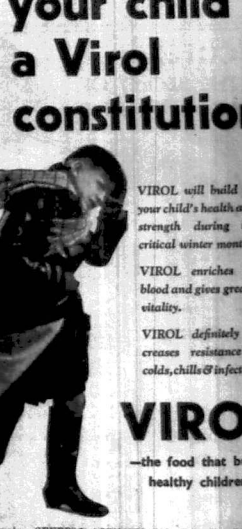

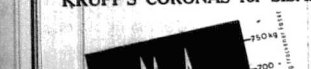

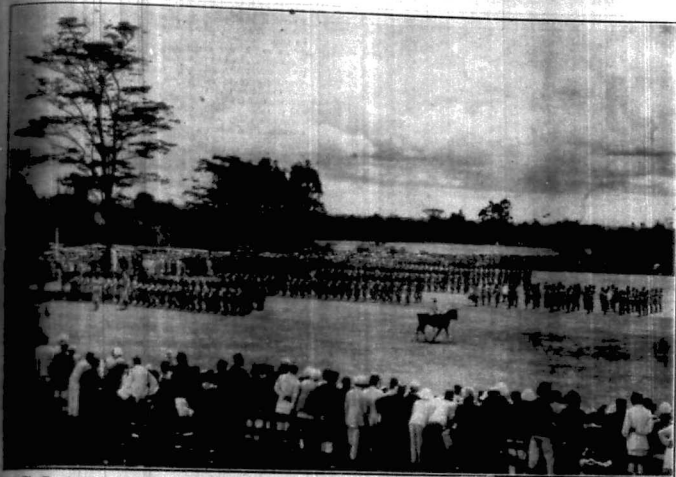

Historic Ceremony

BRITISH THRONE STANDS FIRMER THAN EVER IN NATIONAL LIFE

The historic ceremony at Westminster Hall, when both Houses of Parliament presented to Their Majesties Jubilee addresses of congratulation and loyalty, was a brilliant and an impressive one.

The House of Lords address concluded with the statement: 'Your Majesty's own personality has made the Throne, not merely a symbol, but a loved and living reality.'

The Commons address said: 'With the aid of the Queen you have won something warmer than allegiance and more profound than loyalty.'

Enormous crowds again gathered outside Buckingham Palace during the State Banquet, and tumultuously cheered all the members of the Royal Family when they appeared on the balconies.

Drive in South-West London

An Imperial Parliament



Taveta area, but he also shot in other parts of Kenya, as well as in the Delgoon Camp, Tumbuka and Uganda. He was particularly fond of horses.

Shortly after the inception of the Kenya branch of the British Legion in 1929 he became a member, and continued as such until his death.

Noted for his bright and generous disposition, he was a well-known and popular figure in the Colony and his passing will be regretted by all who had the privilege of knowing him.

Captain Hutchinson was an occasional contributor to the correspondence columns of the *East African Standard*, his letters having to do chiefly with the affairs of the smaller dairy farmer operating at some distance from the Co-operative Creameries.

He is survived by his wife. Their only son died in Nairobi some two years ago at the age of 28 years. Capt. Hutchinson was 62 years old. The funeral took place at the Forest Road Cemetery yesterday afternoon.

**MRS. E. H. BEDDING**  
Widow of an Early Pioneer

An old resident of Kenya—one of the Colony's pioneer women—Mrs. Elizabeth Hannah Bedding, died at the home of her son-in-law, Mr. A. G. Nourse, Nairobi, on Thursday night after an illness which had lasted practically since Mrs. Bedding was widowed eleven years ago.

Mrs. Bedding, who was sixty-three years of age when her husband died in 1923, was employed as an engineer by the Electric Light Company to erect the plant (the first in the Highlands) at Elgeyo. They were among the first residents in the district. He had been a valued member of the engineering staff of the firm of Hollis Royle and was intimately connected with the designing and construction of the first models of the now world-famous car.

When the war broke out, Mrs. Bedding joined one of the technical branches. After the war she was a partner at the time of his death.

**ROYAL TOURNAMENT**

**Opened by Prince of Wales This Week**

The theme of this year's Royal Tournament, which will be opened by the Prince of Wales at Olympia on May 9, is to be cooperation between the fighting Services. By taking the last 300 years of British history the pageant will show that this inter-dependence, first between the Army and Navy, and later between all three Services, is no new factor, but has been one of the surest defenses of the British Empire. The pageant will be divided into four phases:

1. The Army address and the Navy salute.
2. The Army serving with the Navy abroad.
3. The Navy serving with the Army ashore.
4. The three fighting Services working in unison.

The choice of the Queen's Royal Regiment to represent the Army is a happy one. The Regiment is the oldest English line Regiment and a year after its formation in 1661 it first co-operated with the Navy.

The Lord Chancellor's address occupied seven minutes, the Speaker's five, and the King spoke for just over 10 minutes. When he reached the passage referring to the Queen, his voice momentarily faltered.

The ceremony concluded with the band playing "God Save the King," and the Lord Chancellor, sitting without precedent called for three cheers, which were respectfully given.

The whole ceremony occupied half an hour and immediately after the end the bells of Westminster Abbey broke out with cheerful peal.

The sun shone brilliantly and Their Majesties drove back to Buckingham Palace accompanied by a tremendous rear of cheers from the assembled crowds. The King wore morning dress and the Queen made a striking figure in a white shimmering gown.

**THE STATE BANQUET**  
Brilliant Gathering at the Palace

London, May 10.

There was a brilliant scene at Buckingham Palace this evening when Their Majesties entertained 150 distinguished guests at the State Banquet.

The King was resplendent in the scarlet and gold full-dress uniform of Colonel-in-Chief of the Coldstream Guards.

The women were served on gold plate and the sweets on the famous Garter China.

In addition to the Royal Family the guests included Mr. Ramsey MacDonald, the Dundee Prime Minister and representatives and prominent statesmen and their wives.

**More Cheering Crowds**

The mass appearance of the Royal Family on the balcony of Buckingham Palace delighted the large crowd which had watched the arrival of the guests to the State Banquet and had waited in the hope of seeing Their Majesties. At 10.40 p.m., the King accompanied by the Prime Minister, appeared on the balcony, followed by the Queen and the Princess

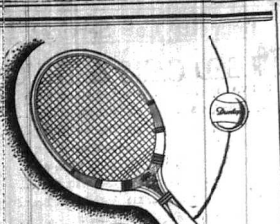
