MANCHUKUO: "FIFTY-FIFTY" CHANCE OF WAR

"Depends On Soviet" Says Japanese Spokesman

FRONTIER "BATTLES"

"THE CHANCES OF WAR ARE FIFTY-FIFTY. IT ALL DEPENDS ON THE SOVIET," BO SAID A JAPANESE FOREIGN OFFICE SPOKESMAN, REPLYING TO A POINT-BLANK QUESTION PUT BY A PRESS REPRESENTATIVE WHEN HE WAS INTERVIEWED ABOUT THE TENSION BETWEEN JAPAN AND RUSSIA, WHICH HAS INCREASED ENORMOUSLY DURING THE WEEK-END.

The happenings on the Manchukuo border appear to have passed beyond what can be described as "incidents," and if Japanese reports are to be believed, have almost assumed the proportions of pitched battles. For it is reported that 1,200 Russians took part in an engagement, and left behind 30 dead, and two tanks, when they were beaten off.

Moscow has said little, except that Russian troops have never once crossed the frontier, and has sent a strong and warning note to Japan "to do all she can to prevent war, in view of her commitments in China."

August 2. The frontier dispute between Japan and Russia has become a tense situation as the result of further intrusions and raids by Russian aircraft on the territory.

Rome, says a Tokyo telegram, the Japanese Government has called to meet a situation recently by a series of agreements.

Moscow is sending a strong protest against what it calls "Japanese provocations" and has warned Japan of the possible consequences.

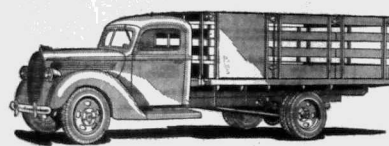

Judge's Conclusions At Njoro Trial

Judgment was given on Saturday in the trial of the two Kikuyu natives accused of the murder of Mr. Frank White at Njoro. One—Wakubo—was convicted of manslaughter and sentenced to 12 years' hard labour and the other, Koina, was acquitted. The verdicts have already appeared in the "East African Standard."

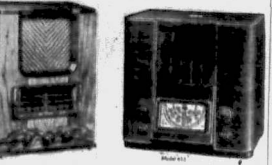

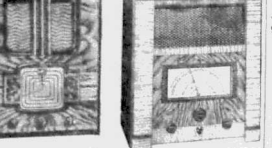

NO LESSENING OF TENSION BEFORE END OF CHANGKI FENG

Day-Long Fighting And Many Air Raids Reported

RED ARMY ENGAGED

THROUGHOUT YESTERDAY, FIGHTING TOOK PLACE ROUND CHANGKI FENG, THE CENTRE OF THE RUSSO-JAPANESE FRONTIER DISPUTE, AND TWO ASPECTS OF THE SITUATION ARE CAUSING INCREASING CONCERN TO THE JAPANESE AUTHORITIES. THESE ARE THE PARTICIPATION FOR THE FIRST TIME OF REGULAR RED ARMY TROOPS, AND THE INCREASED NUMBER OF AIR RAIDS ON MANGCHUKUO AND NORTH KOREA.

News denied the reports of air raids, which, it declares, are being put about by Japanese army leaders to excite the masses, and meetings of Soviet workers have pledged the people's support against "insolent Japanese militarists".

Both Moscow and Tokyo profess to be in doubt whether the incidents on the frontier are ordered from the opposite kind quarters or whether the local authorities are responsible.

A second Russian attack was reported by the Japanese Embassy in Tokyo. The Japanese stated that they had reason to believe that the day's attacks marked the first serious appearance of the regular Red Army troops. However, only the leader groups had been engaged. These attacks were followed by a serious view of the situation. In the fighting today three or four Russian battalions were said to have been engaged with about 10 guns and 30 tanks. Another said "The Chinese troops reported to be in the vicinity of the Manchurian frontier are being ordered to take the offensive and to attack the Japanese territory now engaged in our warfare activity, and that they were not challenged."

A Soviet aeroplane was brought down, says a Tokyo newspaper, during eight bombs on a rail line near Suifu during a raid by two planes. The Japanese spokesmen were said that one of the Soviet aeroplanes was shot down and the pilot was killed. 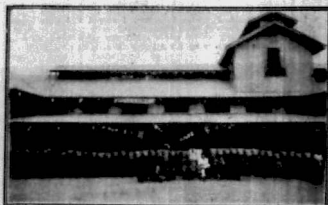

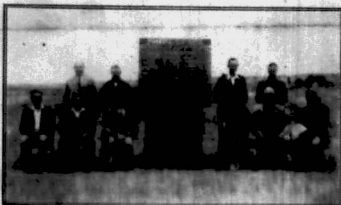

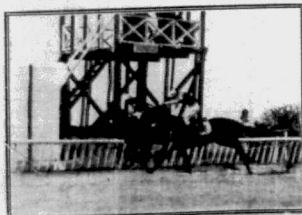
