Stone Age Finds in South Kavirondo

EARLY 'HOMO SAPIENS' REMAINS UNEARTHED NEAR KARUNGU

By Archdeacon Owen TO BE SUBMITTED TO EMINENT EXPERT FOR EXAMINATION

Portions of a human skeleton—that of a man who probably died 50,000 years ago—have been found near Karungu by Archdeacon W. E. Owen. Further skeletal remains, including a complete jaw, were found on February 1 when geologists of the Kenya and Uganda Governments took part in the search.

Probably 50,000 Years Old

What is regarded as an archaeological discovery of more than ordinary importance is reported from Karungu in the South Kavirondo District, Victoria Nyanza. It includes human skeletal fragments which are being sent at once to the anthropologist Mr. Arthur Keith for examination.

The credits for the discovery go to the Viceroy, Archdeacon Owen, who, on November 19 last, while hunting for Stone Age remains, found in a gully fragments of a human skull in a deposit more than 100 feet above the present level of the Lake.

By the kindness of the Government concerned, Mr. E. J. Wyldon, Director of Geological Survey in Uganda, and Dr. E. C. Huxford, the Kenya Government Geologist, were sent to Karungu with Archdeacon Owen. Further fragments were found, including the jaw of the lower jaw complete.

Associated with the fragments were large numbers of bones, most of them of a fragmentary condition and a few tools of the flint-chert type.

Last Minute Find The discovery of the jaw was made under rather dramatic circumstances. Archdeacon Owen had his companions on February 2 in the site of his original discoveries and they began digging at the spot where the first skull fragments had been found.

COLONISTS NOT CHATELLETS TO BE USED FOR BARGAINING PURPOSES

"The people in England must realise that we out here are bargaining with foreign powers. We are their own people, trying to make a part of Empire. If they won't help us, we must help ourselves."

This was a concluding passage in a speech by Major Cavendish-Bentick, M.L.C., for Nairobi North, at a meeting organised by the Nairobi Association in the New Stanley Hotel on Wednesday night, when he reviewed the work and progress of the Elected Members and the Vigilance Committee, discussed future prospects, and defended those who were described as 'adjected politicians'.

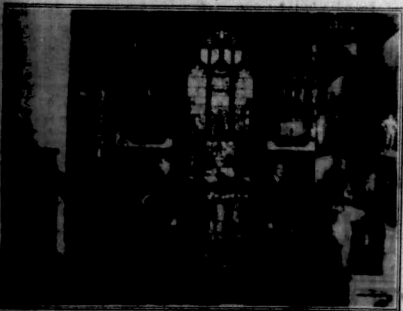

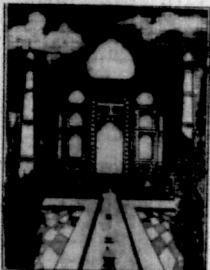

Annual Meeting of the Parishioners

The Annual General Meeting of the parishioners of St. Mark's Church was held on Wednesday at the house of the Rev. Alan Gordon. About fifty people were present, including the Bishop of Mombasa, Dr. E. S. Heywood, Dr. Jex Blake was in the Chair.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Canon Wingfield Digby after which the Chairman gave a short account of the activities of St. Mark's Church for the preceding year.

Commenting upon the appointment of a permanent vicar and welcoming the Rev. Alan Gordon to that capacity, the Chairman said it gave him an opportunity of saying how grateful the parish was to the Rev. Canon Wingfield Digby for their ready help, given by Canon Wingfield Digby, in the running of the parish during the last three years.

In speaking of the retirement of the Bishop of Mombasa, Dr. E. S. Heywood, Dr. Jex Blake thanked him for all his hard work, patience, and just dealing with all members of the community of his scattered diocese. The Chairman concluded by thanking the many helpers for all they had done during the past year: Mr. W. Loebbel, the chairman, Archbishop Burns, for help with the services; Dr. and Mrs. Anderson for their ready assistance; Lady MacMillan, for supplying flowers all year; Mr. Nairn, Messrs. Gill and Johnson; the organist, the Sunday School Superintendent; and many others. He paid a final, very warm tribute to Mr. F. G. Robinson, the People's Warden, for his faithfulness and hard work.

Canon Wingfield Digby replied briefly to the Chairman's remarks. He hoped that the Empire Day Thanksgiving service would be continued, for he thought that British people had a great deal to be thankful for nationally. He thanked everybody for the kindness and support they had given him while he had been acting vicar of St. Mark's.

The Treasurer's report showed that the income for the year was £2,582/35, and the balance of income over expenditure, Shs. 1,050/7.

Office Bearers

The following were elected to the Council for 1936: Dr. G. V. Anderson (Vicar's Warden), Major Millett (Acting People's Warden in the absence of Mr. F. G. Robinson), Colonel H. B. Terry (Chairman of the Council), Mr. W. A. Curman (Hon. Secretary), and Mr. M. Allen (Treasurer). The other Members of the Council elected were: Dr. Jex Blake (Acting Chairman while Colonel Turner is in South Africa); Lady Marie-Jer-Hilken-Mendham; Canonous Bompas, Wright and Stewart; and Messrs. Broad, Gemon, McCabe and Drinkwater.

Dr. Anderson proposed the appointment of the Rev. A. R. Gordon as permanent vicar of St. Mark's Church.

The Bishop of Mombasa said how glad he was that St. Mark's had enabled him to keep Mr. Gordon in his diocese.

The proposal was seconded by Mr. F. G. Robinson and carried. The service of induction, which is a very ancient ceremony, will take place on Sunday evening at St. Mark's Church. In his new duties the Rev. A. Gordon will be assisted by the Rev. F. L. Law. The proceedings concluded with a vote of thanks to the Chairman, after which the Bishop of Mombasa gave the blessing.

E.A. COURT OF APPEAL
Important Case from
Nyasaland
For the first time in recent years there was a full bench of judges in the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa to hear two appeals yesterday. The cases concerned the Joseph Shadrach, Chief Justice of Kenya (President), Sir S. H. Abraham, Chief Justice of Tanganyika, His Honour Mr. Justice Hall, Chief Justice of Uganda, His Honour Mr. Justice Morris and His Honour Mr. Justice Webb.

The Crown was represented by the Attorney General, Mr. W. Harangoz, assisted by Mr. T. A. Dempson, Crown Counsel, and the long legal argument was followed with interest by number of advocates who were waiting until some of the judges would be free to take the work of other courts.

The appellants were Susho Ndlovu and Katsanga, Nyasaland, who were charged with the murder of a man, and the argument turned on the fact that the two men had indicated separately and tried together.

Decision was reserved.

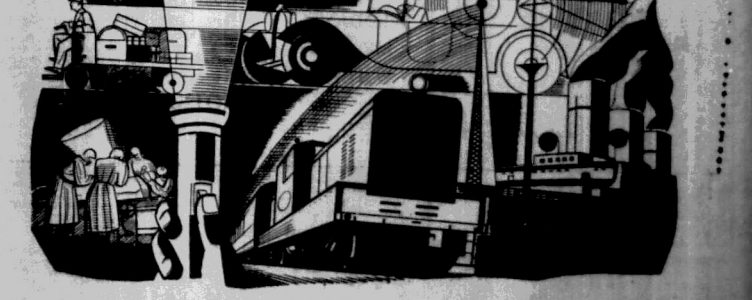

BOXING AT THE G.P.O. IN LONDON

Messenger Boys Trained in Ring

NEW JOIN IN

[STAFFORD] CORRESPONDENT, London, (By Air Mail).

The last place in the world where one would expect to find a boxing ring is a Government Department.

The ring is in one of the great galleries of the large G.P.O. at the foot of Chancery Lane.

During business hours, ring-side are occupied by girls at typewriter desks.

Post Office official said, "I chiefly encourage the boy-buyers of whom we have between 200 and 300."

"Boxing training is carried on regularly under the direction of Mr. Dan Simpson, of the Civil Service Amateur Boxing Club."

A number of other cups, employed in the immense instrument-rooms at the G.P.O. are proof of the varied sporting interests of the staff.

"That this is a British game by no means put—except polo perhaps, that is a little beyond us."

Lending Library

"Then there is the C.T.O. lending library—a very flourishing affair with 900 members.

The selection ranges from books like Lawrence's 'Seven Pillars of Wisdom' to the cheapest thriller, and the library will not yet look asked for.

Throughout the country the Post Office takes special pains for the recreation of its messengers.

"At the C.T.O. the messengers have two reading tables and facilities for table tennis.

Large post offices in the country there is a messengers' institute with billiard, table tennis, draught, chess and usually a library.

Boys Not Neglected

"Moreover the future of the boys is not neglected. Boys are not sent out as in the old days.

Compulsory night school is an condition of their employment and all find a job in the Post Office when they are 19.

The result is that we are getting an increasing number of secondary school boys, who enter the Civil Service from the ranks of the boy messengers."

Order Restored in Zanzibar

REINFORCED POLICE IN COMPLETE CONTROL

Arabs imprisoned in SHELLETT MR. I. H. D. ROLLESTON, SON OF KING'S PHYSICIAN DIES FROM WOUNDS

Order has been restored in Zanzibar and there has been no recurrence of the serious rioting which on Friday morning interrupted the normally tranquil life of the island. The town has been surrounded by a police cordon and nothing has occurred since Friday afternoon except minor disturbances on the outskirts. I regret to have to report that the Acting District Commissioner, Mr. Ian H. D. Rolleston, who was among the officers injured on Friday, died from his wounds during Friday night. Mr. Rolleston was the only son of Sir Humphrey Rolleston, Bart., who was one of the King George's physicians during his illness in 1925 and in 1932 was appointed Physician Extraordinary to His Majesty.

The condition of the Produce Inspector, Mr. R. Denkin is still grave and an addition to the list of injured officials is Mr. J. F. Jones, the Acting Provincial Commissioner. As I already reported, the Acting Commissioner of Police, Mr. L. E. Skinner is also in hospital and all these officials of Government received serious wounds from the heavy two-edged swords with which the rioters were armed.

No Firing Necessary

The Indian Inspector of Police who died was notified on Friday when Mr. Kanuril Khan was with him at the service. He was a very able and well-respected officer. He leaves a large family. The Indian Members of the Legislative Council, Inspector Kanuril Khan was a veteran of World War I and a member of District Local, Nairobi.

African Police Killed

It is stated that several African Police were killed during the riot and that some of the rioters also succumbed, but no official figures of these casualties have been received. On Friday afternoon the Government sent an urgent request to Tanganyika for police reinforcements and that evening a hundred strong native police from Tanganyika were sent to Zanzibar.

Mombasa Rumours

The Commissioner of Police, Tanganyika, Mr. J. H. M. Jones, who is in charge of the situation here in the case of the suspected condition of Mr. Skinner. It is now possible to conclude the removal of events and to realize how remarkably efficient was the handling of the situation by the Zanzibar authorities.

Sanctuary at Residence

Unprecedented orders were afforded sanctuary at the British Consulate and that the situation was so carefully managed that it was not possible to fire on the mob. The present possible credit is due to the officials of all Departments for their prompt and concrete action preventing extension of the riot. The communal part of the town, as found on Friday, was not disturbed and there has been no cases of looting. The town police functioned smoothly and efficiently in their control of a very difficult situation.

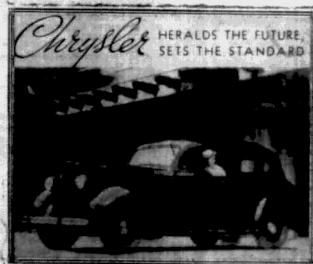

King David's Life as a Ballet

Epstein's "Most Shocking" Vein

CONSERVATIVE—London, Jan. 12. (By Air Mail.) A grand deal of interest was shown by the first presentation in London of a new ballet, based on the life of the biblical David, and produced by the Markov-Dolin Ballet Company, a recently formed group of British dancers, which is having a reasonably successful first season in London.

The Ballet treats the life of David essentially, but the story is being called off by names from among the sons of Jesse, slaying Goliath, dancing before Saul, the breaking of the bond with Jonathan, the rivalry of Michal and Abigail, and finally the eliminating scene of David dancing before the Ark of the Covenant.

Questions as to the ballet are frankly disappointing. It is far too much of a mixture, and especially too uncoordinated. The only real successes of the evening were the brilliant and entertaining drop curtain by Epstein, and the portrayal of a series of incidents in David's life in a riot of colour and in Mr. Epstein's best and most shocking vein, the scenes of Mr. Bernard Meninsky, and of the dancing of Mr. Dolin Lerner, who took the part of David.

For the rest, one felt that the Opera Ballet was left stranded without any choreographic material on which to work. For too great a part of the evening the author, Mr. Keith Lester, left them static in uninteresting scenes of feebly miming in a fashion unworthy of the best Ballet tradition. One hoped for the characteristic and original use of such performances as the Opera Ballet of Tel-Aviv, to interpret the fratricidal passions of the crowd. And how preferable would have been the true Eastern form of dancing as evolved by Maudslowi Nijevski, with her feminine Jewish spirit, instead of the commonplace Orientalism of the dances which Saul's

To-Night's Films

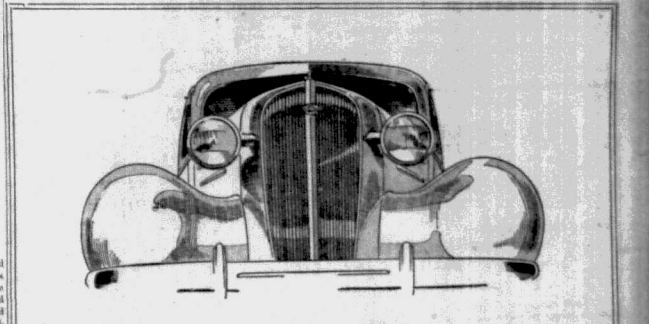

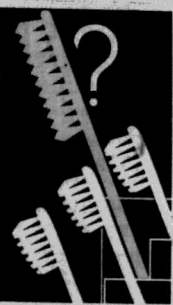

PROMPECTING NEW AREAS

To the Editor "E.A. Standard," Sir,—I was extremely interested by read in your Mining Page, Thursday, 11th October, statement has been made: "We have open a further number of mineral land areas. Formerly, almost no general prospecting, including the No. 1 level, which was led by the Tanganyika Commission Ltd. under an E.P.L. for over a year. During that time they did a considerable amount of work there, including an extensive search, and have placed the information, as gained at the disposal of the Government, who in turn are supplying any prospectors wishing to combine with them, with geological maps and all information possible of that section—what further gold mine being found. Much of our information from the Mining Department, may be taken as a good augury that Government now recognizes the urgent need for further stimulus to assist in the search for the gold fields of interest in the Mining and Geographical Regions. This work should and should be done, and that immediately, the endeavor to secure a larger interior in prospecting and the opening up of other new areas." Figures given in the Mining and Geographical Regions for 1935 show a considerable surplus over the amount collected by the Mining Department. It is not unreasonable to ask that this balance be used to start the much-needed Geological Survey in order to hasten on the further expansion of the Mining Industry. I would venture to suggest it should not be the duty of the survey and geology department to do the "shoddy" mining goldfield, but the "important" work of preliminary field survey of better known areas that may yield good results.

That promising area where gold has been reported are known: "To the Department, I have to say that two such well-mined by Mr. Morris Hughes in the 1920s (designated Areas) are now being supplied with the information that the younger granite centered in that locality—where in Kenya, is always associated with the gold-bearing rocks.

As far as I am aware no attempt has been made by the Geological Department to examine and follow up either of these occurrences. Morris Hughes mentions that more than half the specimens from the granite show thirty dry stream-beds tested contained blocks of ragged gold.

The Rhodesian Government would about the many farms of assistance to promote the expansion of their Mining Industry, especially that of encouraging the small holder, has gone some distance further and now operating a scheme to assist in prospecting and in addition receive an amount of £20 per month with

which to maintain themselves and any Native engaged by them. This scheme is being carried out under the control of the Mining and Geological Department and the Department's officers probably would be able to supply the necessary knowledge of payable gold or base metal occurrence will show in the field of his discovery.

and by systematically distributing etc; they can inspect the process from beginning to end. They can go to the farms, inspect the dairy and see that proper sterilizing facilities exist and are used, and that the milk is produced in an hygienic manner. They can then inspect the process of distribution in the district in Town.

The bulk of the milk coming to Nairobi which is collected by the Nairobi Milk Co. is from the unregistered farms and a considerable amount of milk also comes from the registered farms. It would be like to know if under the proposed Board all the milk is tested and if necessary pasteurized, how old the milk will be before the consumer gets it.

Finally, remember that you cannot make bad milk good by boiling or pasteurizing, but milk and milk production must be clean right from the start.

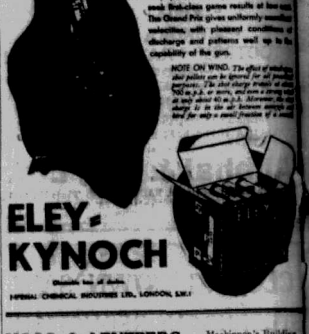
