#### STRONG DENUNCIATION BY A SENATOR

#### Japanese "Arrogance"

[BY WIRELESS.] Washington, February 10. Japan intended to claim the Southwest in China even if war was necessary to accomplish it, declared Senator Pittman, Chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee in a speech to the Senate today.

Congress, he went on, would not be "bullheaded" into the abandonment of the United States national defense and the protection of her legitimate commerce with China.

He appealed to Congress to observe the effects of Japanese policy on the United States and condemn Japanese threats, propaganda and arrogance.

Senator Pittman declared that Nippon had openly and ruthlessly violated the League Covenant, and the Kellogg and Nine Power Pacts.

Commenting on the statement of the Commander-in-Chief of the Japanese Fleet that the United States renounced her naval policy aimed at the expansion and protection of United States trade, Japan would be forced to extend the cruising radius of her Fleet in the Pacific, Senator Pittman asserted that never in history had such diplomatic arrogance been entertained by one holding such a position.

A Reuter message from Washington states that the Secretary of State, Mr. Cordell Hull, in an interview, disavowed responsibility in connection with the speech of Senator Pittman, declaring that there had been no consultation or collaboration between himself and Senator Pittman on the subject.

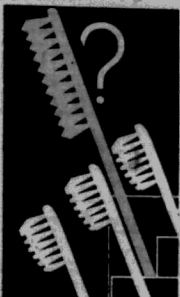

## Transport Expert to Advise East Africa

Basic Considerations

"We propose first to consider certain facts which appear to govern the situation as we see it today..."

(a) The Tanganyika road and railway systems are owned by the State, and are a charge on the general taxpayer.

(b) The current expenditure on the road system is adequately covered by the contribution made by the general public using taxpayer.

(c) Rail transport is operated by the State, road transport by private enterprise.

(d) Any loss incurred in operating State rail transport will fall on the general taxpayer.

"We have had, moreover, to keep in view the important factor of the present railway transport system."

### Rail Costs

"Rail transport is at present being operated at a loss, but it is established, on the basis of the goods traffic figures for 1934, that an average return of 33d. per ton-mile would cover the cost of operation and loan charges. The nature of the traffic is such, however, that some 8 per cent. of it is not carried at rates far below cost (i.e., amounts at 24d., 26d. and 28d. and 30d. per ton-mile). This traffic would otherwise be carried at all other rates by road which the average cost per ton-mile may at present be put at about 3d. upwards. The loss resulting from the application of these rates is compensated for by the charging of higher rates for goods of a higher value, and in this higher-rated traffic that is being selected by competing road transport."

"To compete successfully with motor transport the Railways would have to undertake a complete revision of their rates which would be levied down to the rate in the lower classes, and we consider that it would be desirable were they able to reduce the rates for classes II and III to the level of class IV. Arctic Conditions in Britain

TRAFFIC HELD UP BY SNOWDRIFTS

Heavy Damage

WEATHER FORECAST TALKS OF TWENTY DEGREES OF FROST

London, Feb. 11.

London to-day experienced the coldest day of winter while Arctic conditions are forecast with the temperature down to 20 degrees.

WAVY SEAS

The violent gales in Southeast England moderated somewhat to-day but the coast is still being battered by heavy seas.

The Scilly Isles were occasional gusts of wind reached a hurricane miles an hour experienced one of the roughest nights in living memory.

IN THE WEST

In the West of England traffic is held up owing to deep snowdrifts in the valleys, while West country rivers have suffered considerable damage through waves breaking over promenades and sea walls.

The gale also swept over Ireland where communications have been interrupted in many parts. The coast of Armagh Cathedral was partially destroyed.

WATERS FROM COLD

The cold weather continues throughout the British Isles but conditions generally owing to the cessation of the wind are less severe than yesterday, which in many parts was the coldest February day for seven years. Fourteen deaths attributed to the severity of the cold were reported.

SEA FREEZES

At several places, including the Thames Estuary, ice formed at the water's edge which is also a common occurrence round the British coast. At Shoeburyness a thick crust of ice which formed as the tide receded covered about one mile of the foreshore.—British Official Wireless Service.

THREE CITY MEN ON TRIAL

Sequel to Pepper Crisis

Big Array of Counsel

ALLEGED HEURIST OF A FALSE PROSECUTION

London, Feb. 11.

There was a distinguished array of counsel present when the trial opened at the Old Bailey today of three prominent city men, charged with the prosecution of the Pepper case.

The Charge

Ballgagan was charged, "You the do, being a director of a public company called Jones and Sons, and on September 2, 1934, did make, circulate, or cause to be done, a prospectus which, he knew to be false in a material particular, with intent to induce persons to become shareholders in the company."

Henson and Hoyle, each charged with aiding and abetting him.

The prosecution alleged that it was to make a legal obligation under a share contract, the defendant conceived the idea of raising a company and that a public company was obtained from the public to finance the alleged transaction.

BRITISH NAVY & AIR MENACE

Modifying Design of Ships

Experiments

STATEMENT IN HOUSE OF LORDS

London, Feb. 11.

Speaking in the course of the debate on defence in the House of Lords today, Lord Maxwell, First Lord of the Admiralty, said the Navy and the Air Force had lately participated in extensive large-scale experiments in observation with capital ships with a view to enabling adequate preparations to be made against the air menace by both anti-aircraft guns and hull construction.

As a result of those experiments the Admiralty believed there was now adequate information for the construction of a modern battleship.

Secret Tests

Bugby, Feb. 12.

The First Lord of the Admiralty, Viscount Maxwell, disclosed in the House of Commons last night that secret tests have been carried out in connection with the construction of a modern battleship, at sea, to test the effectiveness of the equipment and control of the fighting force, in view of a Royal Commission to enquire into them.

Referring to the existing machinery for reviewing defence problems, he said that during the past four years 120 meetings of the Cabinet Committee on Defence had been held, and the Committee of Imperial Defence and its sub-committees had held 800 meetings.

As to the relative value of air armaments and battleships, he said no nation was showing the slightest sign of doing away with capital ships, of which seven were at present being built in Europe, four of them being the largest allowed under the Washington Treaty.

The Government did not undertake the immense offensive power of aircraft, but modern battleships would discharge about 1000 shells weighing nearly one ton in 14 hours, and were built to withstand such attack, aerial bombing had merely brought the question of improvement of battleships.

The authorities "were more than satisfied with the progress made in the construction of guns.—British Official Wireless Service.

ROSS AND CROMARTY BY-ELECTION RESULT

Mr. Malcolm Macdonald Back In Parliament

London, Feb. 11.

Mr. Malcolm Macdonald, Secretary of State for the Dominions, has been elected for Ross and Cromarty by a substantial majority.

The result was declared to-night as follows:

The by-election was caused by the retirement of the Rt. Hon. Sir Ian Maepheron, the National Liberal Member.

Mr. Macdonald and Mr. Winston Churchill were the outstanding personalities in the election campaign which was followed throughout Britain with keen interest. The former was defeated at the General Election when he stood as National Labour candidate for the Bassettlaw Division of Nottingham. He lost the seat to Mr. F. J. Bellenger, the Labour candidate who had 11,918 votes, shortly before the General Election. Mr. Malcolm Macdonald was appointed Secretary of State for the Colonies in succession to Sir Philip Cunliffe Liston (now Lord Swinfen) who became Secretary of State for Air. When a new Cabinet was selected after the National Government's victory Mr. Macdonald was promoted to the Dominions Office, changing places with Mr. J. H. Thomas.

CONGRATULATIONS

The Lord President of the Council, Mr. Ramsay MacDonald, received the congratulations of all parties of the House of Commons when the news of the success of his son was announced last night (says a British Official Wireless Press message).

ANGLO-EGYPTIAN TREATY TALKS

Improved Conditions in Cairo

PROMISING ATMOSPHERE

London, Feb. 11.

Conditions for the negotiation of an Anglo-Egyptian Treaty are reported in London as being considerably improved with a good prospect of the preliminary talks ending being successful.

The High Commissioner, Sir Miles Lampson, is being assisted during the negotiations by British and Egyptian military officers. No formal negotiations have been commenced but a change of view between Sir Miles Lampson and the Egyptian officials have been proceeding for some time.

The fact that the signing of the negotiations has not yet been final.

NO TRANSFER OF COLONIES

Forty M.P.s Sign a Motion

Anxious Home

EXPECTED REASSURANCE BY SECRETARY OF STATE

London, February 11.

Mr. J. H. Thomas is expected to-day to announce a House of Commons motion against the possible transfer of British colonies and Mandates.

Forty Members have now signed a motion which is a transfer of any sort and express questions are being asked to similar effect.

Mr. Herbert G. Williams (Cons. Chesham South) suggests that the House should pass a special copy of the 1914 report on the German treatment of natives in South West Africa.

WOMAN R.A.

First to be Appointed Since 1765

London, February 11.

The first woman to be appointed Royal Assessor since 1765 is Dame Laura Knight, painter, who has been appointed since 1935. The only other woman Royal Assessor was Miss Dorothy Anderson, who was appointed in 1920. Mr. Arthur George Williams, engineer, who has also been appointed Royal Assessor.—British Official Wireless Service.

Experts' Opinion of Oil Sanctions

DEPENDENT ON AMERICA PARTICIPATING

Otherwise Ineffective

Geneva, Feb. 11.

The committee of experts enquiring into the practical aspects of the proposed oil embargo against Italy has decided, according to reliable information, that effective sanctions cannot be applied if America refuses to participate.

The committee is of the opinion, however, that an embargo would be successful if American limited exports of oil to Italy to the amount normally exported.

ABYSSINIANS CLAIM VICTORY

Addis Ababa, Feb. 11.

According to an official message from Meaza the Abyssinians after a sharp fight succeeded in driving the Italians from their base about fifty miles south of Addis Ababa.

It is reported that heavy casualties have been incurred by both sides.

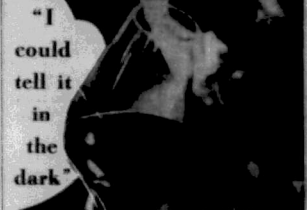

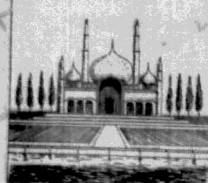

## Nature of Colonies and Mandated Territories

### AN ASSURANCE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

#### Reply to Questions

NO HANDING OVER BEING CONSIDERED BY IMPERIAL GOVERNMENT

[PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARY.]

In the House of Commons to-day Sir Henry Page Croft (Conservative, Bournemouth) requested an assurance that Government had not considered handing over British Colony or Mandate to a Foreign power, and also that the Government was not prepared to "barter" the Colonies in any way whatsoever.

Mr. Geoffrey Mander (Liberal, Wolverhampton E.) drew attention to the speech of General Goble on January 11, when he said that Germany would demand a return of her Colonies, and he requested an assurance that Government had no intention of returning to a German Government any British Mandated territories.

Changed Conditions

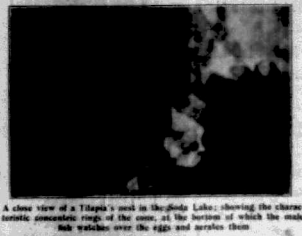

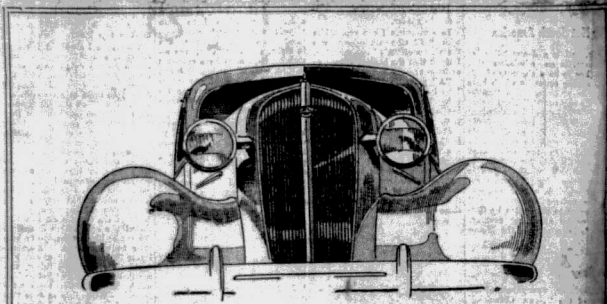

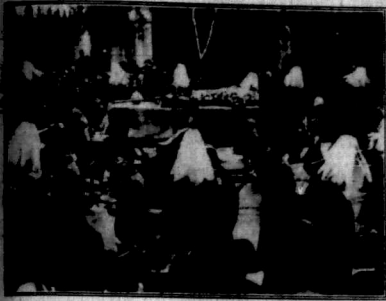

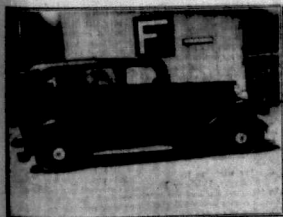

Rail competition and the co-ordination of all forms of transport has submitted an interim report proposing that a Central Transport Control Board should be established to advise on the co-ordination of all transport, starting with roads.

The most important aspect, however, in the view of the Committee is that the transport problem cannot be solved satisfactorily unless dealt with inter-territorially.

It is urged, therefore, that an independent expert should be invited to examine the whole question on an East African basis and if other Territories do not agree, Tanganyika should itself seek such advice.

Kenya is believed to favour joint-action but is hampered at present by the fact that a local Committee was recently appointed.

# Grave Rioting in Zanzibar

## OFFICIALS ATTACKED BY ARMED ARAB MOB

### Reinforced Police in Complete Control

#### MR. L. H. D. ROLLESTON, SON OF KING'S PHYSICIAN DIES FROM WOUNDS

Unprecedented rioting and bloodshed occurred in Zanzibar this morning arising out of the application of the recently introduced Colonial Administration Decrees.
