Control of Maize and Dairy Products

DRAFT BILLS APPROVED BY BOARD OF AGRICULTURE

Important Proviso

LAND BANK LOANS FOR ANTI-ROBBER WORKS ON FARMS

The Kenya Board of Agriculture has approved in principle the draft Dairy Industry Control Bill and the draft Milk Control Bill and has asked Government to proceed with the measures without delay. This approval was recorded at a meeting held on January 29 and 30 when consideration was given to a number of important matters.

In connexion with the maize export quota scheme the proviso was added that a clause should be included in the draft measure enabling the Government to vary the circumstances required it, to fix a maximum internal price for maize taking into consideration the export price value for maize and the costs of production at the time.

The Board met Sir Alan Pin and Mr. Milligan on January 30 when various agricultural matters affecting the welfare of the Colony were discussed. Among these were: Re-organisation of the Department of Agriculture; soil erosion; overstocking; and fencing and dipping. Various outlets for surplus stock were considered.

Stock Owners' Conference

Important matters were considered at a meeting of the Kenya Board of Agriculture on January 29 and 30. The following report of the meeting has been supplied to the press. After a considerable amount of discussion on the report of the Dairy Industry Enquiry Committee, the Board passed a resolution approving in principle the draft Dairy Industry Control Bill, which is printed as an appendix to the report, and recommending that Government be asked to proceed with the measure without delay. It was agreed, however, that the point should be considered as to whether the Bill should be operated in connexion with the townships and municipalities between native producers where there is no surplus for sale. The Board further agreed that consideration should be given to changing the mode of carrying out the Ordinance on the purchase as well as the producer, and also considered that it was imperative to mark the net weight of the contents of public trucks which would be required by section 20 (1) of the original draft Bill.

A draft Maize Control Bill, under which an export quota system should be operated, was also discussed. Broadly the Board resolved that it supported the principle of the Bill, but the proviso that a clause should be added which would enable the Government to vary the circumstances required it, to fix a maximum internal price for maize taking into consideration the export price value for maize and the costs of production at the time. The Board also recommended that immediate steps should be taken with a view to the Bill being brought into operation. It was considered desirable that a clause should be inserted in the Bill, giving the Governor-in-Council power to exclude specified areas from the operation of the provisions of the Ordinance. This provision has special reference to the Coast Province, which could be specified, together with other areas, in which the operation of the Ordinance was thought to be desirable.

RABIES POSITION

The following rabies progress report, dated Feb. 21, has been issued by the Kenya Department of Agriculture: "Since the publication of the last report of January 9, no positive cases of rabies have been reported in the Colony. A system of baiting for the destruction of rabid animals has been carried out in the Uasin Gishu and Transvaal Districts and up to February 12 a number of animals, 187 jackals, 5 musangos, 38 dogs and 48 hyenas, etc., were recorded. Baiting in the North Kavirondo Native Reserve was continued during the month of January and then stopped. During this month 4,130 baits were laid and 27 jackals and 32 others were destroyed. There is nothing to report from other districts or native reserves in the Colony."

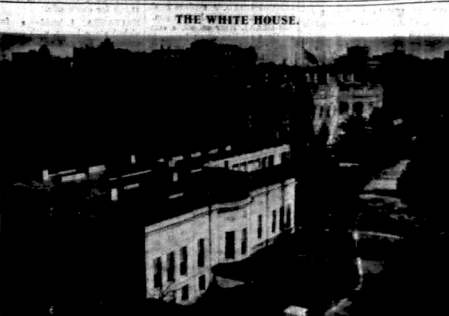

## No Handing Over the Colonies

(Continued from page 1)

Norwood, who is taking a lively interest in the vital question of the proposed handing over of our Colonies. At the annual meeting of the Conservative Association of Norfolk on Friday, Feb. 22, Mr. Sturdy made a vigorous speech against this policy.

### "Woolly Thinking"

"Woolly thinking and irresponsible talking by people who could know better is creating the mischievous impression amongst British Colonies as to be had for the asking," he said.

Mr. Sturdy expressed the heartfelt opinion of the British Colonial Empire to be administered by some judicious international body. Mr. Lloyd George says in a speech to the House of Commons (January and July). When a man of the Conservative Party, Mr. Lloyd George adds the weight of his authority as an ex-Prime Minister to this issue and danger you talk it becomes a matter which the Conservative Party cannot afford to ignore.

"The corner stone of the Conservative faith is the maintenance of the integrity of the Empire. This principle has been challenged and I am confident that Imperialists will not be slow to defend their name. There are some people who attempt to draw a distinction in status between British Colonies and British Mandated Territories. They suggest that the mandated territories really belong to the League of Nations, or even that Germany holds a reversionary interest. In point of fact, according to international law there can be no shadow of doubt that in our Mandated Territories the same complete sovereignty is vested in the British Crown as in any other part of the Empire. But what is still far more important is the fact that we have assumed responsibility for the welfare of these backward peoples which we cannot honestly shirk."

"Do we believe that it is in the interests of the inhabitants of these territories to be transferred to somebody else's rule? If so, we are condemning British administration and are admitting that we have lost faith in our country's mission in the world. If not, then to do so will help us realize our obligation to the people of these territories, whose welfare is a basic principle of our policy."

"An early and authoritative declaration by His Majesty's Govern-

ment on this subject in order to put an end to dangerous and groundless hopes in the minds of foreign countries, and to reassure the people of the Empire, is essential."

At the Meeting the following Resolution was unanimously passed:—

"That in view of the false and dangerous impression which remains abroad as to the Empire by the irresponsible statements of the moment made by some of the members of the Conservative Association at an Annual Meeting, Mr. H.M. Government to make an emphatic declaration that there can be no question either now or at any future date of Great Britain transferring into any other hands British Colonies or British Mandated Territories. For the welfare, progress and enlightenment of government of those peoples the British Nation holds an honorable and inalienable trust."

### The Secretary of State

London, Feb. 28.

(By Air Mail.)

It must be said that people are excited by the statements in the House with regard to the future of the Colonies and Mandated Territories. Mr. Thomas says to have taken the matter much too lightly and a good many people are ceasing to regard him as a serious politician, which is very unfortunate in view of the problems which are likely to arise in the near future.

Lord Lugard, the distinguished Colonial Governor and British member of the Permanent Mandates Commission of the League of Nations, addressing a meeting of the Conservative party members' Imperial Affairs Committee at the House of Commons last week declared that transfer of British Colonial Territories—or those of any other nation—to the League of Nations for administration under mandate was an impracticable proposition.

His first practical facts and figures to show that the transfer of British Colonial Territories and Mandated Territories to other Powers would involve grave difficulties, even if it were deemed in their interests desirable, and declared that their transfer to the League to be administered under

mandate was impossible. It would, he said, be hardly practicable for a committee to possess a degree of authority. It would be equally impossible for an international committee to do so.

### Germany's Position

I understand that Lord Lugard said it was ridiculous to suppose that Germany wanted Colonies for the purpose of new markets or even for the settlement of her surplus population. He stated that she wanted them for her prestige. Germany's general desire for the colonies was very sound although I can tell by somebody's protest that towards the end he rather wobbled and indicated that something would have to be done to satisfy German aspirations. Of course everybody knows perfectly well that if the Powers open their eyes to the fact of policy they will never be able to stop.

Earl Winterton took the chair at the meeting, and it is estimated that no fewer than 100 members were present. A lively discussion followed Lord Lugard's address, in which it was made plain that the Conservative Party is in no mood to tolerate any form of transfer of British possessions.

It must be said that the German demand for no fewer than 100 colonies is a claim to the right of a larger amount for the defence of Imperial interests.

The following new question appears in the House of Commons Daily Papers.

Mr. Sturdy: To ask the Prime Minister whether the statement made in the House by the then Secretary of State for the Colonies, referring to his belief on 12th February, 1932, that mandates are in no sense a form of lease which is held by us from the League of Nations, still represents the view of His Majesty's Government.

Economic Advisory Boards in East Africa

SECRETARY OF STATE MEETS DEPUTATION

Idea Not Favoured

MR. THOMAS CONSIDERS THAT THEY WILL BE OF VERY LITTLE VALUE

The view of the Joint East African Board of advantage to establish local Economic Advisory Boards in the East African Dependencies, on the lines advantage might be derived from the appointment of an Advisory Committee by the Colonial Office, was reiterated when the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. J. H. Thomas, met a deputation from the Board.

The Secretary of State said that in his view formal Advisory Boards of the type suggested were of very little value. He felt that it was better to leave the authorities concerned free to avail themselves of such services from any quarter without setting up any definite organization. This applied not only to the Colonies but also to the Colonial Office.

Congo Basin Treaties

The Joint East African Board has now issued a note on the discussion between the Secretary of State for the Colonies and the Board on January 21. The Secretary of State received a deputation of 14 members of the Board on January 21. He said that he appreciated that the object of the Board was to co-operate with the Secretary of State in a friendly discussion on matters of common interest, and he was accordingly happy to welcome such an opportunity.

Mr. Humphrey Leggett referred to the subject of the Congo Basin Treaties and mentioned that the Board fully realized that the moment was not an opportune one for the Secretary of State to discuss the future of these Treaties. Nevertheless, they would appreciate any information that the Secretary of State might be able to give them on the general question, and they desired to draw attention to certain minor matters, mainly in connection with the provisions of the area covered by the treaties (for instance in N.E. Rhodesia) and the fact that the provisions of the treaties were not always observed by their Powers.

Mr. O'Connell stated that the whole position in regard to the Treaties had been examined at length in consultation with the departments concerned, and that His Majesty's Government had been advised that the Treaties could not be terminated in any circumstances except with the consent of all the Powers concerned.

Infringement of Treaties

As regards the non-observance of the Treaties by certain foreign Powers, the Secretary of State said that if the Board could furnish the Colonial Office with details of any alleged infringement of the Treaties by a particular power, consideration would certainly be given to the question of whether any action could be taken against the matter.

In regard to the freeholding of former German landschaps in the East African Dependencies, Mr. O'Connell urged briefly that, having regard to the fact that the lands in the less fertile areas had been converted into freehold as a result of the economic depression, it would be inadvisable to convert the lands into freehold as a result of the economic depression.

When the author says that "a treaty between Rome and Addis Ababa, drawn up in June 1924" states that Italy and Great Britain (then including the Sudan) should run some business from the north, why does he not add that the distance in question on the article of the treaty between the White Nile and British Somaliland was fixed at 1000 miles from the coast if such is corrected in this figure is wrong? What then were the terms of the Franco-Italian agreement in 1904 at Addis Ababa?

That the statement that the Franco-Italian Government are quite unable to understand that the League of Nations is a reality in England and elsewhere is not true, however small and far away it may be, is not true; but under modern conditions any war between Italy and Abyssinia would be a world conflict between Britain and Italy.

The statement that Italy has strongly opposed to the definition of Italy shows ignorance of the actual facts. The first attempt at creating an Italian State in modern times was made under the Franco-Italian Treaty of 1904.

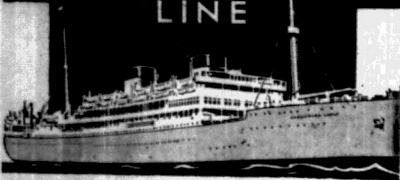

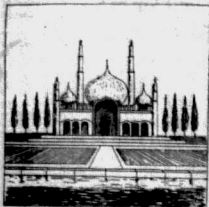

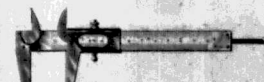

(From a Special Correspondent)

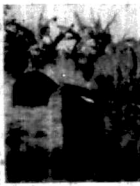

Control of Maize and Dairy Products

DRAFT BILLS APPROVED BY BOARD OF AGRICULTURE

Import Proviso

LAND BANK LOANS FOR ANTI-EROSION WORKS ON FARMS

The Kenya Board of Agriculture has approved in principle the draft Dairy Industry Control Bill and the draft Maize Control Bill and has asked Government to proceed with the measures without delay.

In connection with the maize export scheme the proviso was added that a clause should be included in the draft measure establishing the Government Council, when circumstances required it, to fix a maximum internal price for maize taking into consideration the export parity value for maize and the costs of production at the time.

The Board met Sir Alan Pim and Mr. Milligan on January 20 when various agricultural matters affecting the welfare of the Colony were discussed. Among these were: Re-organisation of the Department of Agriculture, soil erosion, overstocking, and fencing and dipping. Various orders for surplus stocks were considered.

Stock Owners' Conference

Imported animals were considered. This provision has special reference to the Coast Province and the Districts of the Coast Province together with other areas, in rules made in connection with the Ordinance in respect of animals. It was thought to be desirable.
