In an important statement in the House of Commons yesterday Mr. Anthony Eden said the British Government...

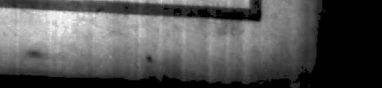
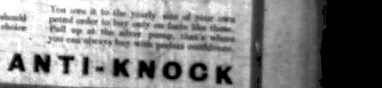
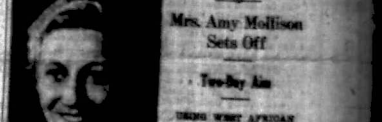

The entire air force was engaged in bombing the routed column and firing on them with machine guns. The air force, led by the Italian aviators, again advanced southwards and the Abyssinians fled before them.

The Abyssinians sustained severe losses, including thousands of machine guns and light field guns. The Italian forces are even said to have killed and wounded.

"Cruel, Cowardly and Callous Murder"

"Immediately the murder had been established naturally the Police became busy in the vicinity and investigated and interrogated everyone in the vicinity. Case Summarized

"It fits, the case of the Crown is that the accused was found in the room at the night of the 19th, that, having apparently not having received the pistol which he thought it should be determined that the link into his hands; that after the house had been opened by Mrs. Dine, he entered her bedroom by the window that he was conditioned, possibly by cutting a piece of string which is alleged to have been found in the room, to break on the window itself; that he took with him an instrument from the kitchen which he would know; that when Mrs. Dine entered that room she was immediately attacked by him, probably from the side of the head, with the small piece of iron which she always was taken from the kitchen; that, not satisfied with this, he strangled the unfortunate old lady; that he then proceeded to search the room for the money which he suggested he knew, she would be having somewhere; that room that he searched everywhere except this right-hand corner, where money was in fact kept under the mattress of the bed, which was the contents of furniture which he appears to have left alone.

"We suggest that it was a matter of ordinary calobry; that the instrument, whoever he was, was used and intended only for the many things that were found in that room, nothing was missing; that the fact that the accused's fingerprint was found upon the drawer points, possibly, to the accused and to the accused only; that the fact that the dog appeared to have been perfectly acquainted with the accused; that his immediate disappearance from the district, wandering from place to place in various parts of the Colony, is consistent with his leaving out the case for the Crown; and that, in short, is the whole indictment for the Crown.

"Close-Out Case

"As to the last involved in this case I think there will be little to dispute for possible points with evidence. In most cases of murder it is necessary for the Crown to refer to other possible reasons from the court and jury, mainly matters of fact and other findings, but in the case before you the Crown's case is clear and the evidence on the deposition, and we say, that the statement of Mrs. Dine, whoever he was, on that night in question was given with such attention, and that if the accused is proved to have been there, he is guilty of one crime and one crime only and that is a cruel, cowardly and callous murder.

"Chief Inspector A. J. Poppy, of the C.I.D., Nairobi, described the condition of Mrs. Dine's bedroom when he inspected it on the evening of December 6. On arrival, he said, he found the body lying on the back on the floor of the bed of the bed and at an angle to the doorway.

"Photograph of the bedroom, and the house, taken by witness, and a plan of the house and its contents prepared by witness, were placed as exhibits. The house-witness stated, was a single-story stone structure with a corrugated iron roof.

"Continuing his description of the room, witness said the body was lying on the floor, and the head about 2 ft. from the door. It was old in eight days,

If not present, he said, he would have been inquisitive to expect to find their fingerprints on these articles, especially receiving impressions.

"An Assessor's Justice

Asked by the Chief Justice if he wished to put any questions to the witness, Mr. Burke said he had none.

"Medical Evidence

Led by Mr. Donington, Dr. F. W. Donington, Bacteriologist, detailed the injuries sustained by Mrs. Dine, which were found when he visited the house on the morning of December 7. The body was dressed in an unbuttoned nightgown, drawers and panty-socks. The lower extremities were lying against the near side of the right knee.

"As the scene occurred in Nairobi he carried out a post-mortem examination of the body the same morning. He formed the impression that the body was about 40 years of age. 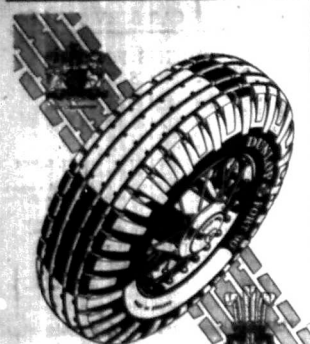
