## COLONY'S THREE AIDS FOR EDUCATION

### Paper defines standards

EDUCATIONAL problems in Kenya are summed up in a "paper" session paper on the Government's 1952-53 development programme. The educational problem is said to be to maintain standards, the African to raise standards and the student to create standards and build up a standard curriculum.

The paper says that between 1947 and 1951 the population of Kenya increased by 11 per cent, the Asian by 61 per cent and the European by 20 per cent. Over the same period the number of children in school increased by 10 per cent in the number of Europeans, 32 per cent in Asian and 25 per cent in African schools.

In 1950-51 there were 181 per cent in European schools, 118 per cent in Asian schools, and 120 per cent in African schools in the field of education.

One of the most difficult problems facing the Government when it comes to the education programme was what standards should be adopted.

#### Educational factor

Education, the paper states, is a moral service, but it has a very important economic and social importance. It is a subject of both political and racial. It is a matter of the welfare of the statutory institutions in the field.

In 1950-51 it is proposed to allocate £1,877,000, net, or 10·2 per cent of the total budget to allow for a Public Works Development programme of £274,000.

The net allocation for the year 1951-52 is £4,000,000 for the total development programme.

Meals, the Government will spend £1,000,000, leaving this amount on education, but in the paper it is pointed out that it is not possible to find the money.

#### More graduates

"In the last resort, the size of the educational programme depends on what the country can afford to pay for it," the paper says. The initial cost of building and equipping new schools is estimated at £1,000,000.

The size of the demand for capital expenditure on education is reflected in the rate of growth of the number of trained teachers and the demand for higher education.

A significant indication of the importance of education is the steady effect, and which may be expected to continue, in the number of trained graduates leaving the universities. The ratio increased from 137 to 311, 320,000, last year.

It is unlikely that more than a million more can be made available.

#### Help for farms

The proposed allocation, it is suggested, will be £2,000,000, net, towards the cost of tuition fees.

A "definite effort" has been made in the Northern Province to provide agricultural production centres outside the existing programme on the Mombasa road to Kericho.

Projects which the Government has agreed to finance include grants to municipalities, totaling £200,000, to the District Councils of £200,000, and £100,000 to the county councils.

And the costs of research and experiments for £400,000 is envisaged.

## RUGBY TOUR BY UNIVERSITIES

### East Africa and Rhodesias in a two-month itinerary

CONSEQUENT upon the good offices of the English Rugby Football Union, a Combined Oxford and Cambridge Universities side will tour East Africa and the Rhodesias during the month of June. This tour begins and ends with matches in Nairobi. It will be the first time that a Universities side has travelled to Rhodesia and the first overseas tour during the Kenya playing season.

The opening match will be played at Nairobi on June 20 against the Rhodesians, where three and four days later will be held the first and second tests of the tour. There will be more games in East Africa and the last fixture will be against Kenya on June 29 to complete the tour. This last fixture will depend upon the number of injuries for only 21 University players will be travelling.

#### An earlier visit

Kenya has invited a Combined Universities side to play in its annual tournament, when Oxford and Cambridge Universities will travel to Nairobi after a short stay in Rhodesia. The tour will start on July 10 and end on July 25. The opening game will be played at Nairobi on July 10 against the Rhodesians. They will then play at Dar es Salaam on July 12 and 13 against the Coppermines. Returning to Nairobi on July 14, they will play at Arusha on July 15 against the Nyanza. They will then play at Kisumu on July 16 against the Uganda. They will return to Nairobi on July 17 to play at Eldoret on July 18 against the Kenyans. Their opponents are their next opponents, on July 19 against the Kenyans. They will then play at Kisumu on July 20 against the Uganda. They will return to Nairobi on July 21 to play at Arusha on July 22 against the Coppermines. They will then play at Kisumu on July 23 against the Uganda. They will return to Nairobi on July 24 to play at Arusha on July 25 against the Kenyans.

The programme of matches in Rhodesia will consist of one per week, each on Saturday, starting on August 4 and finishing on Saturday, August 11. They will play at Bulawayo on August 4, at Salisbury on August 5, at Gwelo on August 6, at Bulawayo on August 7, and at Salisbury on August 8. They will play a Kenya week game at Eldoret on August 9, and a Kenya week game at Nairobi on August 10. They will then play at Kisumu on August 11.

#### With private hosts

It is intended that all the United Nations members will be invited to witness the tour of East Africa, with a full complement of the Universities, the Oxford and Cambridge Universities, the Universities of Rhodesia, the Universities of East Africa, the Universities of Central Africa, and the Universities of Southern Africa. The tour will consist of four committees, consisting of the P.U.F. of E.A., Goldsmiths' Company, the Royal Society of Arts, and, lastly, a former member of the Rhodesian Parliament, Mr. J. R. B. M. T. He is a well-known South African internationalist who has made a great deal of organising and promotional work, and is regarded as a certainty to be the Combined Universities

#### Other possibilities

There is a chance, rather remote, that the Combined Universities, playing against the Universities of Rhodesia, Central Africa, and Southern Africa, may be invited to return to Britain. They are invited to do so by the Secretary of State for Education.

#### Remarkable control

Many tour players at various stages of the tour will have a touch of impatience. But when the tour reaches Nairobi, just as Lindrum was about to make his debut, he will be able to sit back and relax for a few days before returning to London, and then may be asked to go to the University of Kenya.


