PAYMENT OF SALARIES TO

DETAINEEES CRITICISED

185 ex-Government servants affected REMEDIES PLANNED

THE Kenya Government was not satisfied with the position under which it was compelled to award full pay to employees for periods they had served as detainees under the Emergency Regulations, the Chief Secretary, Mr. Turnbull, told the Legislative Council yesterday.

Mr. Turnbull, who was replying to questions by Mr. Humphry Slade (Aberdare), said that representations had been made to the Colonial Secretary over what was considered to be an extremely unsatisfactory situation.

After informing the House that "certain remedies" had been suggested, the Chief Secretary said that the Government had received salaries for the period from their detention to their dismissal under the provisions of Colonial Regulation 56.

Awaiting Britain's reply

The period of detention before dismissal had varied from a few weeks, in most cases, to three years in some cases—depending on the time taken to establish identity cards—and obtain satisfactory evidence of implication in subversive activities.

Asked if the Government would agree to withhold any further pay, until full it was seen if the suggested remedies could be applied, Mr. Turnbull answered: "I cannot agree until I have received the reply from the British Government."

Mr. Turnbull also said that the case of Mr. D. W. O'Connell, Secretary of the Kenya Teachers' Association, was a special case. It was his duty to say that he was not satisfied with the manner in which the Government had handled the case of Mr. O'Connell, who had been dismissed from his post as a member of the Kenya Teachers' Association in 1952.

Egypt's first installment of the aid, which was to replace the British loan in Jordan, is due on July 1. Saudi Arabia has already paid her share.

The Jordan Foreign Secretary, Mr. Selwyn Lloyd, who is back in London after attending the Baghdad Peace Council in Karachi, said he thought conditions in the Middle East were "little easier" and that developments in Jordan were hopeful. The Prime Minister of Iraq, Gen. Nuri al Said, one of the chief architects of the Pact, resigned his post last week.

Body from sea may be missing frogman

SOVIET VISIT RECALLED

THE headless body of a man, believed to be that of a frogman, has been washed up on a sandbank at the mouth of Chichester harbour in Sussex. This is a few miles from Portsmouth where Comdr. Lionel 'Rusty' Cooper, a member of the Royal Navy, disappeared in April last year during a visit by the Russian Ambassador to the Admiralty.

Equipment attached to the body was found to be that of the water was a frogman's. It was said that the body was washed up on the sandbank during the late winter.

The first of the 400 men of the Royal Naval School of Diving were sent to the Admiralty in 1916, and were appointed after trials with underwater apparatus in the Port of Portsmouth in 1916, the day after the Russian Ambassador's visit to the Admiralty.

Comdr. Cooper was a staff officer at the Admiralty.

Education of Asians policy 'political'

THE Education of Asians Education Council, meeting in London, reported an item in its first annual report which said that the Council would not "take part in political matters".

The Council, which was set up by the Government in 1946, and which had its first meeting in London on April 15, 1946, is a body of 12 members, including the Secretary of State for Education, the Secretary of State for India, and the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

The Council's first report, which was published in London on April 15, 1946, is a document of 100 pages, and is the first of a series of reports which the Council is to publish.

Premier's statement

On April 15, 1946, the Premier, Mr. Churchill, made a statement in the House of Commons on the subject of the Education of Asians.

He said that the Government was determined to ensure that the education of Asians in this country should be of the highest quality, and that it should be of a type which would enable them to take their place in the community.

Several other items were mentioned in the Premier's statement, including the fact that the Government was considering the possibility of providing financial assistance for the education of Asians in their own countries.

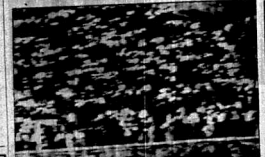
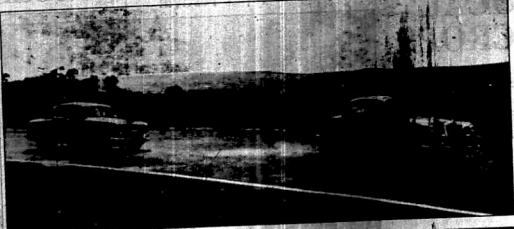


