Egypt leaves Joint Military Command JORDAN TENSION

GRAVE concern was expressed yesterday at the growing crisis between Egypt and Jordan. Egypt has withdrawn her representative from the Joint Arab Military Command in Amman and Arab observers thought this could lead to breakdown of the Egypt-Jordan alliance. Syria is the third member of the joint command.

Egypt has protested to the Jordanian Government over accusations against her Military Attaché in Amman and the request for his withdrawal. Jordan claimed that the attaché had been involved in an assassination plot. Egypt later alleged that members of the Jordanian Government had conspired to have him expelled.

Withdrawal of aid likely

It was hinted in Amman that Egypt and Syria might cease from the obligation under the solidarity agreement of paying financial aid to Jordan. Egyptian and Syrian spokesmen indicated recently that aid would not be given unless Jordan followed a policy of "neutrality".

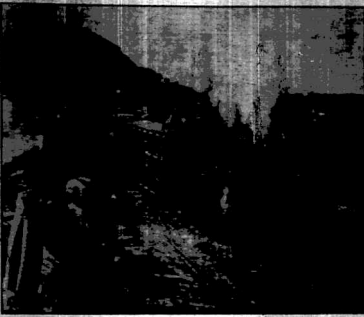
In Cairo, politicians attached significance to the presence in Amman of King Saud of Saudi Arabia, who is having talks with King Hussein. President Nasser is expected to discuss the Jordan crisis with the Syrian President, Mr. Shukri al Kuatly, who is in an Alexandria hospital.

Jordan's relations with Egypt and Syria began to deteriorate after the unsuccessful attempt in April to overthrow the King. The King argued for intervention in Jordan's affairs and closed the Egyptian-controlled Middle East News Agency offices in Jordan. Jordan later claimed that Syrian forces had taken part in the plot to overthrow the King.
