London, October 18.—(Special Telegrams.)—The speech of Mr. Lloyd George at Manchester on Wednesday night was one of the most powerful and stirring ever made in the House of Commons. It was a passionate defence of the Near Eastern policy of the Government, and a warning to the Opposition not to betray the interests of the Empire.
