London, June 2. THE EVENT OF AIR RAID, ABOUT HALF THE POPULATION OF THE CITY OF LONDON COULD BE MOVED TO HOUSES OUTSIDE THE CITY WITHIN SEVENTY-TWO HOURS.

The statement was made in the House of Commons last night by Mr. Geoffrey Lloyd, Parliamentary Secretary to the Home Office. He said the Home Office had already discussed the question with the railway companies and time tables had been worked out for the removal of 31 million Londoners.

The Home Secretary, Sir Samuel Hoare, described the progress that had been made since the appeal was issued for 15 million A.R.P. workers two months ago. He said that total had already exceeded. Petrol Consumption.
 The car used was Ford V8 Light Delivery Van carrying a load of 100 lbs. each the petrol consumption throughout the trip of 300 miles worked out at an average for the 100 miles of 25 miles to the gallon.
Comfort and Appearance.
 The car was in front of each of us and everyone was comfortable. This is especially a great benefit. Apart from this the vehicle presents a tidy appearance when loaded.
Water.
 There were no mechanical defects throughout the trip neither did any cars hold on shore signs of boiling in spite of the temperature whilst in the Sudan being an average of 110 degrees in the shade.
Performances.
 On the way back from Juba when the cars were fully loaded in two consecutive hours we covered 34 and 35 miles without ever going over 42 miles per hour. This speaks for itself.
Small Safety Details.

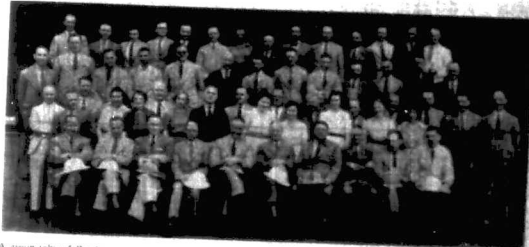
