ATTEMPT ON LIFE OF INDIAN PREMIER

Rickshaw man with knife boards car QUICKLY OVERPOWERED BY POLICE ESCORT

AN attempt to assassinate Mr. Nehru, India's Prime Minister, was made in Nagpur on Saturday when a rickshaw-puller armed with a sick-knife jumped into Mr. Nehru's car. He was immediately overpowered by a police escort.

Mr. Nehru was driving slowly through Nagpur when a rickshaw pulled up to his car. The rickshaw-puller, who was dressed in a white shirt and dark trousers, appeared drunk and mentally unbalanced when he was arrested. He was sent to a hospital for observation. Another rickshaw man and two other people were arrested following the incident.

Russian plan for farms

Mr. Krushchev made only a slight reference to the plan in his speech to the Central Committee in Moscow on Sunday. He said that the plan would increase the output of the collective farms by 20 per cent in 1955.

U.S. \$28,000 GRANT FOR MAKERIE

Extension of work in East Africa

MARKERIE COLLAGE, a British firm, has been awarded a grant of \$28,000 from the U.S. Government to extend its work in East Africa. The grant is to be used for the purchase of equipment and for the payment of salaries.

Armed police guard against riots

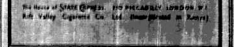

British geologists honour Dr. L. S. B. Leakey

RESEARCH IN EAST AFRICA

DR. L. S. B. LEAKEY's outstanding work on the pre-history of man and his geological environment in East Africa was honoured in London by the Geologists' Association... The president presented the Henry Strops Memorial medal to the eldest son, Mr. Colin Leakey, for transmission to his father.

At the end of 1955, four British expeditions led by Leakey to Mombasa, to the Great Lakes, to the Tugen region, to the Nyanza region and to the Rift Valley... He also collected in 1957 more than 100 specimens of Miocene age - several times as many as were known from the rest of the world.

AFRICANS ADMIT TAKING MAU MAU OATH

Ceremony of denunciation held in Nairobi before attack

All but five of 79 Mau Mau tribesmen in the Bahati Lokation of Nairobi yesterday morning confessed to their tribal leaders that they had taken Mau Mau oaths. They applied to appear before a special tribunal constituted to make their confessions in detail. They agreed also to submit to any punishment ordered by the committee. The ceremony was the first of its kind in the Mau Mau area. It was the outcome of a voluntary request from the Mau Mau to the Government to hold a public demonstration of their "abhorrence of Mau Mau."

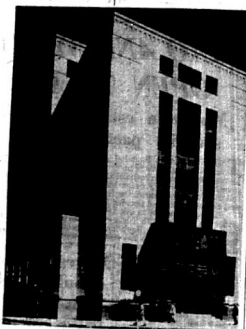

AT the corner of Delamare Avenue and Government Road, and on the site which citizens of Nairobi for many months knew as "the hole in the ground," the new Government Road Branch of Barclays Bank D.C.O. has opened its doors to the public.

This magnificent Bank Building, the latest of the many projects to be completed recently by Barclays Bank D.C.O., not only gives visual proof of their faith in the future of Nairobi as Kenya's capital, it was designed to restore to this road junction its old title of "the centre of Nairobi"—for it was from this spot that all distances are measured to other parts of the Colony.

The architects of the new Bank were Messrs. Cobb, Archer and Gilmour, who have guided its destiny since the proposal to build was first mooted in the early war years.

The first scheme submitted was prepared on the back of an ammunition box at a military station in northern Rhodesia, second scheme, with an advanced Italian note, was prepared in Amara during the occupation of Abyssinia.

Two sections

These were superseded by many later schemes subsequently altered or discarded. The building, as it stands today, owes to take its final shape from a decision by the Bank's Head Office in London, who approved the open internal court plan, in preference to a compact tower structure.

It was some time later — after the Bank had evacuated the old building and moved to Government way, and the other tenants of the property had found alternative accommodation — before construction could begin and a start could be made on the new building. It was to be known that "the hole in the ground."

The layout of the building is divided into two sections. The Bank premises consisting of the basement, with strong rooms, Safe Deposit Vault, Board Room, lift, ventilation gear and plant rooms, and the ground floor which contains the main banking hall, Manager's office,

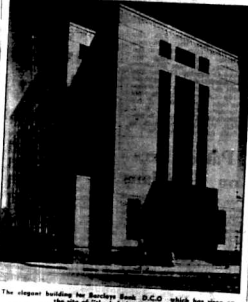


Assistant and sub-manager offices, residential offices and the departments particularly associated with the public, the exchange and securities, utility, payments and the business floor.

This last, which is served by access galleries overlooking the banking hall, is, in fact, the main part of the building. At the north (Delamare) Avenue end is devoted entirely to the trustee department with the telephone exchange, messenger rooms and cloakrooms.

Cool offices

On the top floor of the building, the 8th floor, there is a directors' dining room and a secretary's floor. The second section of the building, which contains the main entrance and service rooms, and from this branch the main corridors lead round the internal lightwell to the offices.

100,000 LOAN FOR E. AFRICAN RAILWAYS Agreement signed with World Bank PURCHASE OF ROLLING STOCK AND LOCOMOTIVES

A LOAN of £28,570,000 to the East Africa High Commission to help finance the expansion programme of the East African Railways and Harbours Administration was made yesterday by the Development Interest on the loan over 25 years will be about 4 per cent.

This was announced in Nairobi by Mr. A. F. Kirby, general manager, who returned on Monday from a visit to London and Washington. Mr. Kirby also signed the loan agreement in Washington, where an announcement was made by the World Bank.

The loan has to be guaranteed by the United Kingdom Government, which is a member of the bank, and by the three East African territorial Governments.

Mr. Kirby said that the loan will be used to complete the Administration's building of deep-water berths and other port facilities, the building of new locomotive and passenger coaches, shops, stations and bridges, the purchase of rolling stock and the buying of stores, spare parts, lighters, tug and signalling equipment. Under the terms of the loan, however, the money from the World Bank must be used for buying imported equipment, and the loan, therefore, will be spent entirely on locomotives and rolling stock.

The annual repayment of the loan will be £1,300,000. The East African Harbours and Railways Administration will be repaid by the Government of Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika. Mr. Kirby said that the loan will be used to complete the Administration's building of deep-water berths and other port facilities, the building of new locomotive and passenger coaches, shops, stations and bridges, the purchase of rolling stock and the buying of stores, spare parts, lighters, tug and signalling equipment. 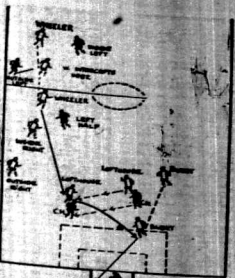
